[Capital Improvements for At-Risk/Receivership/Substandard/Troubled PHAs](#)

Purpose: To support the costs of administrative and judicial receiverships and for competitive grants to PHAs in receivership, designated troubled or substandard, or otherwise at risk, for costs associated with public housing asset improvement.

Eligibility: Public and Native American housing authorities.

Funding: \$11.5 million; awards between \$250,000 and \$3 million.

[Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act \(CARA\)](#)

Purpose: To prevent and reduce the use of opioids and methamphetamines and the misuse of prescription drugs among youth ages 12-18 in communities throughout the United States.

Eligibility: State, city, county, township, or special district governments; Native American tribal governments and organizations; public, state-controlled and private institutions of higher education; independent school districts; and nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education).

Funding: \$18,750,000; awards up to \$75,000.

[Drug-Free Communities \(DFC\) Support Program](#)

Purpose: To establish and strengthen collaboration to support the efforts of community coalitions working to prevent youth substance use.

Eligibility: State, city, county, township, or special district governments; Native American tribal governments and organizations; public, state-controlled and private institutions of higher education; independent school districts; and nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education).

Funding: \$31,250,000; awards up to \$125,000.

[Feed the Future Innovation Labs](#)

Purpose: To advance agricultural science and research to increase productivity, mitigate threats to production systems, and support food systems to reduce hunger and malnutrition by promoting the consumption of nutritious and safe foods through both government and private sector actors.

Eligibility: Public, state-controlled and private institutions of higher education.

Funding: \$64 million; awards between \$20 million and \$40 million.

Deadline: 4/3/2026

Pay-for-Performance (PfP) Incentive Payments Program

Purpose: To incentivize the expansion and growth of the National Apprenticeship System, specifically in industries with a firmly established program infrastructure that will contribute toward the goal of increasing the number of active apprentices.

Eligibility: Small businesses; for-profit organizations other than small businesses; state governments; public, state-controlled and private institutions of higher education; independent school districts; and nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education).

Funding: \$145 million; awards between \$10 million and \$40 million.

Deadline: 4/3/2026

Reentry Employment in Skilled Trades, Advanced Manufacturing, Registered Apprenticeships, and Training (RESTART) Initiative

Purpose: To develop programs to train ex-offenders for high-need jobs to help them be productive contributors to the U.S. economy.

Eligibility: State, county, city, township or special district governments; Native American tribal governments and organizations; and nonprofits with 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education).

Funding: \$81 million; awards between \$1 million and \$5.1 million.

Small Surface Water and Groundwater Storage Projects (Small Storage Program)

Purpose: To increase water management flexibility and reduce impacts on environmental resources from projects operated by federal and state agencies.

Eligibility: State governments; Native American tribal governments and organizations; and nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education).

Funding: \$43.5 million; awards up to \$30 million.

Deadline: 4/17/2026
