### HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 504

Offered by Representative Stuart:

WHEREAS, Illinois' microelectronics and quantum ecosystem can pave the way for solving innovation and national security challenges for the nation; and

WHEREAS, Illinois is home to Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory, which received \$115M from the U.S. Department of Energy to establish the Superconducting Quantum Materials and Systems Center; and

WHEREAS, Illinois is home to Argonne National Laboratory, which received \$115M from the U.S. Department of Energy to support Q-NEXT, an effort that will translate quantum discoveries into technologies that benefit society; and

WHEREAS, The University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign received \$25M from the National Science Foundation for a Quantum Leap grant to advance scientific, technological, and workforce development goals; and

WHEREAS, The University of Chicago received \$25M from the National Science Foundation for a Quantum Leap Grant to pioneer new ways to use quantum technology in biology and to develop the quantum workforce through STEM education and outreach; and

WHEREAS, Illinois is a national leader with \$280M in federal funding for quantum initiatives supported by the 2018 National Quantum Initiative Act; and

WHEREAS, The Chicago Quantum Exchange, one of the largest quantum collaboratives in the country, leads efforts to advance the science and engineering of quantum information, train the quantum workforce of tomorrow, and drive the local and national quantum economy; and

WHEREAS, The University of Chicago's Polsky Center, the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, and the Chicago Quantum Exchange launched the nation's first quantum startup accelerator, Duality, which supports quantum startups, providing the critical resources they need to develop and scale their businesses; and

WHEREAS, Governor Pritzker's administration invested \$200M in quantum-related research efforts at the University of Chicago and the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, which will help support a joint research building within Chicago; and

WHEREAS, Illinois has the third-highest number of universities engaged in quantum research and has the third-most quantum degrees in the nation; and

WHEREAS, Illinois' Community College System is the third-largest system in the nation and the largest workforce development provider in the State, offering programs that are directly aligned with the needs of their local and state industries serving the needs of nearly 10,000 employers across the State; and

WHEREAS, An Illinois-based proposal was selected as a 2023 U.S. Tech Hubs Designee for Quantum by the U.S. Economic Development Agency, a program that aims to strengthen U.S. economic and national security with investments in regions across the country with assets and resources with the potential to become globally competitive in the technologies and industries of the future and, for those industries, companies, and the good jobs they create, to start, grow, and remain in the United States; and

WHEREAS, The State invested \$500 million to establish the Discovery Partners Institute and the Illinois Innovation Network led by the University of Illinois System to establish a network of research and innovation hubs that will serve as a magnet for technology and talent; and

WHEREAS, A University of Illinois Chicago-led, U.S. Department of Energy-funded national consortium will educate the next generation of quantum engineers and provide pathways into the quantum computing workforce for groups traditionally underrepresented in STEM fields; and

WHEREAS, The National Science Foundation-funded National Q-12 Education Partnership, led by University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, will expand access to K-12 quantum learning tools and inspire the next generation of quantum leaders; and

WHEREAS, Since 2017, Illinois quantum startups have raised \$33.2 million through 27 agreements, the second-highest number of deals by quantum startups in the country; and

WHEREAS, Chicagoland's 124-mile quantum loop is the country's longest quantum network; and

WHEREAS, Illinois has the world's first publicly accessible quantum network node, the first quantum technology deployed on public infrastructure that the public can directly access at the Urbana Free Library, led by faculty from the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign; and

WHEREAS, The University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign's Grainger College of Engineering has more combined computer science, computer engineering, and electrical engineering bachelor's graduates than any other college of engineering in the nation and is starting a new semiconductor minor program; and

WHEREAS, The University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign and the University of Chicago are each co-leading new U.S. Department of Defense Microelectronics Commons Hubs to carry out microelectronics research in support of national security and next generation technology for the benefit of the nation; and

WHEREAS, The Grainger College of Engineering at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign has 40 top ten ranked degree programs and specialties, including micro-electronics disciplines; and

WHEREAS, John Bardeen, the inventor of the transistor, perhaps the most important invention of the 20th century, brought semiconductor research to University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign and the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign's Grainger College of Engineering is the place where the inventors of the LED, transistor, and the integrated circuit called home; and

WHEREAS, In April 2022, Governor Pritzker and the General Assembly passed Public Act 102-0700, the Manufacturing Illinois Chips for Real Opportunity Act (MICRO), which creates a new suite of statewide tax incentive programs for makers of semiconductors, microchips, or component parts, making Illinois a welcoming and strategic location for manufacturers of microchips and semiconductors looking for their next U.S. manufacturing site; and

WHEREAS, Illinois universities received a National Science Foundation Future of Semiconductors Workforce Grant to boost new semiconductor technologies, manufacturing, and workforce training and development in the State and across the nation; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Energy invested over \$22M in Fermilab and Argonne for microelectronics research; and

WHEREAS, Companies have invested \$90M in University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign's IBM-Illinois' Discovery Accelerator Institute to support research and education in AI, cloud, and quantum technologies and \$5M in educational programs at University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign to bolster the U.S. semiconductor workforce; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that Illinois is poised to play a leading role in the Research and Development programs created through the CHIPS and Science Act and is the state best suited to serve as the location for the headquarters of the newly-created National Semiconductor Technology Center of the U.S. Department of Commerce; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to President Joseph R. Biden, U.S. Secretary of Commerce Gina Raimondo, National Institute of Standards and Technology Director Laurie E. Locascio, and all members of the Illinois Congressional Delegation.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 506

Offered by Representative Ness:

WHEREAS, Family caregivers providing care to loved ones help make it possible for older adults, people with disabilities, and veterans to live independently in their homes and communities, and they are the backbone of the care system in Illinois and across the United States; and

WHEREAS, AARP, a national nonprofit dedicated to empowering people to choose how they live as they age, has released data to show the significant challenges family caregivers experience; and

WHEREAS, There are approximately 1.3 million family caregivers in Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Family caregivers in the State provide an estimated 1.21 billion hours of unpaid care annually at an economic value of \$21 billion; and

WHEREAS, Providing care to a loved one can create a financial challenge for family caregivers, with them spending more than \$7,200 per year in out-of-pocket costs on average nationally, or a quarter of their income on caregiving activities, with African American and Hispanic/Latino caregivers on average spending a higher percentage of their income on caregiving responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, Family caregivers include all unpaid individuals of all ages who are caring for individuals with disabilities, chronic or other health conditions, and/or functional limitations; and

WHEREAS, Family caregivers, who perform a wide range of care, from providing assistance with a variety of activities such as meal preparation, bathing, dressing, transportation, and managing finances to handling more intensive tasks such as nursing and wound care, medication management, and care coordination, are vital to enabling older adults and persons with disabilities to remain living in their homes and communities; and

WHEREAS, Despite the fact that providing care in homes and communities is generally less costly than providing care in institutional settings, financial strains associated with family caregiving arise from several factors, and these may include needing to cut back on hours at work, taking unpaid leave, retiring early, or even quitting a job; and

WHEREAS, In the workplace, family caregivers often face loss of earnings, job insecurity, and a lack of promotions, health insurance, and employer retirement contributions; and

WHEREAS, Many family caregivers report that financial challenges from caregiving have caused them to resort to adverse financial strategies, such as withdrawing savings, cutting back on their own health care spending, decreasing contributions towards retirement, and taking loans to make ends meet; and

WHEREAS, The emotional toll of family caregivers rises when the responsibilities of the caregiver role increase, including the amount and duration of care and the performance of medical or nursing duties, in addition to the perceived lack of choice in taking on the caregiver role; and

WHEREAS, Chronic stress caused by family caregiving may have negative health impacts on the caregiver which may result in depression, psychological distress, decreased self-care, and poorer physical health; and

WHEREAS, Caregiver training, respite care, and other supports are powerful tools that make an intensely difficult job easier and enable family caregivers to carry on with their responsibilities, prevent burnout and injury, and better manage the variety of duties they take on in order to provide the best possible care to their loved ones; and

WHEREAS, It is important for Illinois to be committed to enacting solutions to support family caregivers in their efforts to provide care to loved ones, allowing residents to safely and comfortably age in their own homes, helping to preserve communities, and avoiding the expense of institutional care; and

WHEREAS, Demand for these programs is high, but funding is limited, and more needs to be done to improve the plight of family caregivers; and

WHEREAS, It is imperative to understand, recognize, and support the compassionate and difficult work done by family caregivers in Illinois and throughout the U.S.; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Family Caregiver Coalition was created in December 2021 and now includes over 300 members who make up a diverse representation of unpaid, informal caregivers and organizations who serve and/or interact with unpaid family caregivers across the State; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Area Agencies on Aging have developed a statewide network of caregiver resource centers to serve unpaid family and informal caregivers; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Family Caregiver Coalition and the Illinois Area Agencies on Aging were selected to represent Illinois and were recognized at the inaugural National Family Caregiver Conference in Washington, D.C. in late October 2023, with Illinois being one of only 10 states invited to participate in this national conference and advocacy day; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the passage of important policies to better support family caregivers, particularly by enacting policies that:

(1) Provide increased funding for Illinois' Community Care Program, Home Delivered Meals, the Illinois Family Caregiver Act, Illinois Area Agencies on Aging, Illinois Case Coordination Units, Long-Term and Home Care Ombudsman, and other older adult programs and resources for Illinois caregivers at the Illinois Department on Aging and other State agencies, and examine policy changes to improve the navigability of these resources;

(2) Improve the inclusion of family caregivers in their loved one's care and hospital discharge and planning, and provide them with the education, training, and support they need, including as their loved one moves from one place of care to another, in Hospital at Home programs, in Medicare more broadly, and in measures of provider engagement with and in support of family caregivers and family caregivers' experience of care and support, and support veterans and their caregivers;

(3) Increase access to options and eligibility for care at home, including but not limited to providing permanent financial protections for the spouses of individuals receiving Medicaid Home and Community Based Services, incentivizing Home and Community Based Services expansion, expanding caregiver and senior support options and resources in the State's Community Care Program, and more;

(4) Attract and retain direct care workers through increased pay and benefits, improved training, career pathways, and other job improvement initiatives; and

(5) Provide financial relief for family caregivers, such as through a family caregiver income tax credit, to help offset a portion of caregiving expenses paid by caregivers; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to all Illinois constitutional officers, the Speaker and Minority Leader of the Illinois House of Representatives, and the President and Minority Leader of the Illinois Senate.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 508

Offered by Representative Weber:

WHEREAS, Both Hamas and Hezbollah are recognized by the U.S. Department of State as Foreign Terrorist Organizations; and

WHEREAS, On October 7, 2023, Hamas launched a surprise attack to deliberately target Israeli civilians, which included the killing and abduction of men, women, children, and the elderly; and

WHEREAS, Hamas' stated goal is the total destruction of the State of Israel and the murder of its Jewish citizens; and

WHEREAS, A disturbing number of student organizations at institutions of higher education have placed blame solely upon the State of Israel for the attack and have expressed support for the terrorist actions of Hamas through the glorification of violence and the usage of anti-Semitic rhetoric; and

WHEREAS, On October 9, 2023, the national leadership of Students for Justice in Palestine declared a "day of resistance", calling on student chapters across the United States to demonstrate by "not just slogans and rallies, but armed confrontation with oppressors" and, following this announcement, many chapters issued pro-Hamas statements; and

WHEREAS, On October 10, 2023, a Stanford University lecturer targeted Jewish students during a class on colonialism, justifying the actions of Hamas terrorists by calling them "freedom fighters" and asking Jewish students to identify themselves and stand in the corner to illustrate what "Jews were doing to Palestinians"; and

WHEREAS, On October 15, 2023, in a complete disregard for humanity, a Cornell University professor grabbed the microphone at a campus rally and said that "Hamas has challenged the monopoly of violence"; in reference to Hamas' terror attack on Israel, he also said "It was exhilarating", "It was energizing", and "I was exhilarated"; and

WHEREAS, On October 22, 2023, the Brandeis University student government voted down a simple resolution condemning Hamas and calling on the immediate release of all hostages back to their families unharmed; and

WHEREAS, On October 24, 2023, George Washington University students, at a vigil to support Hamas' surprise attack, prominently projected signs on the walls of the university's library, including "Glory to our Martyrs"; and

WHEREAS, On October 25, 2023, a walkout and protests took place at DePaul University in Chicago featuring over 100 students, where the chant "Death to Zionism" was heard and flags for the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine, a Syria-based terrorist group, were seen; and

WHEREAS, The University of Illinois chapter of Students for Justice in Palestine shared a video showing what appears to be a Hamas terrorist filming himself inside of the home of an Israeli family during the October 7th attack; and

WHEREAS, Many administrations of institutions of higher education do not follow the practice of institutional neutrality and frequently speak out on public issues but have failed to speak out clearly after Hamas' October 7th attack, exposing their lack of regard for their Jewish and pro-Israel students; and

WHEREAS, The glorification of violence and the usage of anti-Semitic rhetoric creates a hostile learning and working environment for Jewish students, faculty, and staff; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we condemn the support of Hamas, Hezbollah, and other terrorist organizations at institutions of higher education, which may lead to the creation of a hostile environment for Jewish students, faculty, and staff; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we call on campus administrators to condemn all forms of anti-Semitism on college campuses and to ensure Jewish students, faculty, and guests can exercise the same free speech rights as are guaranteed to all other students, faculty, and guests without intimidation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the enforcement of State and federal civil rights laws to protect Jewish students from anti-Semitism; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we offer our sympathy and compassion to families and individuals suffering from the current Israel-Hamas conflict; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the presidents of each four-year public and private institution of higher education in Illinois.
