WHEREAS, More than 800,000 law enforcement officers in the United States risk their lives daily to serve and protect their communities, including nearly 40,000 in Illinois; and

WHEREAS, There are now more than 23,000 names listed among America's fallen law enforcement heroes on the walls of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial dating back to 1786, including names from Illinois; and

WHEREAS, More than 2,400 law enforcement officers have died in the United States in the line of duty during the past decade, an average of one officer fatality every 36 hours; and

WHEREAS, Members of law enforcement have faced increased challenges over the last several years, and the challenges have been further exacerbated by the drop to a dangerously low level in the retention and recruitment of sworn law enforcement officers, with current numbers showing fewer law enforcement officers per resident than at any other time during the past 25 years; and

WHEREAS, Law enforcement officers typically encounter between 400 and 600 traumatic events over the course of their career as an officer, compared with three or four traumatic events encountered by the average citizen; and

WHEREAS, The unusually high number of traumatic events experienced by law enforcement officers has contributed to a 54% higher suicide rate among officers than among individuals in other jobs; and

WHEREAS, The innovative and dedicated efforts of law enforcement officers have successfully reduced crime rates from historic highs; and

WHEREAS, Supporting law enforcement officers with the equipment, training, and funding needed to protect communities in Illinois and the United States from criminal violence has long received overwhelming public support from across the political spectrum; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Police Memorial ceremony is scheduled for May 2, 2024, and the week of May 12-18, 2024 has been designated as National Police Week, a time to honor the men and women who serve in law enforcement and pay special tribute to those officers who have made the ultimate sacrifice and to the families of those fallen heroes; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That we call for increased measures to be taken to maximize the safety and well-being of law enforcement officers, including improvements relating to the retention and recruitment of officers, improved training and equipment for officers, and increased mental health resources for officers; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we call on all levels of government in Illinois and across the United States to ensure that law enforcement officers receive the support and resources needed to keep all communities in Illinois and the United States safe; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we thank all members of law enforcement for their unwavering commitment to serve our communities and to keep us safe.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 736

Offered by Representative Sheehan:

WHEREAS, Parks and recreation programs are an integral part of communities throughout this country, including the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Parks and recreation are vitally important to establishing and maintaining the quality of life in communities, ensuring the health of all citizens, and contributing to the economic and environmental well-being of a community and region; and

WHEREAS, Parks and recreation programs build healthy, active communities that aid in the prevention of chronic disease, provide therapeutic recreation services for those who are mentally or physically disabled, and also improve the mental and emotional health of all citizens; and

WHEREAS, Parks and recreation areas are fundamental to the environmental well-being of our communities; and

WHEREAS, Parks and natural recreation areas improve water quality, protect groundwater, prevent flooding, improve the quality of the air we breathe, provide vegetative buffers to development, and produce habitat for wildlife; and

WHEREAS, Our parks and natural recreation areas ensure the ecological beauty of our communities and provide a place for children and adults to connect with nature and recreate outdoors; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare July 2024 as Parks and Recreation Month; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Illinois Association of Park Districts, the Illinois Park and Recreation Association, the National Recreation and Park Association, and the Illinois Department of National Resources.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 737

Offered by Representative Jiménez:

WHEREAS, The Commonwealth of Puerto Rico has been under United States jurisdiction since 1898; it is the property of, but not part of, the United States, and laws passed by Congress apply on the island without the consent nor participation of the residents thereof; and

WHEREAS, The principle of self-determination is a cornerstone of international law, enshrined in the Charter of the United Nations, which guarantees all peoples the right to freely determine their political status and freely pursue their economic, social, and cultural development; and

WHEREAS, The people of Puerto Rico have, through various referendums and public expressions, demonstrated a clear desire to address and resolve the island's political status; and

WHEREAS, The Puerto Rico Status Act has been introduced in the United States Congress, raising concerns among many Puerto Ricans and their allies regarding its approach to resolving the island's future political status; and

WHEREAS, The Puerto Rico Self-Determination Act proposes a process for Puerto Ricans to exercise their right to self-determination in a democratic and inclusive manner, offering a platform for Puerto Ricans to decide their future through a convention of elected representatives; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we express our support for the right of the people of Puerto Rico to pursue self-determination; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we oppose the Puerto Rico Status Act due to concerns over its inadequacy in facilitating a fair and democratic process for Puerto Ricans to determine their future given the lack of

critical information over status definitions, the controlling language of government operations, transitions, taxes, Puerto Rico's separate Olympic representation, citizenship, and other key matters; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we endorse the Puerto Rico Self-Determination Act as a constructive approach towards enabling the people of Puerto Rico to explore and decide upon their future political status through a democratic and participatory process; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we encourage our federal representatives to support legislation and initiatives that align with the principles of self-determination and democracy for Puerto Rico; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to all members of the Illinois Congressional Delegation as an expression of our sentiments regarding the future status of Puerto Rico.

#### HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 70

Offered by Representative Huynh:

WHEREAS, The month of May first commemorated Asian American and Pacific Islander heritage in 1979 and has been celebrated as Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month since 1990; this commemoration uplifts the stories of more than 50 distinct ethnic groups and more than 100 languages that comprise Asian American and Pacific Islander communities; and

WHEREAS, The month of May was chosen to commemorate Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month to mark the first arrival of Japanese immigrants on May 7, 1843 and the completion of the Transcontinental Railroad on May 10, 1869 through the incredible effort of mostly Chinese immigrant workers; and

WHEREAS, Illinois is home to more than 905,000 Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders, according to the most recent American Community Survey data available from the U.S. Census Bureau; the five largest communities represented are Indian Americans, Filipino Americans, Chinese Americans, Korean Americans, and Pakistani Americans; and

WHEREAS, Through immigration and refugee resettlement and as multi-generational families, Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders have taken many pathways to call Illinois home; and

WHEREAS, Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders comprise the fastest growing racial or ethnic group in the country, and Asian American and Pacific Islander communities are vital parts of communities across Illinois in cities, suburbs, and rural areas of the state; and

WHEREAS, The history of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders is deeply intertwined in the history of the United States and is often fraught with discrimination, exclusion, and violence; despite these and other challenges, Asian American and Pacific Islander communities continue to arise; they have been a vital part of the development of Illinois and of the United States in every facet of public life and in the advancement of civil rights; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we declare May of 2024 as Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month in honor of the contributions made by the Asian American and Pacific Island residents and communities across Illinois.

#### HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 71

Offered by Representative West:

WHEREAS, Research has shown that the continued use of Native American names, logos, and mascots in schools has a negative effect not only on Native American students but also on all students by undermining the educational experiences of members of all communities, especially those who have had little to no contact with indigenous peoples; and

WHEREAS, Research also shows that the use of Native American names, logos, and mascots used in schools establishes an unwelcome and often hostile learning environment for Native American students and affirms negative images and stereotypes that are promoted in mainstream society; and

WHEREAS, The use of Native American names, logos, and mascots can be defined as using any person, animal, or object to represent a school that names, refers to, represents, or is associated with Native

Americans, including Native American cultures and specific Native American tribes, but not including names associated with the name of a local county, municipality, or school district; and

WHEREAS, The American Psychological Association recommends the retirement of Native American mascots, a recommendation first made in 2005; and

WHEREAS, A particular team name, Redskins, used by schools in Illinois is defined in dictionaries as offensive, a racial slur used as an insulting and contemptuous term for a Native American; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois wants all children to have a safe, healthy, and equitable learning experience in our public education system, including Native American children; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we urge the State Board of Education to conduct a study on the number of schools, school districts, and other public school associations across the State that currently utilize Native American names, logos, and mascots; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the State Board of Education, through conversations with local schools and school districts, to collect findings on what the cost would be for these individual schools and districts to remove and change Native American names, mascots, and logos; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the State Board of Education to include its findings in a written report to the General Assembly no later than December 31, 2024; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge schools, school districts, and other public school associations to consider and plan for changing these harmful Native American names, mascots, and logos; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the State Board of Education to use all tools available to work towards the immediate end of the practice of using racial slurs as team names in Illinois schools.
