HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

HOUSE RESOLUTION 769

Offered by Representative Cabello:

WHEREAS, It is of the utmost importance for all entities throughout the State of Illinois to express support for our country and State by only flying the American flag and the Illinois State flag; and

WHEREAS, The American flag and Illinois State flag are representative of the diverse make up of this State and this country, making flying any other flag unnecessary; and

WHEREAS, All people from different walks of life are welcome to our State where people are free to be themselves to the fullest, a freedom that our American flag represents best; and

WHEREAS, In light of recent events in the world, there have been public institutes throughout the United States and Illinois that have taken it upon themselves to fly foreign flags alongside or instead of the United States flag; this is a disgrace to our country and to those who have made sacrifices to keep this country the best in the world; and

WHEREAS, The United States has been a trailblazer for freedom by demonstrating what is achievable in a country while providing a blueprint for other nations to follow to provide the luxury of freedom; there is no place for our public entities in this State to fly foreign flags; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge all entities throughout Illinois to fly only the American flag and the State of Illinois flag; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to Secretary of the State Alexi Giannoulias to express our concern.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 772

Offered by Representative Elik:

WHEREAS, Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), known by many as Lou Gehrig's disease, is a progressive, fatal neurodegenerative disease that causes a person's brain to lose connection with their muscles, slowly taking away their ability to walk, talk, eat, and eventually breathe; and

WHEREAS, Every 90 minutes, someone is diagnosed with ALS and someone passes away from ALS; and

WHEREAS, On average, patients diagnosed with ALS only survive two to five years from the time of their diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, Currently, there is no known cure for ALS; and

WHEREAS, People who have served in the military are more likely to develop and die from ALS than those with no history of military service; and

WHEREAS, Securing access to new therapies, durable medical equipment, and communication technologies is of vital importance to people living with ALS; and

WHEREAS, Clinical trials play a pivotal role in evaluating new treatments, enhancing quality of life, and fostering assistive technologies for those living with ALS; and

WHEREAS, This year marks the 10th anniversary of the Ice Bucket Challenge, and it is fitting to make a renewed commitment to galvanize public awareness and support funding leading to significant investments in ALS research; and

WHEREAS, As the largest philanthropic funder of ALS research globally, the ALS Association has committed over \$154 million to support more than 550 projects across the United States and 18 other countries; and

WHEREAS, The ALS community and researchers remain unwaveringly committed to accelerating the pace of discovery, fueled by the hope that one day ALS will be a livable disease for everyone, everywhere; and

WHEREAS, Observing ALS Awareness Month increases the public's awareness of the dire circumstances people with ALS face, acknowledges the terrible impact this disease has not only on the person but also on his or her family and community, and recognizes the research being done to eradicate this disease; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare the month of May 2024 as ALS Awareness Month in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge all Americans to join in supporting ALS research, advocating for increased funding, and standing in solidarity with those affected by this relentless disease.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 773

Offered by Representative Buckner:

WHEREAS, Celiac disease is one of the world's most prevalent genetic autoimmune diseases, affecting an estimated three million Americans, 70-80% of whom are undiagnosed; and

WHEREAS, Celiac disease causes the body to attack its own small intestine, which can lead to many other devastating health conditions, including cancer; and

WHEREAS, Celiac disease results in extraordinary economic and productivity costs to both the public and private sectors from employee and student absenteeism, as well as repeated, inconclusive visits to healthcare providers; and

WHEREAS, On average, it takes four years to be correctly diagnosed with celiac disease; and

WHEREAS, There is no medication or cure for celiac disease; the only treatment is a lifelong, strict gluten-free diet; and

WHEREAS, Studies show that up to 50% of people on a gluten-free diet continue to experience symptoms and have intestinal damage, revealing the ineffectiveness of the gluten-free diet as a treatment; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare May 2024 as Celiac Disease Awareness Month in the State of Illinois to raise public awareness of this serious condition; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we encourage support for improving the quality of life and health of individuals with celiac disease by advancing biomedical research to develop diagnostic tools, life-improving treatments, and a cure.
