WHEREAS, The population boom of the 1970s and 1980s in Brent Hassert's home, Will County, brought many community challenges; as a leader among his neighbors, he stood for election to the Will County Board in 1986, becoming a county commissioner and executive pro tem; and

WHEREAS, As a result of the population boom, affirmed by the United States Census of 1990, a new Illinois House district, the 83rd Representative District, was created to center on the fast-growing communities of Romeoville, Plainfield, and Lockport; increasingly aware of the challenges facing this region as part of the overall governance of the State of Illinois, Brent Hassert put his name forward as a State lawmaker; and

WHEREAS, In March 1992, with 4,877 votes, Brent Hassert was chosen by his Republican neighbors as their party's candidate for the Illinois House of Representatives from the new 83rd Representative District; in November of that year, he was elected, with 24,804 votes, to be the first-ever state representative from the newly-created district, with a 59.8% landslide majority; and

WHEREAS, With his experience as a county leader, Brent Hassert was quickly chosen to be the Republican vice spokesperson on the House Committee on Counties & Townships; and

WHEREAS, When he and his fellow Republicans achieved a House majority in the 89th Illinois General Assembly, Brent Hassert was chosen as vice chairman of the Committee on Environment &

Energy, building a bipartisan coalition that led to consensus on restructuring the electricity industry of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Brent Hassert was continually elected and re-elected by his neighbors to the Illinois House of Representatives for a total of 16 years in office, from 1992 until 2008; and

WHEREAS, As gaming became a significant industry in Joliet, Brent Hassert became the minority spokesperson of the House Committee on Gaming, where he helped shape the laws that governed the fast-growing field of Illinois riverboat casinos; a key law enacted during this period in June 1999 helped create jobs by ending the requirement that these Joliet casinos physically cruise up and down the Des Plaines River; and

WHEREAS, As the governance of the State of Illinois became more complex and complicated, Brent Hassert became aware that more and more of our State laws were being implemented through complicated new rules and regulations promulgated by State administrative agencies; serving as co-chairman of the bipartisan Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR), he helped maintain Illinois General Assembly oversight on these rules and the processes used to draft and enforce them; and

WHEREAS, During this time, Brent Hassert steadily rose in the estimation of his Illinois House colleagues, especially his Republican colleagues, achieving for six years, 2003 to 2009, the rank of Deputy House Minority Leader; and

WHEREAS, In the year 2008, Illinois Democrats helped to nominate a senator from Illinois, Barack Obama, to be President of the United States; the Obama campaign created great enthusiasm among the members of his party in Illinois, and in January 2009, Brent Hassert returned to private life, leaving a legacy of dedication and service to his district; and

WHEREAS, As a community leader in Plainfield and as an acknowledged expert in Illinois law and governance, Brent Hassert now entered a new phase of his career as the owner and operator of Brent Hassert Consulting, advocating on behalf of local governments; and

WHEREAS, Throughout these career changes, Brent Hassert relied upon his wife, Lee Ann Goodson, his brother, Earl, his son, Justin Hassert, his son, Josh Hassert, their son, Matthew Goodson, their daughter, Alexandra Goodson Ruikis, and their daughters-in-law and son-in-law; and

WHEREAS, A growing headcount of seven grandchildren, Kyle Hassert, Jena Hassert, Colton Hassert, Carson Hassert, Aria Phoenix, Avery Ruikis, and Bailey Ruikis, brought happiness to Brent Hassert; and

WHEREAS, Upon requesting a birth certificate for Benjamin Pantoja, his parents were not provided with an official birth certificate or information on how to obtain one, nor were they offered any resources or assistance, but instead received a partially filled out commemorative certificate from the hospital; and

WHEREAS, This lack of support and information underscores a significant gap in the resources provided to families who experience such heartbreaking losses and face medical challenges; and

WHEREAS, Yolanda Carrillo, driven by her experience with the birth of her son Benjamin Pantoja, has been proactive in advocating for legislative change during the 103rd General Assembly, introducing House Bill 5215 and currently supporting a bill similar to Senate Bill 3182 to address these very issues; and

WHEREAS, The introduction of such bills highlights the ongoing need for legislative measures to ensure that families are given proper information and support during these critical times; therefore, be it

**RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize and honor the memory of Benjamin Lucas Pantoja and acknowledge the significant efforts of his mother, Yolanda Carrillo, in advocating for better support and resources for families dealing with medical issues and losses; and be it further**

RESOLVED, That we support the ongoing legislative efforts to close the gap in information and resources provided to affected families, ensuring they receive the proper guidance and assistance in navigating their options during such difficult times.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 869

Offered by Representative Keicher:

WHEREAS, October is nationally recognized as Breast Cancer Awareness Month; and

WHEREAS, Breast cancer is the most common type of cancer among women globally and the second leading cause of cancer death among women in the United States; and

WHEREAS, More than one in eight women and one in 833 men in the United States will be diagnosed with breast cancer in their lifetimes; and

WHEREAS, An estimated 313,510 Americans will be diagnosed with invasive breast cancer in 2024; and

WHEREAS, Metastatic breast cancer (MBC) occurs when breast cancer spreads to other parts of the body, including the bones, lungs, liver, and brain, and individuals with MBC have an average life expectancy of 24 to 36 months after diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, Regardless of early detection, approximately 30% of stage 0 to stage III breast cancers will return as stage IV; and

WHEREAS, An estimated 42,780 Americans will die from breast cancer in 2024, equal to 117 women and men per day, with 98% of deaths being caused by MBC; and

WHEREAS, MBC affects all races and socioeconomic classes; and

WHEREAS, While white women see slightly higher incidence rates of breast cancer, the mortality rate for Black women with breast cancer is 41% higher than that of white women, and breast cancer is the leading cause of cancer-related death for Hispanic women; and

WHEREAS, METAvivor Research and Support, a national organization, funds critical stage IV metastatic breast cancer research and educates the public about metastatic breast cancer and the lack of funding for stage IV treatment; and

WHEREAS, METAvivor aims to dramatically increase the current percentage of breast cancer research dollars for already metastasized patients from under 5% to 30%; and

WHEREAS, The national hashtags for this initiative on social media fall under #METAvivor and #LightUpMBC, with the latter representing a global campaign designed to educate, raise funds, and shine a light on the critical need for stage IV metastatic breast cancer research; and

WHEREAS, The #LightUpMBC campaign, held annually on October 13, illuminates 117 landmarks around the world in the metastatic breast cancer colors of teal, pink, and green to bring awareness to the disease and to honor the daily number of 117 lives lost to MBC; and

WHEREAS, While the pink ribbon is well-known for representing the fight against early stage breast cancer, it is not inclusive of stage IV; therefore, the metastatic breast cancer awareness tricolor ribbon includes teal to portray healing and spirituality, green for the triumph of spring over winter, life over death, renewal, hope, and immortality, and a thin pink overlay to signify that the cancer originated in the breast; and

WHEREAS, The #LightUpMBC campaign will culminate in a virtual broadcast, #LightUpMBC Live, to commemorate landmarks lighting up around the world, to share inspiring stories by the metastatic breast cancer community, and to raise research funds; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare October 13, 2024 as Metastatic Breast Cancer Awareness Day in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we recognize the METAvivor #LightUpMBC national campaign; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we encourage citizens to join the national effort towards awareness of metastatic breast cancer during October through METAvivor; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to METAvivor with our sincere appreciation for their efforts to address breast cancer.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 870

Offered by Representative Croke:

WHEREAS, Illinois and the United States have been a refuge for those seeking protection from persecution and oppression, whether by reason of religion or nationality; and

WHEREAS, Those who cherish freedom can never take it for granted, and those who respect justice can never be completely secure in it; and

WHEREAS, Those who value freedom are duty-bound to promote it and to protect it by using their voices and influence to meet the challenges that might confront its sanctity and to help protect the life and liberty of those who depend upon freedom and human dignity; and

WHEREAS, No other human rights violation deserves greater vigilance, protest, and recognition while demanding the strongest condemnation by freedom loving people than the crime of genocide; and

WHEREAS, For the Greeks of Asia Minor, Pontos, and Eastern Thrace, the horror and inhumanity of this savagely brutal crime began as pogroms in 1913 to 1923 by the Ottoman and Kemalist governments, in what is today known as Turkey; and

WHEREAS, In July and August 1914, months before the Ottoman entry into World War I, Greek Christian men between the ages of 18 and 48 years were drafted into the notorious labor battalions of the Ottoman army where most of them died due to brutal labor conditions, malnutrition, and extreme weather; and

WHEREAS, The Honorable George Horton, U.S. Consul General in Smyrna at the time of the genocides, affirmed that from 1914 to 1923 Greeks of Asia Minor and Thrace endured immeasurable cruelty resulting in genocide during a systematic Ottoman government-sanctioned campaign to kill and to displace the Greek population; and

WHEREAS, The Asia Minor Greeks and the Pontian Greeks whose ancestors had lived for three millennia in communities in Anatolia and along the shores and in the mountains of the Black Sea coast, in what is today northern Turkey, were singled out by the Ottoman and Kemalist authorities for murder and expulsion from their ancestral lands, resulting in approximately one million deaths; and

WHEREAS, The biblical city of Smyrna, once called The Jewel of the Mediterranean, was a cosmopolitan hub settled by Greeks in 1200 BCE and populated by large, highly-educated Greek, Armenian, and Jewish communities with a flourishing commercial and middle-class; and

WHEREAS, In September 1922, Smyrna was sacked, and the Greek and Armenian quarters were set on fire and destroyed by Kemalist forces; tens of thousands of Smyrna's Greek and Armenian inhabitants were then massacred, turning the pier of Smyrna into a scene of death and desperation, forcing many to jump to their deaths rather than be cut down by Kemal's soldiers or consumed by the flames; and

WHEREAS, The remaining Christian inhabitants of Anatolia were then forced to give up their homes, businesses, and their ancient connection to the land in a forced exchange of populations through the Lausanne Agreement, sanctioned by the U.S. and western nations, in order to safeguard their lives from future massacres; it marked the end of 3,000 years of Greek presence and historic contributions to the western world; and

WHEREAS, Silence is the final stage of genocide as it erases all memory of the victims of the crime as if they never existed; this silence can only encourage future genocides by other rogue nations that feel unbound by international laws; and

WHEREAS, In an historic 2007 resolution, the International Association of Genocide Scholars (IAGS), representing hundreds of the world's leading genocide scholars, affirmed the fact of the genocide against the Pontian and other Asia Minor Greeks and Assyrians as comparable to the genocide of the Armenians; and

WHEREAS, Acknowledgment of these past crimes should serve as a deterrent to future aggressions by the Turkish government and all other governments around the world; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize the genocide of the Greeks of Pontos, Asia Minor, and Eastern Thrace and urge the Turkish government to do the same as a means of bringing closure to the descendants of the victims of these genocides and preventing such atrocities in the future; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we act in the spirit of justice and humanity and recognize September 14, 1922 as the end of their presence in their homeland of 3,000 years.

WHEREAS, Following the passage of the resolution by both houses of Congress, President Eisenhower issued his proclamation on August 19, 1955; and

WHEREAS, The first observance of Constitution Week was so successful that on January 5, 1956, Senator Knowland introduced a Senate Joint Resolution to have the president designate September 17 through 23 annually as Constitution Week; and

WHEREAS, The resolution was adopted on July 23, 1956 and signed as Public Law 915 on August 2, 1956; and

WHEREAS, Public Law 915 guarantees the issuing of a proclamation each year by the President of the United States of America designating September 17 through 23 as Constitution Week; and

WHEREAS, It is fitting and proper to accord official recognition to this magnificent document and its memorable anniversary and to the patriotic celebrations which will commemorate it; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare the week of September 17 through September 23, 2024 as Constitution Week in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge our citizens to reaffirm the ideals the framers of the Constitution had in 1787 by vigilantly protecting the freedoms guaranteed to us through this guardian of our liberties; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the General John Stark Chapter, National Society Daughters of the American Revolution, of Sycamore as a symbol of our esteem and respect.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 893

Offered by Representative Mason:

WHEREAS, For over 60 years, surgical technology has grown to meet the ever-increasing demand for well-educated, highly skilled, and versatile surgical technologists; and

WHEREAS, Surgical technologists are entrusted with the lives and well-being of patients and provide a critical service during surgical procedures; and

WHEREAS, Over 100,000 surgical technologists nationwide are an integral part of surgical teams committed to providing the highest quality of surgical care to patients; and

WHEREAS, Surgical technologists are responsible for the application of sterile and aseptic technique in the operating room, ensuring that equipment functions properly and facilitating safe and effective conduct during invasive surgical procedures; and

WHEREAS, Surgical technologists strive to prevent life-threatening surgical site infections and maximize patient safety; and

WHEREAS, Certified surgical technologists graduate from an accredited program and receive certification conferred by the National Board of Surgical Technology and Surgical Assisting based upon passage of the national examination; and

WHEREAS, The surgical technologist's motto, "Aeger Primo", meaning "the patient first", reflects total commitment to patient safety and advocacy; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare September 15 through 21, 2024 as Surgical Technologists Week in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Illinois State Assembly of the Association of Surgical Technologists as a symbol of our respect and esteem.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 895

Offered by Representative Yednock:

WHEREAS, Lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBTQ+) veterans have honorably served in the U.S. Armed Forces throughout the nation's history; and

WHEREAS, LGBTQ+ veterans have faced numerous discriminatory policies, including the ban on open service, and policies such as "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" that forced them to hide their identities; and

WHEREAS, Historical policies such as Executive Order 10450 and subsequent military regulations discriminated against LGBTQ+ individuals, labeling them as security risks or unfit for service due to their sexual orientation or gender identity; and

WHEREAS, These policies led to the discharge and exclusion of LGBTQ+ servicemembers, denying them the recognition and benefits they deserved and causing lasting harm; and

WHEREAS, On September 20, 2011, the "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" policy was officially repealed, allowing gay, lesbian, and bisexual individuals to serve openly in the U.S. military; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Defense and the Department of Veterans Affairs have begun to address the injustices faced by LGBTQ+ servicemembers and veterans, including discharge upgrades; and

WHEREAS, Ongoing challenges remain for LGBTQ+ servicemembers and veterans in achieving equitable treatment and access to benefits, including healthcare services such as gender-affirming care; and

WHEREAS, LGBTQ+ Veterans Day celebrates the contributions and sacrifices of LGBTQ+ veterans, acknowledges the continued need for progress in ensuring their rights and recognition, and serves as a reminder of the importance of inclusivity and equality in all aspects of military and civilian life and as a call to action for further outreach and support for LGBTQ+ veterans; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare September 20, 2024 as LGBTQ+ Veterans Day in the State of Illinois to honor and celebrate the courage, commitment, and service of LGBTQ+ veterans and to acknowledge the historical and ongoing challenges they face.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 897

Offered by Representative Harper:

WHEREAS, The National Institutes of Health reports that an estimated 50,000 to 100,000 people in the United States have primary biliary cholangitis (PBC), a chronic progressive liver disease in which the bile ducts become inflamed and damaged; and

WHEREAS, PBC is a rare, chronic autoimmune liver condition in which the small ducts in the liver are inflamed and damaged, causing bile and toxins to build up and cause problems, including scarring, cirrhosis (scarring and poor liver function), and eventual liver failure; the disease has no cure; and

WHEREAS, PBC is more common in women, and researchers estimate that in the U.S. approximately 65 out of every 100,000 women have PBC; and

WHEREAS, Many people do not have symptoms when they are first diagnosed and may not develop symptoms for several years; early symptoms may include fatigue or lethargy, which is the most common symptom, itchy skin (pruritus), dry eyes/mouth, and abdominal pain; and

WHEREAS, More people are being diagnosed with PBC, impacting people of varied ages, gender, race and ethnicity; those living with PBC share common symptoms, including debilitating fatigue and incessant itching or skin-crawling sensations that is made worse at night; and

WHEREAS, A GI specialist can screen a patient for primary biliary cholangitis by checking certain indicators in the blood that determine how well the liver is functioning; elevated quantities of the enzyme alkaline phosphatase (ALP) and AMA's (antimitochondrial antibodies) in the blood stream could point to PBC; diagnostic imaging tests could also be conducted to get a closer look at the bile ducts and the liver to screen for signs of scarring; and

WHEREAS, There is no cure for PBC, but treatment can help delay the condition's progression and manage complications; a liver transplant may be required in severe cases; in addition to the most common symptoms of fatigue and itchy skin, other symptoms may include darkening of the skin, small yellow or white bumps under the skin or around the eyes, and bone, muscle, and joint pain; as the disease progresses, symptoms of cirrhosis can develop, including jaundice, swelling of the legs and feet (edema), enlarged abdomen from fluid accumulation (ascites), or internal bleeding in the upper stomach and esophagus from enlarged veins (varices); and

WHEREAS, People living with PBC have been waiting for treatment advancements for many years; the Orphan Drug Act has encouraged and promoted the discovery and development of biopharmaceuticals designed to treat and potentially cure rare diseases; and

WHEREAS, Many of the world's leading academic institutions, academic medical centers, biotech companies, and pharmaceutical companies that are conducting research and seeking cures for rare diseases are doing so in this State; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare September 2024 as PBC Awareness Month and September 8, 2024 as PBC Day in the State of Illinois in order to raise awareness of primary biliary cholangitis (PBC) and provide an opportunity for patient organizations to help connect individuals and families who struggle with PBC, bring attention to the need for research and funding to support the discovery and development of therapies designed to treat and potentially cure PBC, and support the continued work of the Friends of the PBC Foundation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the Illinois Biotechnology Innovation Organization (iBIO), the chairperson of the Illinois Rare Disease Commission, and the Illinois Department of Public Health.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 900

Offered by Representative Yednock:

WHEREAS, The fourth Saturday in September is celebrated annually as National Public Lands Day to highlight the relationship between people and nature in recognition of America's public lands, including local, state, and national parks, conservation areas, forests, wildlife refuges, nature preserves, grasslands, marine sanctuaries, lakes, and reservoirs; and

WHEREAS, Founded by the National Environmental Education Foundation in 1994, National Public Lands Day will celebrate its 31st anniversary this year with the theme of "Together for Tomorrow" to foster environmental stewardship among people and communities in order to preserve and to protect public lands for future generations; and

WHEREAS, Each year on National Public Lands Day, thousands of volunteers gather to give back to public lands through a variety of activities, such as maintaining trails, planting trees, partaking in beach cleanups, removing invasive plants, participating in research as citizen scientists, and more; others get involved by visiting public lands and engaging in hiking, picnicking, camping, educational activities, and other forms of outdoor recreation; and

WHEREAS, National Public Lands Day underscores the importance nature, public lands, and outdoor activities and recreation play in improving and maintaining our physical and mental well-being; and

WHEREAS, National Public Lands Day provides a platform for environmental and outdoor education, raising awareness about conservation practices on public lands and the importance of preserving natural resources; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize September 28, 2024 as National Public Lands Day in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge all Illinoisans to celebrate the benefits that our public lands have to offer and to participate in activities to preserve and promote these important resources for the future.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 903

Offered by Representative Evans:

WHEREAS, Remarkable advances in cancer science are creating more effective treatments and cures for patients affected by cancer; and

WHEREAS, Unfortunately, many cancer patients do not benefit from these treatment advances, and some die needlessly as a result; and

WHEREAS, Surviving cancer is directly related to early detection and access to appropriate treatment, including advanced and sub-specialty care; and

WHEREAS, Many Illinois residents do not have access to advanced cancer centers offering the latest research and treatment for their specific cancer type due to their insurance, means, or other factors; and

WHEREAS, Of the 2 million Americans the American Cancer Society estimates will be diagnosed with cancer in 2024, more than 78,000 individuals are predicted to be diagnosed in Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Cancer care is increasingly reliant on genetic and genomic testing to direct care for each individual patient; and

WHEREAS, It is now understood that access to multidisciplinary supportive care while undergoing treatment can significantly impact outcomes and survival for cancer patients; and

WHEREAS, There is a growing understanding that there are hundreds of different cancer types and each may require different types of therapy; the complexities of cancer care include relying on the accuracy of the initial diagnosis, the choice of therapy, and access to appropriate clinical trials; and

WHEREAS, There is significant variability in the ability of medical oncologists to stay current with the most recent evidence due to the complexities of cancer care in the precision medicine era; and

WHEREAS, For many cancer patients, the first chance for a cure is the best chance for a cure, highlighting the need for access to appropriate expertise early in the cancer journey; and

WHEREAS, There are disparities in cancer outcomes and access to leading-edge clinical trials based on race and socioeconomic status that are unfavorable to those that are the most vulnerable and disadvantaged; and

WHEREAS, The speed of discovery in cancer diagnosis, treatment, and surveillance is creating a widening gap between the optimal care received by those with means and the substandard care too often received by the most vulnerable residents of Illinois, which will only worsen if it is not addressed; this reality reflects an important truth that cancer care is different from other types of health care, and the needs of cancer patients are different from those with other illnesses; and

WHEREAS, It is imperative that Illinois policymakers prioritize appropriate and timely access to expert cancer care for patients; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we endorse the following principles as the Cancer Patients' Bill of Rights to express our support that cancer patients in the State receive the best cancer care available:

(1) Cancer patients with complex cancers deserve access to specialized expertise and emerging treatments for their specific type of cancer, including precision medicine and genomic therapies, which are only available at advanced cancer centers;

(2) Cancer patients deserve multidisciplinary supportive care while undergoing treatment, including care that addresses pain, emotional, and overall health needs;

(3) Cancer patients should have the opportunity to access emerging therapies informed by the latest cancer research through relevant early-stage and late-stage clinical trials, which are often only available at cancer treatment institutions;

(4) To the extent possible, cancer patients should be able to receive timely cancer care in their community, which is often supported by partnerships between community providers and academic institutions; and

(5) Cancer patients have a right to fully understand their diagnoses and be informed about treatment options in culturally appropriate and understandable languages; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies be delivered to Governor JB Pritzker and Director Elizabeth M. Whitehorn of the Department of Healthcare and Family Services.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 907

Offered by Representative Stuart:

WHEREAS, From 1877 to 2002, the State of Illinois operated a large residential facility for developmentally disabled children and adults in the City of Lincoln, known first as The Illinois Asylum for Feeble Minded Children and later renamed the Lincoln State School and Colony, the Lincoln State School, and finally, the Lincoln Developmental Center; and

WHEREAS, The Lincoln Developmental Center was located on a sprawling campus, resembling a miniature city, and housed thousands of residents and contained its own power plant, kitchen, bakery, sewing rooms, laundry facility, hospital, nursing school, fire department, jail, and farm, as well as other industrial shops; and

WHEREAS, The Lincoln Developmental Center also contained a cemetery that housed the remains of deceased patients who had lived at the facility when their families could not be located or were indigent; and

WHEREAS, The State opened the Logan Correctional Center, a women's prison, adjacent to the Lincoln Developmental Center in 1978 and opened the Lincoln Correctional Center, a men's prison, on the same grounds in 1984; and

WHEREAS, After the closure of the Lincoln Developmental Center in 2002, the Illinois Department of Corrections (IDOC) became responsible for managing the Lincoln Developmental Center cemetery; and

WHEREAS, With the erection of correctional facilities near the cemetery and management of the cemetery becoming IDOC's responsibility, it became difficult for family members, relatives, and friends of those interred at the cemetery to visit their loved ones, care for their gravesites, and pay their respects; and

WHEREAS, No clear process exists for members of the public to visit their deceased loved ones interred at the Lincoln Developmental Center cemetery, including no public guidelines for families to follow and no public information on who is responsible for managing such visits at IDOC for families to contact; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Illinois Department of Corrections to develop a standard policy/set of guidelines that are public for those who wish to visit gravesites of loved ones including, but not limited to, familial relations and researchers; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the Illinois Department of Corrections to consider ease of access to the public for this cemetery during renovations or rebuilding of IDOC facilities at this site; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to the Director of the Illinois Department of Corrections.

WHEREAS, School psychologists are trained to assess student and school-based barriers to learning and individual strengths, utilize data-based decision-making, implement research-driven prevention and intervention strategies, and evaluate outcomes and improve accountability; and

WHEREAS, It is imperative that the State of Illinois recognize the vital role that school psychologists play in the personal and academic development of our state's children; therefore, be it

WHEREAS, SSG Troehler entered combat as a Heavy Weapons NCO and Section Leader under the 75th Infantry Division on Christmas Day 1944 in the Ardennes Counter Offensive, later known as the Battle of the Bulge; and

WHEREAS, SSG Troehler returned to the U.S. in April 1945 after marching through England, France, Belgium, and Luxemburg; and

WHEREAS, SSG Troehler received numerous medals, including the Bronze Star, the American Campaign Medal, the European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal, the World War II Victory Medal, and the Army Occupation Medal; and

WHEREAS, SSG Troehler received the Combat Infantry Badge, the Expert Infantry Badge, and the Expert Marksmanship Badge; he was also given the Honorable Service Lapel Button; and

WHEREAS, SSG Troehler passed away on April 13, 1989 in Chicago; therefore, be it
