At the hour of 3:12 o'clock p.m., the House convened perfunctory session.

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 87

Offered by Representative Chung:

WHEREAS, World Nutella Day, celebrated annually on February 5, brings people together from across the globe to honor their love of Nutella, the iconic hazelnut spread enjoyed by millions; and

WHEREAS, Ferrero, the company behind Nutella, is a global confectionery leader with deep roots in Illinois, including \$289 million in investments in new facilities and new jobs in the City of Bloomington, further solidifying the company's commitment to Illinois' economic development; and

WHEREAS, Ferrero has demonstrated a strong commitment to Illinois with its continued investment in the State, employing over 1,700 individuals at facilities that drive local economies and provide quality jobs; and

WHEREAS, Ferrero's presence in Illinois includes the Nutella Café in Chicago, the only café in the world dedicated entirely to Nutella, which has become a unique attraction and celebration of this iconic product; and

WHEREAS, Ferrero also owns Fannie May, a cherished 100-year-old chocolate company with retail stores across Illinois and the region, which was Ferrero's first acquisition in the United States in 2015, underscoring the company's confidence in Illinois as a key market and manufacturing hub; and

WHEREAS, In 2023, Ferrero opened an Innovation Center and R&D Lab in Chicago's historic Marshall Field and Company Building, further showcasing the company's dedication to innovation and Illinois' role as a hub for cutting-edge advancements in the confectionery industry; and

WHEREAS, Ferrero's additional Illinois facilities include a manufacturing plant in Franklin Park, where the company produces Butterfinger and Baby Ruth products, and a Chicago plant on 110th Street dedicated to manufacturing Keebler products; and

WHEREAS, Nutella has become a beloved treat for Illinois residents of all ages, symbolizing joy, creativity, and shared moments; and

WHEREAS, Ferrero continues to build on its legacy in Illinois through innovation, sustainability, and community engagement, enhancing Illinois' reputation as a leader in advanced manufacturing and economic development; and

WHEREAS, World Nutella Day provides an opportunity to celebrate Ferrero's contributions to the State of Illinois and recognize the delight Nutella brings to households across the State; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare February 5, 2025 as Nutella Day in the State of Illinois to honor Ferrero's significant investments in our State, the many employees who contribute to its success, and the joy that Nutella spreads throughout our communities; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Ferrero as an expression of our esteem and respect.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 90

Offered by Representative Sanalidro:

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois recognizes the importance of higher education as a vital component of workforce development, economic growth, and personal advancement; and

WHEREAS, Many students in Illinois balance professional responsibilities and family obligations during the day, making evening education programs essential to their academic and career progress; and

WHEREAS, Night courses and programs at Illinois colleges and universities provide crucial opportunities for non-traditional students, working adults, and career changers to pursue degrees and further their education without sacrificing their employment; and

WHEREAS, These programs offer pathways for students to build real-world skills and enhance their professional experience while continuing to contribute to the State's workforce and economy; and

WHEREAS, The availability of night courses expands access to education, promotes workforce readiness, and strengthens Illinois' economic competitiveness; and

WHEREAS, Budgetary cuts and program cancellations threaten the continuation of these vital educational opportunities, placing undue barriers on students seeking flexible learning options; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we express our strong support for the continued offering and expansion of night courses and programs at Illinois colleges and universities; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge higher education institutions and governing bodies to prioritize and protect night programs from budgetary cuts or elimination; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Illinois Board of Higher Education and the Illinois Community College Board to share with the presidents of public and private colleges and universities throughout Illinois.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 93

Offered by Representative Grant:

WHEREAS, Architecture shapes the character and identity of public spaces, uplifting communities, reflecting shared values, and inspiring pride in government institutions; and

WHEREAS, Public buildings funded by the State of Illinois should be clearly recognizable as civic structures, designed to honor Illinois' rich history, culture, and architectural heritage; and

WHEREAS, Traditional, classical, and other historically rooted architectural styles have long enhanced public spaces, strengthened community identity, and upheld the ideals of democracy; and

WHEREAS, The public has a vested interest in civic architecture, and incorporating community input ensures that designs reflect the aspirations of Illinois residents; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Administrator of the Capital Development Board, in consultation with the Office of the Governor and other relevant state agencies, to develop recommendations promoting civic buildings that are visually identifiable and respectful of Illinois' regional, traditional, and classical architectural heritage; and be it further

RESOLVED, That these recommendations should propose revisions to architectural guidelines and outline procedures for incorporating public input into design decisions; and be it further

RESOLVED, That if, before submitting these recommendations, the Administrator of the Capital Development Board proposes approving a new building design that does not align with this policy, the Administrator should notify the Governor at least 30 days prior to final approval and provide a justification for the design; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Administrator of the Capital Development Board and the Office of the Governor.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 94

Offered by Representative Croke:

WHEREAS, According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), one in seven women have trouble getting pregnant or sustaining a pregnancy; and

WHEREAS, The World Health Organization (WHO) and the American Medical Association (AMA) define infertility as a disease; and

WHEREAS, Infertility affects women and men equally and does not discriminate based on race, religion, sexual orientation, marital status, or socioeconomic level; and

WHEREAS, The LGBTQ community also faces challenges when building their families; and

WHEREAS, Some people become infertile due to a medical treatment for another condition, most commonly chemotherapy or radiation for cancer; and

WHEREAS, Family building options include adoption and medical treatment such as in vitro fertilization (IVF) and third-party reproduction; and

WHEREAS, Cost and lack of insurance coverage are barriers for many in our State who wish to access the family building options they need; and

WHEREAS, Raising awareness of infertility and the barriers faced by the family building community is the first step to removing these barriers; and

WHEREAS, It is imperative to support the volunteers, health care professionals, and members of the infertility and family building community; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare the week of April 20 through April 26, 2025 as Infertility Awareness Week in Illinois to help increase public awareness of the need to support individuals with infertility.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 95

Offered by Representative Miller:

WHEREAS, Illinois state lawmakers' spending plans came in at \$53.1 billion last year; as a result, taxpayers will be forced to pay \$1.1 billion more so that the State can spend record amounts in fiscal year (FY) 2025; and

WHEREAS, Among these tax increases, the extension of Illinois' cap on net operating losses, which will hike corporate income taxes for companies recently losing money, could be \$526 million in FY2025; and

WHEREAS, Because Illinois operates on a fiscal year that runs from July through June, and Illinois corporate taxes are paid quarterly, this tax hike could double in FY2026, resulting in a tax hike of more than \$1 billion; and

WHEREAS, The Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability (COGFA) has estimated that the budget shortfall for FY2026 will be approximately \$3.1 billion, leading to General Assembly members needing to make tough decisions; and

WHEREAS, Illinois' gasoline taxes were bumped to the rate of 47 cents per gallon, making Illinois' gas taxes the second highest in the nation, meaning that Illinois motorists can expect to pay approximately \$328 a year in state gas taxes alone; and

WHEREAS, In 2023, the Commercial Club of Chicago, an organization representing senior leaders of the State's business, education, cultural, and philanthropic sectors, suggested either increasing the State's personal and corporate income taxes for 10 years or implementing a retirement tax to help pay for the State's worst-in-the-nation pension debt; and

WHEREAS, There are serious problems with that plan, as the revenue estimates are likely too high due to ignoring the negative effects of tax hikes on the economy; also, higher revenues do not guarantee a fix for the State's pension problem, as it would take imposing both the retirement tax and higher state income taxes to generate what the State needs to stop adding to its pension debt, generating even greater risks and damages; and

WHEREAS, Overspending is a rampant problem in Illinois, resulting in disastrous repercussions and corrections that inevitably fail and fall back onto the people of Illinois, and it is for their sake that we must curb the costly expenses that the residents of this State will incur if faced with more tax increases; therefore, be it

WHEREAS, Cpl. Miller's heroic and timely actions inspired all who observed him and contributed greatly to repelling the enemy's assault; and

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that

there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to amend Article V of the Illinois Constitution by changing Sections 1, 3, 7, and 18 and by repealing Section 17 as follows:

ARTICLE V
THE EXECUTIVE

(ILCON Art. V, Sec. 1)

SECTION 1. OFFICERS

The Executive Branch shall include a Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, ~~Comptroller~~ and Treasurer elected by the electors of the State. They shall keep the public records and maintain a residence at the seat of government during their terms of office.

To be eligible to hold the office of Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, ~~Comptroller~~ or Treasurer, a person must be a United States citizen, at least 25 years old, and a resident of this State for the three years preceding his or her election.

SECTION 7. VACANCIES IN OTHER ELECTIVE OFFICES

If the Attorney General, Secretary of State, ~~Comptroller~~ or Treasurer fails to qualify or if the his office becomes vacant, the Governor shall fill the office by appointment. The appointee shall hold office until the elected officer qualifies or until a successor is elected and qualified as may be provided by law and shall not be subject to removal by the Governor. If the Lieutenant Governor fails to qualify or if the his office becomes vacant, it shall remain vacant until the end of the term.

SECTION 17. COMPTROLLER - DUTIES (REPEALED)

~~The Comptroller, in accordance with law, shall maintain the State's central fiscal accounts, and order payments into and out of the funds held by the Treasurer.~~

SECTION 18. TREASURER - DUTIES

The Treasurer, in accordance with law, shall (i) maintain the State's central fiscal accounts, and order payments into and out of the funds held by him or her, (ii) be responsible for the safekeeping and investment of monies and securities deposited with him or her, and for their disbursement upon his or her order, and (iii) have the duties and powers that may be prescribed by law of the Comptroller.

A Comptroller shall not be elected in 2030 and thereafter. This Constitutional Amendment otherwise takes effect upon the conclusion of the term of the Comptroller elected in 2026.
