At the hour of 12:29 o'clock p.m., the House convened perfunctory session.

**HOUSE RESOLUTIONS**

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

**HOUSE RESOLUTION 248**

Offered by Representative Ford:

WHEREAS, The United States has almost 2,000,000 of its people in prison, which is more than any other developed nation in the world; and

WHEREAS, The vast majority of the men and women in our prisons, approximately 95%, will eventually return to their communities; and

WHEREAS, Few of those who return to their communities are prepared for their release and often face barriers reintegrating into society, such as serious physical and mental health problems, limited housing options, and inadequate education or qualifications to hold a job; and

WHEREAS, One-third of all correction departments provide no services to released offenders, and most departments do not offer a transitional program, placing a heavy burden on families and communities; and

WHEREAS, Two-thirds of persons released will be rearrested for new crimes within the first three years after their release; and

WHEREAS, Congressman Danny K. Davis sponsored the Second Chance Act of 2007 for the purposes of providing transitional assistance to ex-offenders in coping with the challenges of reentry, reducing recidivism, helping to reunite families and protect communities, and enhancing public safety; and

WHEREAS, The Second Chance Act of 2007 was signed into law on April 9, 2008; and

WHEREAS, The Second Chance Act of 2007 provides grants to state and local governments to promote the safe and successful reintegration of offenders into the community upon their release; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare July 3, 2025 and July 3, 2026 as Illinois Citizens Reentry Day in the State of Illinois in recognition of Congressman Danny K. Davis' work in helping to provide ex-offenders with a second chance and opportunity to reenter society as productive citizens and to encourage continuing support of such citizens as they reenter their communities; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Congressman Danny K. Davis with our esteem and respect.

**HOUSE RESOLUTION 249**

Offered by Representative Huynh:

WHEREAS, On April 30, 1975, Saigon, the capital of the Republic of Vietnam, popularly known as South Vietnam, was overthrown by the North Vietnamese army, and the Republic of Vietnam was dissolved; and

WHEREAS, Vietnamese and Americans worked together to organize the largest helicopter evacuation in history from the United States Embassy in Saigon, helping over 7,000 people, including 5,500 Vietnamese, leave within 24 hours; and

WHEREAS, Further operations supported by Americans that spring, summer, and autumn helped approximately 125,000 Vietnamese refugees leave their country, and the eventual creation of a refugee program with the assistance of the United Nations helped over 500,000 Vietnamese people immigrate to the United States; and

WHEREAS, Vietnamese American communities annually commemorate the Fall of Saigon, known as "Black April", in order to recognize the sacrifices of those in their communities who fought in defense of the ideals of democracy, freedom, and human rights; and

WHEREAS, Over the past half century, hundreds of thousands of Vietnamese people have settled in the United States and have worked to build vibrant communities that contribute to the rich diversity of the United States; and

WHEREAS, Illinois has its own vibrant community of Vietnamese and Vietnamese Americans, including refugees who helped establish a "Little Saigon" neighborhood in a corridor along Argyle Street in Chicago's Uptown area, building businesses and social service organizations; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois community of Vietnamese and Vietnamese Americans has grown over the past half century from just hundreds of people to between 30,000 and 40,000 today; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we honor the contributions of Vietnamese and Vietnamese Americans to the United States and their values of upholding human rights, freedom, and democracy and recognize the sacrifices made in order to support these values, including losses of family, home, and life; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we honor the courage, dignity, strength, and resilience of Vietnamese refugees who were forced to flee their home to escape persecution and rebuild their lives and recognize the need to build empathy and understanding for the plight of refugees; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge all Illinoisans to take time to learn about the history and contributions of Vietnamese and Vietnamese American people to Illinois and the United States.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 250

Offered by Representative Evans:

WHEREAS, Henrietta Lacks, a Black woman, was born as Loretta Pleasant to Eliza Lacks Pleasant and John Randal in Roanoke, Virginia on August 1, 1920; she married David Lacks, and they had five children; she passed away from cervical cancer at the age of 31 in Johns Hopkins Hospital's racially segregated "colored ward" in Baltimore, Maryland on October 4, 1951, leaving behind her children, husband, and her "immortal cells", known as HeLa cells, that became the foundation for several advances in modern medicine and have saved over 10 million lives; she was buried at the Lacks Family Cemetery in Clover, Virginia; and

WHEREAS, After her death, a scientist discovered that Henrietta Lacks' DNA cells lived outside of her body and never died; in contrast, all other human cells died after a few hours outside the body; not only did her cells stay alive in the lab, but the cells also replicated every 24 hours; during her treatment, samples of her cancer cells were taken without her knowledge nor her consent; said more emphatically, she did not donate her cervical cancer cells; and

WHEREAS, Henrietta Lacks' immortal DNA cells were coined "HeLa", combining the first two letters of her first name and the first two letters of her last name, and were subsequently camouflaged by the scientific community's pseudonym "Helen Lane" rather than Henrietta Lacks; this massive medical breakthrough allowed researchers to conduct experiments on human cells outside of the body, and HeLa cells have played a crucial role in medical science; and

WHEREAS, Scientists have continued to use the immortal HeLa cell line all over the world, including in research on the effects of zero gravity in outer space, the development of polio and COVID-19 vaccines, and the study of molecular biology, HIV/AIDS, cloning, COVID-19, in vitro fertilization (IVF), and cancer, including leukemia chemotherapy; and

WHEREAS, For decades, Henrietta Lacks' family had no knowledge regarding her immortal DNA cells and the breakthroughs that came from them; it was not until a scientist contacted her children asking for blood samples in 1973 that the family learned their mother's cells were being used globally; and

WHEREAS, Alfred "Lacks" Carter Jr., the son of Deborah Lacks and the grandson of Henrietta Lacks, is the founder and president of the HeLa House, located in Chicago, and the Henrietta House of Healing; he is a senior advisor to the Lacks family, leads the HELA100 initiative, and is a World Health Organization Goodwill Ambassador for Cervical Cancer Elimination; the 2019 Henrietta Lacks Enhancing Cancer Research Act and House of Appropriation Report 116-450 not only honor the life and legacy of Henrietta Lacks but each also includes a provision for a Government Accountability Office (GAO) study about the diverse representation of patients in cancer clinical trials; and

WHEREAS, Alfred "Lacks" Carter Jr. is committed to generously giving his time and talents to preserving Henrietta Lacks' legacy; he hopes to empower and educate others about his grandmother and her medical contributions, and he endorses and promotes clinical research and the impact it has on health and racial disparities; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we honor the life and legacy of Henrietta Lacks, an African American woman, whose contributions to medical science have had a lasting impact though her name is not widely known; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we recognize Alfred "Lacks" Carter Jr. for his work to preserve Henrietta Lacks' legacy and for his contributions in the fight against cervical cancer; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge support for community-based research and education programs, which are vital to educating and empowering community members so they can make informed decisions about being involved in clinical research and the research process; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge support for clinical research to reduce health disparities, to save lives, to gain insights about the safety and effectiveness of drugs and other medical treatments, and to discover treatments for various diseases.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 252

Offered by Representative Ford:

WHEREAS, The housing crisis in Illinois has created significant challenges for both landlords and tenants, leading to heightened tensions and misunderstandings between both parties; and

WHEREAS, While many tenants face issues that may lead to housing instability or wrongful eviction, landlords also contend with significant challenges, including dealing with problematic tenants who may engage in behavior that disrupts the property or community, resulting in financial losses due to non-payment of rent and damage to property; and

WHEREAS, The presence of squatters in residential properties undermines landlords' rights and property values, while also impacting the safety and stability of surrounding neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, The timing and processes surrounding evictions must be fair and transparent, ensuring due process for tenants while also providing landlords with a timely resolution regarding non-compliance with lease agreements; and

WHEREAS, Crime and safety issues contribute to the difficulties landlords face in maintaining their properties and affect tenants' perceptions of safety and security in their homes; and

WHEREAS, Effective collaboration between landlords, tenants, local governments, community organizations, and law enforcement is essential to address these challenges and foster a healthier housing environment for all stakeholders; and

WHEREAS, Ordinances and regulations pertaining to housing must be equitable and balanced, addressing the rights and responsibilities of both landlords and tenants while promoting safe and stable communities; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the Landlord-Tenant Task Force is created to acknowledge and address the complex challenges faced by both landlords and tenants in our communities across Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force is charged with studying the following:

- (1) Current laws and regulations related to landlord-tenant relationships, including the processes for evictions and measures addressing squatting;
- (2) Best practices regarding eviction notices, timelines, and processes to ensure fairness while recognizing landlords' right to protect their investments;
- (3) Guidelines for addressing squatter situations that balance the rights of property owners;
- (4) Initiatives that create safe communities and housing environments, enhancing safety measures for both landlords and tenants, thereby fostering a secure living atmosphere;
- (5) Community engagement to promote open communication and understanding between landlords and tenants through forums, workshops, and educational programs;
- (6) Recommendations for legislative changes to improve housing policies to ensure both a responsible rental environment and adequate support systems for tenants facing hardship; and
- (7) Discrimination in housing; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall consist of the following members, who shall serve without compensation:

- (1) Three members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House, one of which shall serve as chair;
- (2) Three members of the House of Representatives appointed by the House Minority Leader;
- (3) One representative from an association that advocates on behalf of landlords appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- (4) One representative from an association that advocates on behalf of tenants appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- (5) One representative from an association that advocates on behalf of realtors appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- (6) One representative from an association that advocates on behalf of the homeless appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- (7) One representative from a community organization appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- (8) One housing law expert appointed by the Speaker of the House; and
- (9) Two local government officials appointed by the Speaker of the House; and be it further

RESOLVED, That if a vacancy occurs in the Task Force it shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall meet at the call of the chair; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Housing Development Authority shall provide administrative support for the Task Force; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall submit its final report to the House of Representatives no later than December 31, 2026, and upon the filing of the report, the Task Force is dissolved; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Speaker of the House and the Minority Leader of the House.

#### HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 26

Offered by Representative Harper:

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that the End Gun Violence in Disproportionately Impacted Areas Task Force is created to study, analyze data, make recommendations, and develop policy proposals addressing the root causes of violence and resulting trauma to drastically reduce gun violence in disproportionately impacted areas; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall consist of the following members who shall serve without compensation:

- (1) The Executive Director of the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority or his or her designee, who shall serve as chair;
- (2) The Director of the Department of Children and Family Services or his or her designee;
- (3) The Director of the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity or his or her designee;
- (4) The Secretary of the Department of Human Services or his or her designee;

- (5) The State Superintendent of Education or his or her designee;
- (6) The Director of the Illinois Housing Development Authority or his or her designee; and
- (7) The following members appointed by the Governor:
  - (a) One elected county official representing a disproportionately impacted area;
  - (b) One elected state official representing a disproportionately impacted area;
  - (c) One elected federal official representing a disproportionately impacted area;
  - (d) One representative of the Chicago Police Department;
  - (e) One representative of a municipal police department located in a disproportionately impacted area;
  - (f) Two representatives of non-profit organizations with budgets over \$1,000,000 that primary work directly on violence reduction;
  - (g) Three representatives of non-profit organizations with budgets under \$1,000,000 that primary work directly on violence reduction;
  - (h) Two representatives of non-profit organizations that primarily engage in street level violence reduction and outreach to at-risk individuals;
  - (i) Three members employed by news media organizations in the top five news media markets nationwide as determined by Nielsen Media Research, who live in a disproportionately impacted area;
  - (j) One member employed by a news media organization in Illinois who lives in a disproportionately impacted area; and
  - (k) Ten residents of the state that reside in disproportionately impacted areas that have experienced high rates of gun violence for at least the previous ten years; and be it further

RESOLVED, That if a vacancy occurs in the Task Force it shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall meet at the call of the chair; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority and the Illinois State Police Division of Justice shall provide administrative support for the Task Force; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall submit its final report to the General Assembly no later than December 31, 2026, and upon the filing of the report, the Task Force is dissolved; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Executive Director of the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority, the Director of the Department of Children and Family Services, the Director of the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, the Secretary of the Department of Human Services, the State Superintendent of Education, the Director of the Illinois Housing Development Authority, and the Governor.

#### HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 27

Offered by Representative Harper:

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois has identified the need to create a local, sustainable, accessible, fair, and healthy food system in order to provide healthy food choices in State-funded facilities; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois is committed to improving the health of all its residents and to promoting a safe, healthy, and fair work environment for its workforce; and

WHEREAS, The Good Food Purchasing Program (GFPP) was developed in 2012 to provide an incentive to public institutions to procure Good Food produced through values-driven purchasing standards; and

WHEREAS, GFPP defines Good Food as food that is healthy, affordable, fair, and sustainable and is produced, processed, distributed, and recycled locally using the principles of environmental stewardship, meets the Dietary Guidelines for Americans, and is available to purchase for all income levels; and

WHEREAS, Good Food values prioritize nutrition, affordability, locality, and sustainable production practices, including sound environmental practices, fair prices for producers, safe and fair working conditions for employees, and humane conditions for animals; and

WHEREAS, All participants in the GFPP food supply chain receive fair compensation and fair treatment and are free from exploitation; and

WHEREAS, Good Food Purchasing refers to the sourcing and purchasing of foods and beverages and food and beverage service contracts procured by the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, In practicing Good Food Purchasing policies, the State of Illinois will help support a regional food system that is ecologically sound, economically viable, and racially and socially equitable and has an impact on the availability of local, sustainable food; and

WHEREAS, It is recognized that the significant buying power of public institutions across the country can reform the food system, create opportunities for smaller farmers and low-income entrepreneurs to thrive, provide just compensation and fair treatment for food chain workers, support sustainable farming practices, reward good environmental stewardship, and increase access to fresh and healthy foods; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we embrace the principles of the Good Food Purchasing Program as a strategy to help improve our region's food system through the adoption and implementation of Good Food Purchasing Standards; and be it further

RESOLVED, That there is created the Illinois Good Food Purchasing Policy Task Force to study the current procurement of food within the State and explore how Good Food Purchasing can be implemented to maximize the procurement of healthy foods that are sustainably, locally, and equitably sourced; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall consist of the following members, who shall serve without compensation:

- (1) The Lieutenant Governor or his or her designee;
- (2) The Speaker of the House of Representatives or his or her designee;
- (3) The Minority Leader of the House of Representatives or his or her designee;
- (4) The Senate President or his or her designee;
- (5) The Senate Minority Leader or his or her designee;
- (6) One member nominated by a statewide local food advocacy organization appointed by the Lt. Governor;
- (7) One member nominated by a national multi-sector food advocacy organization appointed by the Lt. Governor;
- (8) One member nominated by a Chicago-based food advocacy organization appointed by the Lt. Governor;
- (9) One member nominated by a statewide environmental advocacy organization appointed by the Lt. Governor;
- (10) One member nominated by a statewide labor organization that represents food workers appointed by the Lt. Governor;
- (11) One member nominated by a national farm-animal welfare organization appointed by the Lt. Governor;
- (12) The Director of the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity or his or her designee;
- (13) The Director of the Environmental Protection Agency or his or her designee;
- (14) The Director of the Department of Public Health or his or her designee;
- (15) The Director of the Department of Natural Resources or his or her designee;
- (16) The Chief Procurement Officer for General Services or his or her designee;
- (17) The Chief Procurement Officer for Higher Education or his or her designee;
- (18) The Chief Procurement Officer for the Secretary of State's Office or his or her designee;
- (19) The Chief Procurement Officer for the Department of Corrections or his or her designee;
- (20) The Chief Procurement Officer for the Department of Human Services or his or her designee;
- (21) The Chief Procurement Officer for Central Management Services or his or her designee;
- (22) The Director of the Department of Agriculture or his or her designee;
- (23) One member nominated by a statewide organization that advocates for healthy nutrition appointed by the Lt. Governor;
- (24) One member nominated by a statewide coalition that advocates for a just State food system appointed by the Lt. Governor; and
- (25) Two members nominated by an association that advocates on behalf of farmers appointed by the Lt. Governor; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Department of Agriculture shall provide administrative support for the Task Force; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force members shall select a chairperson at the first meeting; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall submit its final report to the Governor and the General Assembly no later than December 31, 2026 and is dissolved upon the filing of its final report.
