Offered by Representative Welch:

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of Representatives are saddened to learn of the death of Charles A. "Chuck" Hartke, former State Representative and Director of the Illinois Department of Agriculture, who passed away on April 13, 2025; and

WHEREAS, Chuck Hartke was born to Alphonse and Sophia Hartke in Effingham on May 7, 1944; he graduated from Teutopolis High School in 1962, and he remained a devoted fan of the Wooden Shoes for the rest of his life, particularly during the time his granddaughters, Madeline and Anna, were stars of the girls basketball team; and

WHEREAS, Chuck Hartke married his high school sweetheart, Kathryn L. Hoene, on August 10, 1963, and their union produced two children, Christopher and Kimberly, and six grandchildren, Ryan, Rachael, Jaelen, Madeline, Anna, and Jack, before she preceded him in death on November 1, 2012; he was blessed thereafter in finding a second soulmate in his fiancée, Brenda Holmes, who herself became a member of the extended Hartke family; and

WHEREAS, Chuck Hartke, having answered the call of the draft, served in the U.S. Army from 1966 to 1968 during the Vietnam War; he was stationed in Quang Tri, Vietnam, where he served as a field medic and ascended to the rank of an E-5 sergeant to oversee triage operations as part of a highly trained MASH unit; and

WHEREAS, After his military service in Vietnam, Chuck Hartke returned to Teutopolis in Effingham County to tend to his growing farmstead and young family, becoming a skilled farmer; he produced corn and soybeans, and he also managed livestock, raising swine and sheep; and

WHEREAS, Chuck Hartke secured an appointment on the Effingham County Board in 1971, representing the start of his career in public office, and he served on the board until 1974; and

WHEREAS, Chuck Hartke earned appointment to the Illinois House of Representatives in January 1985, where he served with distinction for nine terms and was named Assistant Majority Leader in 1997, a position he held throughout the remainder of his time in the House; and

WHEREAS, During his time as a State Representative, Chuck Hartke sponsored a total of 55 bills, serving as the primary sponsor of 28 of them, and became known for his expertise on agriculture policy, his record of securing support for infrastructure projects and programs to benefit his downstate legislative district, and his ability to reach across the aisle and find consensus on a wide range of issues; and

WHEREAS, Following his tenure in the House, Chuck Hartke was appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Illinois Senate to serve as Director of the Illinois Department of Agriculture, a position he held from 2003 until his retirement from public service in 2008; he was regarded as a highly-visible and respected farmer-director and an effective advocate for all farmers and agricultural interests in the State; and

WHEREAS, In retirement, Chuck Hartke became an accomplished gardener, having constructed a large tropical greenhouse on his farm, and he happily gave away his flowers and vegetables to folks in and around Teutopolis and at the State Capitol in Springfield; during this time, he especially loved spending time with Brenda, thoroughly enjoying their many traveling adventures and treasured times with family and friends; and

WHEREAS, Chuck Hartke published a series of essays on his life in 2022 titled, A Farm Boy's Journey Into Politics, which chronicles a varied and well-lived life, reflecting his indomitable positive spirit and ever-present good humor; and

WHEREAS, Chuck Hartke was a devoted family man and farmer, and he will be remembered for his substantial record of service to his community, State, and nation; and

WHEREAS, Chuck Hartke is survived by his fiancée, Brenda; his son, Christopher (Beth) Hartke; his daughter, Kimberly (Patrick) Deters; his grandchildren, Ryan Deters, Rachael (Curtis) Meuth, Jaelen (Rodrigo) Deters-Camargo, Madeline (Jordan) Ratermann, Anna (Mark) Wendell, and Jack Hartke; and his great-grandson, Luke Wendell; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we mourn the passing of Charles A. "Chuck" Hartke, former State Representative and Director of the Illinois Department of Agriculture, and extend our sincere condolences to his family, friends, and all who knew and loved him; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the family of Chuck Hartke as an expression of our deepest sympathy.

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 316

Offered by Representative Faver Dias:

WHEREAS, Community integrated living arrangements (CILAs), also known as group homes, are living situations, such as a house or an apartment, in communities throughout Illinois where unrelated adults with intellectual/developmental disabilities (I/DD) reside; and

WHEREAS, CILAs provide community-based housing and essential support for nearly 9,823 adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities across Illinois, many of whom require extensive supervision and care; and

WHEREAS, Over 200 licensed CILA providers employ thousands of direct support professionals (DSPs) who are vital to delivering daily care and maintaining residents' health, safety, and independence; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois is under the Ligas Consent Decree, which requires expanded access to community-based services for individuals with I/DD, yet the State has repeatedly been found out of compliance; and

WHEREAS, In 2020, the State published the Guidehouse Rate Study, which outlined several I/DD rate changes based on approved recommendations by the Ligas Rates Oversight Committee with the Pritzker Administration committing to fully funding the rate study; and

WHEREAS, From 2021 to 2025, the Department of Human Services (DHS) has implemented portions of the Guidehouse Rate study, and the General Assembly has made significant investments into the I/DD community system; however, some crucial priorities still remain partially or fully unfunded; and

WHEREAS, Despite that progress, Governor Pritzker's FY26 introduced budget proposes eliminating one million funded DSP hours, reducing services for all 24-hour CILA residents by approximately 90 hours

per year and threatening care quality, community stability, and compliance with federal home and community-based services regulations; and

WHEREAS, These proposed cuts contradict prior agreements and risk undermining both the State's legal obligations and its commitment to individuals with I/DD; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly must remain committed to ensuring high-quality services and supports for adults with I/DD residing in CILA group homes and to utilizing state budgets intended to invest in improving the service array to do so; and

WHEREAS, Funding adequate DSP hours in FY26 is vital in ensuring a healthy community system that meets federal and State guidelines and ensuring that individuals with I/DD in Illinois receive the quality services and supports they deserve; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge full restoration of all eliminated direct support professionals (DSP) hours in the final FY26 State budget to protect the services upon which individuals with intellectual/developmental disabilities (I/DD) depend; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Governor, the Illinois Senate President, the Illinois Speaker of the House, and the Illinois Department of Human Services Division of Developmental Disabilities (IDHS/DDD).
