On May 16, 2025, State Representative Kelly Cassidy stated on the House Floor during a Point of Personal Privilege, the following comments:

"It's a day that ends in a -Y, and therefore my colleagues on the other side of the aisle feel the need to share their obsession with childrens' genitalia once again.

We are grown adults and we are picking on kids because you are obsessed with childrens' genitalia. And how do you propose we address the inevitable trauma from sexually assaulting every child in a bathroom and locker room by inspecting their genitals.

You all need to get over yourself and need to get a hobby that doesn't involve obsessing over kids genitals."

Shortly after her comments, I had made a point of inquiry with the Chair as to whether or not the comments of Rep. Cassidy were a violation of the decorum requirements of the House (as set in House Rule 51 ). The Chair stated that she would get back to me with a response. Approximately five minutes prior to the adjournment for the week, I followed up on my initial inquiry of the Chair regarding the Chair's determination on whether or not it was a violation of the decorum of the House. I was told that my inquiry had to be submitted in writing. It was asked when the ruling would occur, and the Chair stated "we will do our best to get it to you as soon as possible."

Per the instruction of the Chair, I am requesting a determination of the Chair on the comments of Rep. Cassidy on May 16th (listed above). Were the comments a violation of the decorum of the House, as established in the House Rules?

While I am submitting the request for a determination in writing, I would like to note that there is nothing in the House Rules or Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised that allows for or requires a Point of Inquiry to be in writing. A "Point of Inquiry" is a parliamentary query relating to proceedings of the House. When the inquiry is made, it is a timely matter seeking an immediate or timely response from the Chair.

Under House Rule 4(c)(8). it is a duty of the Speaker, or any other member acting as the Presiding Officer', "to inform the House when necessary, or when a question is raised, on any point of order or practice pertinent to the pending business." Under our House Rules, a determination by the Chair on the matter in question should have been made prior to adjournment and should have not been reduced to being in writing in order to answer the inquiry.

I continue to await the Chair's response to my inquiry, and I ask that this letter be included in the House Journal so that it is memorialized in the record.
