WHEREAS, Due to FTD's low estimated prevalence in the U.S., many members of the medical community remain unfamiliar with the disease; and

WHEREAS, FTD is frequently misdiagnosed as Alzheimer's disease, Parkinson's disease, or a psychiatric condition, such as depression, and it takes a FTD patient about 3.6 years, on average, to get an accurate diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, There is currently no cure or treatment available to slow the progress of FTD; and

WHEREAS, Kara Kirby was diagnosed with a behavioral variant of FTD at the age of 29, and she was checked into the Mayo Clinic because no medical expert in her area could diagnosis her; she was cared for by her parents until this progressive, incurable disease took her life on New Year's Day in 2023 at the young age of 33; and

WHEREAS, Kara Kirby's story reminds us all of the need for awareness and support for a disease that is largely misunderstood, misdiagnosed, and underfunded; and

WHEREAS, Establishing a FTD Awareness Week will help increase understanding and support for this deadly disease; and

WHEREAS, Similar efforts are underway in other states across the country, including Maryland, Ohio, Oklahoma, Tennessee, and West Virginia; therefore, be it

WHEREAS, Teacher leadership is a cost-effective way to expand leadership capacity in schools without adding administrative positions and is particularly impactful in rural schools in which educators often serve in multiple teaching and leadership roles simultaneously without recognition; and
