HOUSE RESOLUTION 390

Offered by Representative Sanalitra:

WHEREAS, The rate of unintentional injuries and deaths in the United States remains at unacceptable levels; and

WHEREAS, Education on continuous safety improvement, employee engagement, roadway safety, and worker well-being remains critical to preventing injuries and deaths in the United States; and

WHEREAS, The cost of unintentional injuries to workers and their employers exceeds \$167 billion each year and causes great suffering among individuals and their families; and

WHEREAS, Illinois residents and all workers deserve to live in communities that promote safe and healthy living; and

WHEREAS, Preventing unintentional injuries and deaths requires the cooperation of all levels of government, employers, and the general public; and

WHEREAS, The National Safety Council, founded in 1913, was congressionally chartered in 1953 to lead this nation in injury prevention through safety and health information, education, training, and advocacy in the United States; and

WHEREAS, The National Safety Council and the Iowa-Illinois Safety Council work to promote policies, practices, and procedures that lead to increased safety, protection, and health in business and industry, in schools and colleges, on roads and highways, and in homes and communities; and

WHEREAS, The National Safety Council and the Iowa-Illinois Safety Council will conduct a national month-long public education campaign in 2025; and

WHEREAS, The summer season is a time of increased rates of unintentional injuries and deaths, and it is an appropriate time to focus attention on injury risks and prevention; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we express our support for National Safety Month in June 2025 and strongly urge the citizens and businesses of Illinois to observe National Safety Month by practicing safe and healthy behaviors in all aspects of their lives.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 391

Offered by Representative Grasse:

WHEREAS, On May 22, 2025, Congressional Republicans slammed a bill through the House of Representatives in the middle of the night that strips healthcare coverage from 14 million Americans; and

WHEREAS, President Donald Trump brazenly lied to the American people, stating he would not cut Medicaid while actually lobbying behind closed doors to pass the bill that guts \$1 trillion from Medicaid and other lifesaving services over the next decade; and

WHEREAS, Congress' own estimates show that 8.6 million Americans will be removed from Medicaid and that another 5.1 million Americans will lose healthcare coverage because of Republicans' refusal to extend Affordable Care Act tax credits that families need to make healthcare affordable; and

WHEREAS, In Illinois alone, nearly half a million people will lose healthcare coverage because of the Republican bill; and

WHEREAS, The Trump healthcare cuts finance a plan that provides massive tax cuts for the wealthy while simultaneously adding to the burden of modest-income households; an analysis by the Yale Budget Lab found that Trump's bill gives the wealthiest 1% more than \$63,000 per year, while taking \$800 per year from the lowest-income families; and

WHEREAS, The Trump healthcare cuts are currently being debated in the United States Senate; and

WHEREAS, Members of the Illinois House of Representatives have worked to move our State in a better direction by advancing policies such as the Healthcare Protection Act, which aims to make healthcare better and more affordable by stopping insurance companies from raising premiums simply to pad profits and reining in the gimmicks big insurance companies use to deny care; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we oppose the Trump healthcare cuts, which fundamentally undermine the basic dignity and financial security of working families across the country; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we call on the United States Senate to immediately table the Trump healthcare cuts bill and instead pursue reforms such as the Illinois' Healthcare Protection Act to make healthcare more accessible and more affordable; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to all members of the Illinois Congressional Delegation.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 40

Offered by Representative Chung:

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois General Assembly are committed to cutting the costs of everyday essentials and making vital services more affordable so that Illinoisans can build stronger futures; and

WHEREAS, Instead of taking any action to ease the cost of living, President Donald Trump has done the opposite, embarking on an erratic and destructive campaign to raise the prices of everything that families purchase everyday through senseless tariff schemes; and

WHEREAS, The economic hits have caused major retail chains, including Target, Walmart, McDonald's, and Amazon, to warn of chaotic hiring patterns, numerous closures, and charge hikes nationwide; and

WHEREAS, In the face of these approaching challenges, lawmakers have a responsibility to explore potential legislative measures and policy proposals that could help make life more affordable and prevent millions of Illinoisans from having to overcome the repercussions of the Trump Administration's blunders; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that the Saving Working Families and Easing the Cost of Living Task Force is established; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall consist of the following members, who will serve without compensation:

(1) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House, who shall serve as co-chair;

(2) One member of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, who shall serve as co-chair;

- (3) Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- (4) Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the House Minority Leader;
- (5) Two members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate; and
- (6) Two members of the Senate appointed by the Senate Minority Leader; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall be charged with assessing the feasibility of implementing policies focused on reducing the cost of living and enhancing the economic well-being of middle-class and modest-income families, including but not limited to:

- (1) The elimination of state taxes on tipped wages, commonly known as "no tax on tips";
- (2) The elimination of state taxes on overtime pay;
- (3) Allowing taxpayers to deduct the full amount of union dues paid;
- (4) An annual sales tax holiday coinciding with back-to-school shopping season applied to new school supplies, clothes, shoes, and other essential items;
- (5) The expansion of career and technical education to prepare young people for high-wage jobs;
- (6) Controlling consumer utility prices;
- (7) The expansion of tax credits that primarily benefit middle and modest-income families, including the Earned Income Tax Credit and the Child Tax Credit;
- (8) The expansion of state grants and additional tax credits to make child care more affordable and accessible;
- (9) Policies and investments that will increase the supply of housing and bring down home costs by facilitating the construction of new homes and the renovation of underutilized residential areas;
- (10) Efforts to lower grocery costs, including the expansion of state grants for small grocery stores and food retailers in underserved areas and new support for local food producers;
- (11) Continued efforts to make healthcare and prescription drugs more affordable and more accessible; and
- (12) Support for community-based small businesses; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the initial appointments to the Task Force shall be made no more than three months after adoption of this resolution; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall hold its first meeting within 30 days after all Task Force members have been appointed and then on a monthly basis thereafter; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall submit a report to the General Assembly no later than December 31, 2026, and upon this filing, the Task Force is dissolved; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Speaker of the House, the House Minority Leader, the President of the Senate, and the Senate Minority Leader.

**HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTIONS
CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

Representative Spain introduced the following:

**HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION
CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 17**

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to amend Sections 2 and 3 of Article VI of the Illinois Constitution as follows:

**ARTICLE VI
THE JUDICIARY**

(ILCON Art. VI, Sec. 2)

SECTION 2. JUDICIAL DISTRICTS

(a) Until the 2032 general election, the ~~The~~ State is divided into five Judicial Districts for the selection of Supreme and Appellate Court Judges. The First Judicial District consists of Cook County. The remainder

of the State shall be divided by law into four Judicial Districts of substantially equal population, each of which shall be compact and composed of contiguous counties.

(b) Beginning with the 2032 general election, the State shall be divided by law into seven Judicial Districts for the selection of Supreme Court Judges and five Judicial Districts for the selection of Appellate Court Judges. Each Judicial District shall be compact, contiguous, and substantially equal in population.

(c) Nothing in this Section affects the tenure of a Supreme Court Judge whose term of office begins before the first Monday of December of the year following judicial redistricting under subsection (b) of Section 3 of this Article VI. No Supreme Court Judge whose term of office begins before the first Monday of December of the year following judicial redistricting under subsection (b) of Section 3 of this Article VI shall be required to change his or her residency in order to continue serving in office.

SECTION 3. SUPREME COURT - ORGANIZATION AND REDISTRICTING

(a) The Supreme Court shall consist of seven Judges. ~~Three shall be selected from the First Judicial District and one from each of the other~~ Judicial Districts. Four Judges constitute a quorum, and the concurrence of four is necessary for a decision. Supreme Court Judges shall select a Chief Justice from their number to serve for a term of three years.

(b) In the year following each federal decennial census, the General Assembly by law shall redistrict the Judicial Districts. If no redistricting plan becomes effective by June 30 of that year, a Judicial Redistricting Commission shall be constituted as provided by law for the redistricting of the Judicial Districts in the State.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 18

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to amend Sections 10 and 12 of Article VI of the Illinois Constitution as follows:

ARTICLE VI THE JUDICIARY

(ILCON Art. VI, Sec. 10)

SECTION 10. TERMS OF OFFICE

(a) For elected terms of office commencing on or after the first Monday in December of 2030:

(1) the term of office of a Supreme Court Judge shall be one term of fourteen years;

(2) the terms of office of Appellate Court Judges shall each be ten years;

(3) the terms of office of Circuit Judges shall each be six years; and

(4) the terms of office of Associate Judges shall each be four years.

(b) For elected terms of office commencing before the first Monday in December of 2030, the ~~The~~ terms of office of Supreme and Appellate Court Judges shall be ten years; of Circuit Judges, six years; and of Associate Judges, four years.

SECTION 12. ELECTION AND RETENTION

(a) Supreme, Appellate and Circuit Judges shall be nominated at primary elections or by petition. Judges shall be elected at general or judicial elections as the General Assembly shall provide by law. A person eligible for the office of Judge may cause his name to appear on the ballot as a candidate for Judge at the primary and at the general or judicial elections by submitting petitions. The General Assembly shall prescribe by law the requirements for petitions.

(b) The office of a Judge shall be vacant upon his death, resignation, retirement, removal, or upon the conclusion of his term without retention in office. Whenever an additional Appellate or Circuit Judge is authorized by law, the office shall be filled in the manner provided for filling a vacancy in that office.

(c) A vacancy occurring in the office of Supreme, Appellate or Circuit Judge shall be filled as the General Assembly may provide by law. In the absence of a law, vacancies may be filled by appointment by the Supreme Court. A person appointed to fill a vacancy 60 or more days prior to the next primary election to nominate Judges shall serve until the vacancy is filled for a term at the next general or judicial election. A person appointed to fill a vacancy less than 60 days prior to the next primary election to nominate Judges shall serve until the vacancy is filled at the second general or judicial election following such appointment.

(d) A Supreme Court Judge may serve only one elected term of office and may not seek retention to that office. An ~~Not less than six months before the general election preceding the expiration of his term of office, a Supreme,~~ Appellate or Circuit Judge who has been elected to ~~that~~ office may file in the office of the Secretary of State, not less than six months before the general election preceding the expiration of his term of office, a declaration of candidacy to succeed himself. The Secretary of State, not less than 63 days before the election, shall certify the Appellate or Circuit Judge's candidacy to the proper election officials. The names of Appellate or Circuit Judges seeking retention shall be submitted to the electors, separately and without party designation, on the sole question of whether each Appellate or Circuit Judge shall be retained in office for another term. The retention elections shall be conducted at general elections in the appropriate Judicial District, for ~~Supreme and~~ Appellate Judges, and in the circuit for Circuit Judges. The affirmative vote of three-fifths of the electors voting on the question shall elect the Appellate or Circuit Judge to the office for a term commencing on the first Monday in December following his election.

(e) A law reducing the number of Appellate or Circuit Judges shall be without prejudice to the right of the Judges affected to seek retention in office. A reduction shall become effective when a vacancy occurs in the affected unit.
