RESOLVED, That we invite communities across the United States of America to join in introspection and reflection on the beauty and richness of the diverse peoples of this great nation while reaching out with a spirit of amity toward one another on Race Amity Day.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 526

Offered by Representative Hoffman:

WHEREAS, For 250 years, the United States Postal Service (USPS) has bound this nation together; and

WHEREAS, The USPS delivers prescriptions to seniors and veterans, ballots to voters, and shipments for small businesses and provides reliable service to rural and remote areas, including many indigenous communities, where private companies often refuse service because it is not profitable; and

WHEREAS, Jojo Baby's contributions to the cultural landscape of Chicago, particularly within the Boystown and greater queer community, are invaluable, reflecting the diversity, strength, and pioneering spirit of the city; therefore, be it
