HOUSE RESOLUTION 615

Offered by Representative Meyers-Martin:
Mourns the death of Ernest Earl Gibson, Ph.D.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 616

Offered by Representative Welch:
Mourns the passing of Ernie Baumann of Maywood.

RECESS

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 620

Offered by Representative Buckner:

WHEREAS, Half a million Illinoisans depend on the Affordable Care Act's health insurance marketplace to provide healthcare for their families; and

WHEREAS, The affordable insurance options available on the Get Covered Illinois marketplace have offered peace of mind to small business owners, self-employed entrepreneurs, independent contractors, individuals balancing work and education, and people working part-time jobs; and

WHEREAS, Federal subsidies created through the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 kept health insurance accessible, even as household budgets were strained by many other rising costs; and

WHEREAS, As a key deadline to extend these cost-saving subsidies approaches, President Donald Trump stated: "I don't want to extend them for two years. I'd rather not extend them at all."; and

WHEREAS, Despite bipartisan support for these subsidies, President Trump and Republican leaders allowed them to expire on January 1, 2026; and

WHEREAS, Customers on Get Covered Illinois and other insurance marketplaces are now facing massive increases in their insurance costs, with many seeing premiums more than double and deductibles rising by as much as \$10,000 per person; and

WHEREAS, The Keiser Family Foundation calculates that Illinois will be among the states most grievously impacted by Trump's actions, taking an average of \$927 per year out of people's pockets; and

WHEREAS, Rural and downstate communities are even more negatively impacted, costing residents of Darrin LaHood's 16th Congressional District more than \$1,400, costing residents of Mary Miller's 15th Congressional District more than \$1,500, and costing residents of Mike Bost's 12th District more than \$2,000 every year; and

WHEREAS, Up to 140,000 Illinoisans will no longer be able to afford their health insurance because of Donald Trump's actions, on top of the hundreds of thousands who will lose access to Medicaid because of Trump's cuts; and

WHEREAS, The Trump tax bill will give more than \$100 billion in tax cuts to the ultra-wealthy and corporations, and working families have repeatedly been forced to pay the bill with cuts to care, cuts to programs, and higher insurance costs; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we call on Congress to end the Trump healthcare affordability crisis by immediately reinstating the 2022 healthcare subsidies.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 621

Offered by Representative Jiménez:

WHEREAS, On January 6, 2026, President Donald Trump's Department of Health and Human Services announced a unilateral suspension of \$10 billion in childcare, citing allegations of wrongdoing in Minnesota to justify a freeze on funds for Illinois and other states; and

WHEREAS, President Trump's latest funding freezes follow already familiar patterns, unilaterally halting congressionally mandated funding with no authorization, selectively attacking specific states for political retribution, targeting the most vulnerable people for cuts, and exacerbating the Trump affordability crisis; and

WHEREAS, President Trump's suspension of funding to Illinois, California, Colorado, and New York was not made based on specific allegations in those states but rather appear to have been targeting states with Democratic governors critical of Donald Trump himself; and

WHEREAS, President Trump's funding freeze threatens access to safe, affordable childcare for 150,000 children in Illinois and 100,000 households, while also jeopardizing the jobs of many childcare providers already living paycheck to paycheck; and

WHEREAS, President Trump is choosing to make working parents' greatest expense even less affordable; childcare is already one of the most daunting costs facing working families, with the average cost of daycare outpacing the average cost of a two-bedroom apartment in parts of Illinois and across the country; and

WHEREAS, President Trump's allies and apologists continue to say he should have the power to temporarily pause and review spending, statements that sound even more hollow and desperate now one year into his presidency, as federal spending levels are negotiated and signed into law by Trump himself; and

WHEREAS, This is yet another case of President Trump freezing, pausing, or impounding congressionally appropriated funds, substituting his ideology for the democratic process despite repeated court rulings stating such actions exceed the power of the presidency; and

WHEREAS, President Trump's repeated attempts to freeze funds for working people and modest-income families are juxtaposed glaringly against his ongoing efforts to cut taxes for billionaires, push a \$700 billion taxpayer-funded acquisition of Greenland, and pursue pathetic, self-aggrandizing projects such as building a ball room or renaming the Kennedy Center; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we condemn President Donald Trump's effort to freeze funds for affordable childcare; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we call for the immediate release of all congressionally appropriated childcare funds.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 622

Offered by Representative Andrade:

WHEREAS, On September 12, 2025, Silverio Villegas Gonzalez was shot and killed by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) operating in Franklin Park, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, On October 4, 2025, Marimar Martinez was shot five times while she was driving to church by Border Patrol agents operating in Chicago, Illinois; agents attempted to justify their shooting by labeling Martinez a "domestic terrorist" and claiming she was attempting to use her car to assault agents, charges which federal prosecutors found to be without merit; instead, body camera footage showed agents holding Martinez at gunpoint, stating "Do something", and calling her a profane name before opening fire; and

WHEREAS, On October 17, 2025, Philip Brown was shot and injured by a Homeland Security Investigations agent operating in Washington, D.C., claiming Brown was attempting to flee a traffic stop, a charge which a judge found to be without merit; and

WHEREAS, On October 21, 2025, Carlitos Richard Parias was shot and wounded by an ICE agent in Los Angeles, California; agents justified the shooting by claiming Parias was attempting to use his car to assault agents, a charge which a judge dismissed; and

WHEREAS, On October 29, 2025, Jose Garcia-Sorto was shot and injured by an ICE agent operating in Phoenix, Arizona, claiming Garcia-Sorto was attempting to flee a traffic stop; and

WHEREAS, On October 30, 2025, Carlos Jimenez was shot and injured by an ICE agent operating in Ontario, California, claiming that Jimenez was attempting to use his car to assault officers; and

WHEREAS, On November 13, 2025, Justin Bryant Nelson was shot at by a Homeland Security Investigations agent operating in Washington, D.C., claiming Nelson ran a red light; and

WHEREAS, On December 11, 2025, an unidentified man was shot and killed by a Border Patrol agent operating in Rio Grande City, Texas, claiming the man was wearing camouflage clothing and attempted to flee from agents; and

WHEREAS, On December 24, 2025, Tiago Alexandre Sousa-Martins and Solomon Antonio Serrano-Esquivel were shot at by an ICE agent operating in Glen Burnie, Maryland, claiming Sousa-Martins was attempting to use his car to assault officers; and

WHEREAS, On January 7, 2026, Renee Nicole Good was shot and killed by an ICE agent operating in St. Paul, Minnesota; while Department of Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem rushed to defame Good as a "domestic terrorist" and claimed she was attempting to assault agents with her car, footage from agents' cameras and from bystanders showed Good calmly telling agents, "That's fine, dude. I'm not mad at you", before trying to navigate away from the situation; footage then showed an agent shooting Good three times and calling her profane names; and

WHEREAS, On January 8, 2026, Luis David Nico Moncada and Yorlenys Betzabeth Zambrano-Contreras were shot by a Customs and Border Patrol agent operating in Portland, Oregon, claiming Moncada was attempting to use his car to assault officers; and

WHEREAS, On January 14, 2026, Julio Cesar Sosa-Celis was shot and injured by an ICE agent operating in Minneapolis, Minnesota, claiming Sosa-Celis was resisting arrest; and

WHEREAS, These victims of President Donald J. Trump and Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem's brutal and lawless raids have been lifelong citizens, new Americans living peacefully and legally under visas, and immigrants alike; none were given a chance to prove their citizenship, none were given a background check to prove they were law-abiding citizens, and none were offered due process before they were shot; and

WHEREAS, These alleged murders and shootings, many conducted in broad daylight and in full view of the public, are just the most visible abuses perpetrated as part of the Trump-Noem raids; the Project on Government Oversight found that within ICE detention centers, which the Trump Administration refuses to open to even the most basic oversight, 32 people died in ICE custody in 2025; and

WHEREAS, Every American citizen, every legal immigrant, every asylum seeker, and every undocumented person is entitled to the basic right of due process under the United States Constitution, and

every detention, every abuse, and every murder is the responsibility of President Donald Trump and Secretary Kristi Noem; and

WHEREAS, The willingness of Secretary Noem and the agents under her command to defame the victims and rationalize deadly force with a boilerplate narrative that has frequently failed to stand up to basic scrutiny is an alarm to every American; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we condemn the acts of excessive and deadly force deployed by federal agents of Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), Customs and Border Patrol, Homeland Security Investigations, and others operating under the direction of President Donald J. Trump and Department of Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we call for a fully independent investigation into all Department of Homeland Security-involved shootings, killings, and deaths in custody, and we call for the appointment of an independent counsel to prosecute agents, administrators, and political appointees found to have committed, directed, or covered up these acts of violence; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we call for the immediate resignation of Secretary Kristi Noem, and we call for her immediate impeachment if she refuses to resign.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 623

Offered by Representative Ortiz:

WHEREAS, President Donald J. Trump's unilaterally imposed tariffs have raised taxes on every American and have increased the price of practically every purchase families make every time they go to the store; and

WHEREAS, While President Trump continues to lie and claim that tariffs are a penalty on foreign nations, a comprehensive study of Trump's tariffs conducted by the Kiel Institute for the World Economy found that 96% of Trump's tariffs were paid by American consumers; and

WHEREAS, Data from the United States Department of the Treasury and Goldman Sachs found that President Trump's tariffs cost Americans \$159 billion in 2025, a tax of \$1,200 on every household; and

WHEREAS, These tariffs have driven the affordability crisis, hitting modest-income and middle-income families hardest; and

WHEREAS, President Trump's tariffs took money that working families should have been able to invest for retirement, use toward making a down payment on a home, or utilize in other ways to build long-term economic security, thereby robbing families not only in the short term but in the long term as well; and

WHEREAS, President Trump's flimsy reliance on emergency powers to justify his tax increases have been repeatedly rejected by courts; and

WHEREAS, President Trump's tariffs show his self-proclaimed "America First" agenda to be in reality a "Tax America First" agenda; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we call upon President Donald J. Trump to immediately suspend his tariff scheme and halt all efforts to defend his unilateral tax increases in court; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we call upon the United States Department of the Treasury to immediately issue \$2,000 payments to every American household with an annual income below \$250,000 as a refund of families' lost wages and savings, and as an apology for Donald Trump's illegal tax increases.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 624

Offered by Representative Hernandez, Norma:

WHEREAS, In the first weeks of 2026, President Donald J. Trump has declared himself "acting president of Venezuela", threatened unprovoked military action in Cuba and Iran, and suggested that his failure to earn a Nobel Peace Prize frees him to forcefully pursue "complete and total control" of the peaceful and autonomous territory of Greenland; and

WHEREAS, At no point has President Trump sought or been granted authorization by the United States Congress for military actions; and

WHEREAS, While President Trump sold himself as a "peace president" who would keep America out of unnecessary foreign conflicts in order to provide for people in need domestically, the reality of his administration has been marked by needless provocation, alienation of our allies, and severe cuts to the social safety net at home; and

WHEREAS, The cost of President Trump's military operations in Venezuela could fund SNAP benefits for more than 310,000 Americans; and

WHEREAS, The amount of money President Trump has publicly committed to obtaining "complete and total control" over Greenland would cover the cost of the Affordable Care Act subsidies he let expire and the cost of the state childcare funding he froze, and there would still be more than \$550 billion left over; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we reject President Donald J. Trump's efforts to acquire territories and titles overseas, while leaving working families at home to pay the bill; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we call upon the United States Congress to intervene and provide the constitutional oversight necessary to hold President Trump accountable to the American people.

HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 617

Offered by Representative LaPointe:

WHEREAS, Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists (CRNAs), also known as nurse anesthesiologists or nurse anesthetists, are advanced practice registered nurses who are among the nation's most trusted professions, having provided anesthesia care to patients in the United States for more than 150 years; and

WHEREAS, CRNAs became the first nursing specialty to be accorded direct reimbursement rights by Medicare due to legislation passed by Congress in 1986; and

WHEREAS, CRNAs are the primary anesthesia providers in rural and underserved communities and continue to be the primary providers of anesthesia care to U.S. military personnel; and

WHEREAS, CRNAs practice in every setting in which anesthesia is delivered, including traditional hospital surgical suites, obstetrical delivery rooms, critical access hospitals, ambulatory surgical centers, and the offices of dentists, podiatrists, ophthalmologists, and pain management specialists; and

WHEREAS, CRNAs are qualified to make independent judgments regarding all aspects of anesthesia care based on their education, training, board certification, and licensure; and

WHEREAS, CRNAs are trusted anesthesia experts, caring for patients safely and compassionately, delivering specialized, cost-effective care to all patients, from newborns to seniors, for every type of procedure in all types of facilities; and

WHEREAS, CRNAs' experience in critical care nursing, in addition to anesthesia care, provides the training and education to address unique healthcare challenges of some of our sickest patients, including veterans; and

WHEREAS, National CRNA Week will be held from January 18 through January 24, 2026; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare the week of January 18 through January 24, 2026 as CRNA Week in the State of Illinois to recognize the importance of Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists (CRNAs) and their role in providing high-quality care to the public.
