WHEREAS, SB3572 seeks to subject women seeking reproductive healthcare and their doctors to first degree murder charges; and

WHEREAS, SB3572 contains no exceptions for rape or incest, and would subject a survivor to harsher criminal penalties than the rapist; and

WHEREAS, SB3572 contains no exception for in vitro fertilization (IVF), subjecting doctors providing assisted reproductive technology to criminal charges; and

WHEREAS, In 2016, Donald Trump said that there must be "some form of punishment" for women seeking an abortion; and

WHEREAS, Anti-choice politicians across the country rushed to assure people that they would never support laws that punish women; and

WHEREAS, After the United States Supreme Court's *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization* decision, women in many states found that their access to healthcare was suddenly governed by laws that predate women's suffrage and contained no exceptions for rape and incest; and

WHEREAS, Anti-choice politicians across the country rushed to assure people that they would never deny care to survivors of rape and incest; and

WHEREAS, In 2024, the Alabama Supreme Court used language mirroring SB3572 to bar access to IVF in that state; and

WHEREAS, Anti-choice politicians across the country rushed to assure people that they would never support laws that deny access to IVF; and

WHEREAS, Anti-choice politicians in Illinois continue to push legislation like SB3572 that would punish women for accessing reproductive healthcare, would force survivors of rape and incest to carry their abuser's child to term, and would bar access to IVF; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we oppose Illinois Senate Bill 3572 (SB3572); and be it further

RESOLVED, That we oppose any effort to punish women for accessing reproductive healthcare; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we oppose efforts to subject survivors of rape and incest to more severe punishments than a rapist; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we oppose efforts to restrict access to in vitro fertilization (IVF) and other forms of assisted reproductive technology.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 696

Offered by Representative Du Buclet:

WHEREAS, February 2026 marks the 100th year that Americans have set aside time in February to honor Black history; and

WHEREAS, Rather than acknowledging the challenges and celebrating the accomplishments that define Black history in America, President Donald J. Trump has disgracefully chosen this time of year to advance an agenda that embraces a return to the ugliest moments of our past; and

WHEREAS, Late in the evening on February 5, 2026, President Trump's personal social media account shared an AI-generated video using blatantly racist caricatures of former President Barack Obama and First Lady Michelle Obama; and

WHEREAS, President Trump's post was widely condemned, with Tim Scott, the only Black Republican in the Senate, calling it "the most racist thing I've seen out of this White House"; and

WHEREAS, President Trump sent his spokesperson to lecture Black Americans on why the post rooted in imagery that is universally accepted as racist was actually some kind of joke; and

WHEREAS, President Trump finally deleted the post, while refusing to apologize; and

WHEREAS, President Trump's bigoted agenda has reached far beyond his manufactured social media echo chamber; students at Florida A&M University were told that President Trump's prohibition on any effort to promote "diversity, equity, and inclusion" meant that Black History Month recognitions could not include the word "Black"; and

WHEREAS, This month, the Trump administration also announced that it will use taxpayer funds to fight in court for the removal of recognizing the enslaved people held in the first presidential mansion in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, Further, the Trump administration has replaced pamphlets at the national landmark honoring slain civil rights leader Medgar Evers with new ones that no longer refer to the Ku Klux Klan member who murdered Evers as a racist; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we condemn President Donald J. Trump's racist social media post and his attempts to erase history; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we will continue to honor the 100th recognition of Black History Month in the State of Illinois by committing to learn from history rather than hiding from it.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 697

Offered by Representative Cassidy:

WHEREAS, Accountability regarding the crimes of convicted sexual predator Jeffrey Epstein and his alleged accomplices is a matter of justice for survivors that transcends partisan politics; and

WHEREAS, The bipartisan Epstein Files Transparency Act requires the release of all records in possession of the Department of Justice, including records of Epstein's correspondence and flight logs; and

WHEREAS, The Act requires the Department of Justice to shield the identities of survivors and also explicitly prohibits documents from being withheld or redacted based on political considerations or to shield the identity of Epstein's companions; and

WHEREAS, Despite this, multiple reports indicate that the Department of Justice illegally redacted and withheld documents related to allegations against President Donald Trump, including more than 50 pages of FBI interviews and notes from conversations with a woman who accused President Trump of abuse when she was a minor; and

WHEREAS, The redacted documents included identifying information and images of approximately 100 of Epstein's estimated 1,000 victims, retraumatizing survivors and subjecting them to public scrutiny and harassment; and

WHEREAS, Documents detailing allegations against President Trump have been removed from the Justice Department's public database after their initial disclosure; and

WHEREAS, This continues President Trump's pattern of deceit and obfuscation related to Epstein; he and Vice President JD Vance denied the existence of a birthday card sent by the President to Epstein before the card became public; and

WHEREAS, The identities of other alleged abusers are also being improperly shielded by President Trump's Justice Department while the identities of survivors have been left unredacted; an email to Epstein stating "Thank you for a fun night...Your littlest girl was a little naughty" was redacted to conceal the identity of the writer; and

WHEREAS, In February 2026, President Trump's Justice Department stated its investigation into the Epstein files was over, that no client list existed, and that no additional charges would be forthcoming; and

WHEREAS, The illegal redactions and the Trump Administration's resistance to transparency, along with the thousands of references to President Trump and other politically connected individuals named in the files, create the appearance of impropriety; and

WHEREAS, During a hearing of the House Judiciary Committee, Attorney General Bondi was found to have a "burn book" of details proving that members of Congress have been surveilled by the Justice Department during their legally guaranteed access to the unredacted files under their oversight authority; Representative Jamie Raskin reported that he found one million mentions of President Trump in the files in his review; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we call for the release of all files related to the crimes of Jeffrey Epstein and his alleged accomplices with redactions limited solely to shielding the identities of survivors as outlined in the Epstein Transparency Act; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we call for the appointment of a special prosecutor independent of the Trump Administration's influence to review prosecution decisions stemming from the Epstein investigation to investigate whether the Trump Administration illegally redacted or withheld documents to shield individuals for political purposes.
