#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 693

Offered by Representative Cochran:

WHEREAS, On February 24, 2022, the Russian Federation launched a full-scale, unprovoked invasion of Ukraine, a sovereign and independent nation recognized by the international community; and

WHEREAS, Russian territorial claims over the Ukrainian territories of Luhansk, Donetsk, Zaporizhzhia, and Crimea are meritless and pretextual; and

WHEREAS, In the years since the invasion began, Russian military forces have continued their unlawful presence within the internationally recognized borders of Ukraine, in violation of international law and the principles of national sovereignty and territorial integrity; and

WHEREAS, Credible reports from international organizations, journalists, and human rights monitors have documented widespread atrocities committed by Russian forces against Ukrainian civilians; and

WHEREAS, Evidence has emerged of massacres and deliberate attacks against civilians in cities and towns, including Bucha, Irpin, Mariupol, and Iziium, among others, resulting in the deaths of thousands of innocent men, women, and children; and

WHEREAS, Russian forces have been credibly accused of forcibly deporting and transferring Ukrainian children from occupied territories into the Russian Federation or Russian-controlled areas, separating them from their families and communities in violation of international humanitarian law; and

WHEREAS, These actions have caused immense human suffering, displaced millions of Ukrainians, destabilized the region, and undermined the international rules-based order; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois is home to a vibrant Ukrainian-American community that has contributed greatly to the cultural, economic, and civic life of our State; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we condemn the continued unlawful invasion and military occupation of Ukraine by the Russian Federation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we condemn the documented massacres and atrocities committed in Bucha, Irpin, Mariupol, Iziium, and other Ukrainian communities; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we condemn the forced deportation and kidnapping of Ukrainian children and call for their immediate return to their families and to Ukraine; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we call upon the Russian Federation to immediately cease all violent military action against the people of Ukraine and to withdraw its forces from Ukrainian territory; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we reaffirm our support for human rights, democracy, and the sovereignty of nations; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Governor of Illinois, all members of the Illinois Congressional Delegation, and the Ambassador of Ukraine to the United States.
