And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the negative by the following vote:

52, Yeas; 52, Nays; 5, Answering Present.

(ROLL CALL 2)

This bill, having failed to receive the votes of a constitutional majority of the Members elected, was declared lost.

HOUSE BILL 1489. Having been read by title a third time on April 3, 2003, and further consideration postponed, the same was again taken up.

Representative Novak moved the passage of HOUSE BILL 1489.

And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the affirmative by the following vote:

63, Yeas; 43, Nays; 3, Answering Present.

(ROLL CALL 3)

HOUSE BILL 198. Having been read by title a third time on February 21, 2003, and further consideration postponed, the same was again taken up.

Representative Monique Davis moved the passage of HOUSE BILL 198.

And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the affirmative by the following vote:

61, Yeas; 42, Nays; 6, Answering Present.
