Speaker Welch: "Welcome to Springfield. Representative Gong-Gershowitz, for what reason you seek recognition?"

Gong-Gershowitz: "Point of personal privilege, Mr. Speaker."

Speaker Welch: "Please state your point."

Gong-Gershowitz: "Thank you. So, we talk a lot in the Asian American Caucus about breaking the model minority myth, hardworking, reliable, overachiever. So, Tiffany Moy, you're going to have to work a little harder at breaking that... that stereotype. Clerk Hollman: "Introduction of Resolutions. House Resolution 4, offered by Representative Meier; House Resolution 5, offered by Representative Meier; House Resolution 6, offered by Representative Cabello; House Resolution 7, offered by Representative Cabello; House Resolution 9, offered by... offered by Representative Sheehan; House Resolution 12, offered by Representative West; House Resolution 13, offered by Representative West; House Resolution 15, offered by... offered by Representative Gabel; and House Joint Resolution #1, offered by Representative Hoffman, are referred to the Rules Committee."

Speaker Welch: "Leader Keicher is recognized."

Keicher: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. The Republicans would request an immediate caucus in Room 118, please."

Speaker Welch: "Republicans have requested a caucus, and they will caucus in Room 118. Democrats will remain on the floor. Please don't go far. The House will stand in recess until the call of the Chair. Mr. Clerk, Rules Report."

Clerk Hollman: "Rule Report. Representative Gabel, Chairperson... Chairperson for the Committee on Rules reports the following committee action taken on January 9, 2025: recommends be adopted, referred to the Order of Resolutions is House Resolution 15."

Speaker Welch: "Under House Calendar, Supplemental Calendar #1, House Resolution 15. Leader Gabel is recognized to present a resolution."

Gabel: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'm pleased to present House Resolution 15, which establishes our House Rules for the 104th General Assembly. These rules mirror the rules we have

operated under during the 103rd General Assembly with three small updates. We are simply updating the name of the Appropriations-Public.. Public Safety Committee to reflect that the committee has always overseen transportation infrastructure. We are creating a new Appropriations-Pensions Committee to facilitate ongoing discussion on the retirement security of our public employees. And we creating a mechanism to allow House Members to remove or change the House sponsorship of a bill in the Senate. I ask for an 'aye' vote."

Speaker Welch: "Leader Windhorst."

Windhorst: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Will the Sponsor yield?"

Speaker Welch: "Sponsor yields."

Windhorst: "Thank you. Leader Gabel, appreciate you explaining those changes. I don't know if you are aware, but the House Republican Caucus had formed a working group of.. of four Members to look at possible changes to the House Rules. And from that working group, we had.. have proposed 11 resolutions. Those are House Resolutions 16 through 26 that detail changes to the rules that we believe are appropriate. Our working group did the work, and we have put forward these.. these changes. So, I would like to hit a couple of those for you and to ask if there was any consideration given to maybe including these changes in the rules. The first is House Resolution 16. It deals with a loophole that currently exists in the rules that allows a substantive resolution to evade the normal requirement for publication on the agenda of pending items, the daily calendar, particularly things like the Adjournment Resolution being included. Was there any

consideration given to that item being included in the rule change?"

Gabel: "So, we just received these this morning. I appreciate that... that your workgroup took time to review the rules. And we'll be looking at those 11 recommendations that you have."

Windhorst: "We put forward another resolution, House Resolution 18, that would provide for public disclosure of the prefiling for a Senate Bill sponsorship. The current practice is that the Members, we don't know when a bill comes over from the Senate who will be the House sponsor. It's not public. And not only do we not know, the public doesn't know. So, this is a transparency item that would inform our body, as well as the public, as to who is, in our body, is taking on Senate Bills."

Gabel: "Yeah. I think..."

Windhorst: "Was that considered when you proposed changes to these rules?"

Gabel: "So, as... as I said, we just saw these. We'll be looking at them. I... I think that's an interesting one to look at."

Windhorst: "And then there is House Resolution 22 and 25. Both of these deal with floor debate. These would require that there be a record vote when we close floor debate, not to allow just a simple motion and a voice vote. And it would also require a supermajority vote when we close debate. This is to protect our Members, that each of us has the ability to speak on a bill and wouldn't be cut off without a supermajority of our body agreeing to it. Would that be something you'd be willing to consider going forward?"

Gabel: "Yeah... yes. We'll be looking at all... all of these recommendations that you've made."

Windhorst: "And one thing I would like to highlight as we close this spring session, we had a situation where we waived the rules. I think we... those of us that were in the body at that time remember that, well, I would say evening, but it was early morning, where we suspended the rules and allowed for a third vote on a bill which, typically... well, it's not typical. It's forbidden by the rules. Is there any consideration given to increasing the vote threshold for suspension of the rules from a simple 60 votes to a supermajority where the rules only allow for a simple majority?"

Gabel: "Well, I... I think we like the rules we have. I mean, every governing body has a mechanism for suspending rules when that is deemed necessary to complete the people's business. I... you know, I... I do recall that Members on that side of the aisle recently pointing out that the cost to taxpayers when the House is in session is... should be considered. So, in situations like the one you're referring to, I would remind you that delay tactics have real costs for the people that we serve."

Windhorst: "Well, I think one person's delay tactics is another person's transparency and accountability. And when you have body that can override the rules with a simple majority vote, that does create problems. I do appreciate your willingness to consider our resolutions as we put them forward. And my suggestion today would be... you know, we just were sworn in yesterday. Why don't we pull this from the record, take the

next two weeks, consider the rule changes that we put forward, and then the... when we come back the first day after that two-week break, let's vote on the rules at that point after there's been sufficient deliberation over the proposed changes that we put forward?"

Gabel: "So, you know, I... I agree that... although Section 3 of the General Assembly Operations Act, we... under that section, we utilized the rules from the 103rd GA until we adopted our new ones, but we have not formed committees yet. So, we want to get ready and start doing the business of the 104th GA, and to do that, we need to set committees, and the committees are set in this... in this resolution."

Windhorst: "Well, I appreciate the committees being... being said, but it has been the practice in the last several General Assemblies to wait those two weeks after inauguration to pass the rules, basically, two weeks after inauguration. I think, given the fact you're willing to consider these resolutions, that will be appropriate in this situation."

Gabel: "You know, we have a lot of work to do. We want to get these committees set."

Windhorst: "Mr. Speaker, to the resolution. I think the ideas, you're going to hear more of them from not just me, but from other Members. The ideas that are being put forward are reasonable. They're designed to protect the rights of each individual Member, as well as to make our body more transparent and accountable to the public. And given the fact that these aren't being rejected out of hand, I think it would be appropriate for us to pull these... this resolution today,

come back in two weeks, have a deliberation on these proposals, and then have a vote at that time. Thank you."

Speaker Welch: "Representative Friess is recognized for further discussion."

Friess: "Thank you, Speaker. Will the sponsor yield?"

Speaker Welch: "Sponsor yields."

Friess: "Were you aware or did you receive a letter that Representative Windhorst referenced from our working group? Were you aware that we offered to work with you guys?"

Gabel: "Yes."

Friess: "Okay. And was that given any consideration?"

Gabel: "Yes."

Friess: "And why were we not invited?"

Gabel: "We... we were... we will be considering the changes that you've requested."

Friess: "Okay. Well, it would have been nice to have been invited and to... to actually work with this collaboratively before this was presented. To the resolution. We... we also have another one, it's HR26. And everybody in this body, they have goals that they want to reach. They want to represent their constituents. They want to represent the state. They want to do what's best for the State of Illinois. And we put forth bills that we think will do that. And HR26, what it does is it allows every Member to bring a bill in committee. And I think that would be very beneficial, not only for our state, but for this body. There's no reason why we should be afraid to debate any bill in committee. And... and I would appreciate if you would give that some consideration. Thank you."

Speaker Welch: "Representative Halbrook is recognized for further discussion."

Halbrook: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. To the resolution. I want to speak briefly here about HR24 that amends House Rule 39 that simply provides that within 24 hours of the adjournment of a committee or a task force meeting that the Clerk shall make accessible on the General Assembly's website any audio recording of that meeting that was required underneath the House Rules. Currently, in the rules, there are four different rules that cover and govern these recordings and the distributions of those. But more specifically, the reason why this is a good idea and.. and I would trust that this body would consider, is the enhancement of the public's accessibility to the recordings. This amendment ensures that the general public has timely access to the audio recordings, the different committee and task force meetings. This is just providing greater transparency to the legislative process. I think it also improves the transparency of this.. of our government by making these recordings available within 24 hours. It just holds all of us more accountable to the discussions, the deliberations, the decisions we make. I think it also encourages the community, or the civic engagement or involvement, to easy and prompt access to these recordings, allows our citizens to stay informed, engage more effectively in this legislative process. I think this encourages a lot of public participation. I think timely information dissemination is extremely important to our constituents, any other interested parties across this great state that might have an interest in these things. This allows

them time to react and respond to any of the developments of these meetings. I think, again, increased accountability, this... this goes a long way in doing that. I think also it... it helps our partners that are journalists, those in research that report on these things that use them for research. Anything that needs to be analyzed, this is... provides a complete and accurate record for more robust and more informed reporting. Again, the amendment sets forth a higher standard for accessibility and openness, reinforcing the commitment to transparency in our governmental... governmental operations. And, again, it's... it goes a long ways in... in the facilitation of record keeping. The prompt posting of these recordings helps maintain an accurate official record contributing to the achievements of the... the archiving, the achievements of the legislative history for future reference and analysis. Ladies and gentlemen, these points highlight the positive impact of this amendment on transparency, on accountability, and public engagement in this legislative process. Mr. Speaker and ladies and gentlemen of the House, I humbly request that we take the action that Leader Windhorst has offered up on this and other amendments that we've heard so far and that we'll hear yet the rest of the afternoon and to consider these amendments and to come back in two weeks and add these to the rules. I think it would just go a long way into today's world to restore trust in this body. Thank you."

Speaker Welch: "Thank you, Representative. For further discussion on the resolution, Representative Reick is recognized."

Reick: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Will the Sponsor yield?"

Reick: "Representative, just one question. With regard to the budget, with regard to the discussion on the budget, what are... what is the current rule with regard to issuing the... the budget and making it available for public examination before we vote on it? Is there... is there a current rule for that?"

Gabel: "It is a standard bill, and it needs to be read three times on three separate occasions."

Reick: "That being the case, we've offered up Rep... Resolution #19, which requires a 24-hour delay between the time of Third Reading and voting on that so that what we can do is give the public the time to fully inquire as to what the actual issues are in each appropriation bill that comes out of each appropriation committee. The point is, is that all too often, even we don't see those... the budget bill until well within that 24-hour period before we're obliged to vote on it. All the appropriations bills are folded into a single omnibus budget bill that contains neither flesh nor fowl, I would say. Because there are many things in it that those of us on the other side of the aisle may be willing to vote for if... are... you know, are passionate about if it was contained in separate appropriation bill for a particular appropriation committee, rather than a... an omnibus budget bill that is very difficult for anyone over here to, not only understand, but to vote on in good conscience without full knowledge of what's going on. I would urge you to consider House Resolution 19 to put us back into a situation where instead of an omnibus budget bill that we vote on at o'dark 30 on the last day of session, 20 minutes after we go through Second Reading, that we'll... we amend the rules further to allow for separate voting

on separate appropriation bills with a 24-hour notice that the public then can go through each one and... and thus inform us as to their feelings. We... we're responsible to our constituents. We're responsible to the people who send us here. And if they have the opportunity to tell us that I object to this or I support that, I think that would give us a much better creditability in the eyes of the public as to what we... what we do end up spending of the people's money. So, I would... Mr. Speaker, I would also echo Representative... our... our floor leader's comment that I don't see the rush for this. I don't see the need for us to amend... or to enact the rules as have been... as has been introduced until we have a chance to discuss the amendments that we're filing and... and proposing today. We have time. We have two weeks. Let's take the time. Let's talk about this stuff. Bring both sides to the party. Bring both sides to the discussion and let us have rules that represent and do the work that both sides want to get done. Thank you very much."

Speaker Welch: "Thank you, Representative. For further discussion, Representative Coffey is recognized."

Coffey: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. To the Resolution. I'm particularly interested in Resolution 23, which provides Member access to the House chamber during Clerk Office business hours. As the local Representative, being denied access from time to time, it can be cumbersome. This is our home office, and many of us have people stop by the Capitol all... all of the time and may not be able to make appointments further in advance. So, it would be nice if the Members could have access because we're very much happy to make

appointments, but, you know, as you know, the trains don't always run on time here for us, and it also doesn't run on time for a lot of our constituents that stop by. So, I would hope that you would consider House Resolution 23 in order to give us more access to this chamber. I... I would extend the courtesy to all of you that don't live here, you know, in the summertime where you might have people coming down to this chamber. I'm more than willing to, you know, stop by so that there is a Member of this body that will show them around. So, I would just ask that we could get a little more access to the House floor. Thank you very much."

Speaker Welch: "Thank you, Representative. For further discussion, Representative Weber is recognized."

Weber: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. To the bill. Today, I'd like to discuss a little bit on... one of our recommendations that came out of work group was HR20. I want to highlight the importance of filing witness slips, a crucial step in our democratic process. Witness slips are a powerful tool for civic engagement and allows those people who represent... who we represent to voice support or opposition to proposed legislation. Each slip represents a person's voice, a perspective, and a reminder that we are accountable to them. Too many times do we see the language in a bill that has thousands, if not tens of thousands, of witness slips, that language copy and pasted into another bill. Not just on our side, on your side. It affects all of us. That is the voice of our constituents, and HR20 would say that those witness slips would follow that language, rather than be... be erased just by the change of a bill number. I urge us all to think

about these recommendations. I think they're recommendations that we can all support, and please reconsider and add these into our rules. Thank you."

Speaker Welch: "Thank you, Representative. For further discussion, Representative Davidsmeyer is recognized."

Davidsmeyer: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Will the sponsor yield?"

Speaker Welch: "Sponsor yields."

Davidsmeyer: "Leader Gabel, were... were you aware of the letter sent back in December offering our working group to work with yours on the... the rules that we're trying to pass today?"

Gabel: "Yes, I did see it."

Davidsmeyer: "Okay. And in an effort to work together as... as one body, I think it would have been a great step, great first step for us to step up and work together on something as simple as the rules. Now, we understand we are in the minority, there are certain things that you are unwilling to change. The majority of our recommendations are not earth-shattering. They would not take the power out of the hands of the Speaker, but... but they are ideas that allow democracy to just work a little bit better. I want to reiterate what our... the local Representative here discussed. For those of us who are not local, when we're in session, access to the House floor, for those of you don't know, is denied prior to two hours before session and after two hours after session. That can often be difficult for those of us who have come from out of town, where our laptops are here on the floor, this is our working laptop for many of us. We have stuff that we keep in our desks that we may need access to. And... and I know that we have keycards, we have safety access to this floor, and we

can easily limit access to the floor. So, I... I'd like to reiterate what the local Springfield Representative had mentioned earlier. I'd... I'd also like to thank you, as well as the Speaker, for listening to ideas that we came up with in the previous General Assembly. For instance, something that was not removed from the rules, but it was not used last General Assembly, and I want to say thank you, the consent agenda. Many of us spent the last few waning minutes before the consent agenda passed in the 102nd General Assembly going through sometimes 30, 40, 50 bills to see if we truly agree with those. And we had a couple of options. If we put a 'no' vote in committee on a bill that could've been perfectly fine, it would not be on the consent agenda. Or we can individually all go through every one of those bills to make sure that they are truly agreed. It was left in the rules that there's a maximum of 80 bills. Could you imagine going through 80 bills in an hour, two hours? It would be very difficult. So, I want to thank you for not using that last General Assembly, but I think there is a place for the consent agenda. And I would like to offer House Resolution 21, which would limit that, instead of 80 bills, which is very onerous, possibility. And... and you didn't... I don't believe we ever had one with 80, but there... there were a number of them that had a lot of bills on a consent agenda. If we could put it in the rules that we limit that to 25 bills, it's much easier for us to go through and it eliminates the need for us to have a Member in committee vote 'no' on a bill that could be perfectly fine. So, I... I do appreciate this discussion. I really do. I hope we do get an opportunity to truly work together for the

And I wish that we could've done this before trying to pass this resolution, but I truly hope that this discussion can continue and that we can amend the rules to include some of these great ideas that many of our Members have... have brought forward. So, thank you again, Leader Gabel, and thank you again, Mr. Speaker."

Speaker Welch: "Thank you, Representative. For further discussion, Representative Ugaste is recognized."

Ugaste: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Will the sponsor yield?"

Speaker Welch: "Sponsor yields."

Ugaste: "Thank you. Afternoon, Leader Gabel."

Gabel: "Afternoon."

Ugaste: "You and I, in the last General Assembly, worked together on... on a bill, and even though we hadn't and don't always agree on everything that comes through here, we found that we can work together and... and both support a bill once we talk and... and reach an agreement. Is... is that correct?"

Gabel: "Yes."

Ugaste: "Okay. So, would you agree working in a bipartisan manner is important?"

Gabel: "Sometimes."

Ugaste: "Okay. Not always, but at least sometimes, correct?"

Gabel: "Correct."

Ugaste: "Good policy's good policy whether everyone's willing to work together on it or not, correct?"

Gabel: "Yes."

Ugaste: "Okay. So, and I believe you've heard a number of our Members speak today and talk about wanting to make certain all their constituents feel represented. Do you believe it's

important that all citizens of Illinois feel they have a voice here in this chamber?"

Gabel: "I believe that they all elect their Representatives and that they all have a voice in this chamber currently."

Ugaste: "Okay. Do you believe if a Representative is not allowed to run a bill during a session that those constituents are actually being represented?"

Gabel: "So, every Member is allowed to speak their minds, to vote their conscience, but, you know, we are not going to be hearing bills that are not... that do not support the people of this state."

Ugaste: "Well, who's making that determination that what bills represent the people of the state if those bills are never being allowed to be called in committee?"

Gabel: "The majority... the majority of the House. The elected majority of the House."

Ugaste: "Okay. Okay. To the resolution. I am... I'm going to ask that you withdraw the resolution and, again, allow time to consider all the amendments we've proposed for the reasons that, you know, you've heard outlined today because passing this today isn't necessary. This is the first time I've been in the General Assembly that I believe we have passed the rules the day after inauguration. It's always come a couple weeks later. So, there is a way to function and move forward and get the work done without it. So, I would ask that you reconsider on House Resolution 18, which... I'm sorry, House Resolution 20, which we filed. It calls for use of the conference committee, which is something Representative Weber was speaking to when he was talking about witness slips.

Because right now, if people are... the citizens of Illinois are signing onto bills to let us know how they feel, and we aren't using the conference committee process and possibly with a few tweaks, even improving a little bit, that you would find in House Resolution 20, those voices quickly disappear as soon as that bill is stuffed into another number because they no longer exist. I would also ask that since we all believe working in a bipartisan manner, I believe, is important, not on everything, but on a lot of things, and since both the Speaker spoke about it and Representative McCombie has spoken about... or, Leader McCombie has spoken about it, that if a bill has five Members from each side of the aisle willing to be cosponsors that that bill should be allowed to be called in committee, whether or not it's determine by the majority party that it should be heard or not. Because that is showing a broad range of support throughout the State of Illinois to have that bill heard. And if we are truly here, truly here to do the people's business, and I believe that's what we all came here for, each and every one of us, and each and every one of us wants to do, then that should be a change we make to these rules. And I also... and that's contained in our House Resolution 17. And within House Resolution 26, it provides that each Member should be allowed to identify one bill they get to call before committee for a hearing and have it voted on. And I can't emphasize this stronger because while... this may be one of the areas we disagree on, leader. You believe that merely allowing a Representative to come here and speak about bills everyone else is passing is actually allowing their constituents to be

represented. I will tell you that a good number of the 108,000 people I represent feel like they weren't represented last time. Because in the 103rd General Assembly, despite the fact that I filed 40 or so bills, I was allowed to call absolutely zero for a committee hearing. Now, maybe I believe a little bit more in myself than everyone else and the supermajority does, maybe I think I'm a little more reasonable than everybody there does, but it's not based on the conversations I've had with you. So, I don't understand why I can't get a bill called that represents the 108,000 people that make up my district, yet others have multiple bills called, five, six, seven, 10. I can't even count some of them. So, I think these are important changes that we need to have so that everyone in this state is actually represented. And if my ideas are bad, that's fine, vote 'em down. At least give them a chance to be heard, a chance to be debated. Who knows, maybe minds would.. will be changed if we actually take time to discuss them. And not just mine, but that goes for everyone else. Everyone should have a right to present bills and have their ideas heard. So, I ask again, you reconsider presenting this today, withdraw it, and let's vote on it in two weeks after you've had a chance to consider our resolutions. Thank you."

Speaker Welch: "Thank you, Representative. For further discussion, Representative Spain is recognized."

Spain: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Will the sponsor yield?"

Speaker Welch: "Sponsor yields."

Spain: "Thank you. Leader Gabel, thank you for bringing forward House Resolution 15. Prior to our arrival here on the floor,

House Resolution 15 emerged through the Rules Committee, of which you and I are both a Member. At least were in the 103rd General Assembly and will see if we continue to both be included in that process. But it is the Rules Committee that becomes the clearing house for legislation for our chamber. Is that correct?"

Gabel: "Correct."

Spain: "And over the course of an entire General Assembly of the several thousands of bills and resolutions that are filed, all are sent to the Rules Committee, but only some, a small select number of those thousands, emerge from the Rules Committee. What is the process for determining which bills emerge through the Rules Committee?"

Gabel: "The intent of the Rules Committee is to look at and process all legislation that comes through it. There is a process in our rules for requesting a legislative measure out of rules. Rule 18(g) requires any bill pending before the Rules Committee to be immediately discharged, one, if the principal sponsor files a motion that is signed by three-fifths of the Members of both the majority and minority caucuses, and each is a sponsor of the underlined bill; and, two, by unanimous consent of the House."

Spain: "That provision within the Rules Committee was not exercised during the 103rd General Assembly that I'm aware of, and that's the only time I've been a participant in the Rules Committee. But understanding that exception that exists, what is the regular course of business, though? There will be moments that, you know, a month or two from now, Leader Gabel, where I'll feel quite bad for you as you're

reading through hundreds and hundreds of bills that will now be referred to substantive committees. Those bills didn't receive a three-fifth majority from both caucuses. How does the regular order of bills emerging from the Rules Committee work?"

Gabel: "You know, the majority party reviews all the bills, as I'm sure the minority party does as well."

Spain: "And in that bill review exercise, what are the considerations and determinants for what bills would be approved to move forward from the Rules Committee?"

Gabel: "You know, there are various considerations."

Spain: "What are a few of them?"

Gabel: "You know, I... I think mostly the review is if they create a positive change for the people of Illinois."

Spain: "And I... I'm asking these questions sincerely, Leader Gabel, because I think many of us want to better understand what... what happens behind that curtain in bill review. It's the essential process that takes place outside of the public eye that determines what legislation can be then considered publicly. And one of the changes over the last General Assembly appears to be certain thresholds of support that would determine when bills could receive additional consideration. Is there a... a vote threshold that is required before the Speaker's bill review panel would move forward with allowing public consideration of a measure?"

Gabel: "No."

Spain: "So, if a Member wishes to have their bill called, are they able to do so?"

Gabel: "They're able to make a request..."

Spain: "And that request will be..."

Gabel: "...for which committee they want the bill to go to."

Spain: "But we don't... and... on the Rules Committee, then receive that request and then form an agreeable assignment to accommodate that number."

Gabel: "It's a recommendation to the Rules Committee, and the Rules Committee generally approves them."

Spain: "This week has been a momentous week, both here in Springfield, but also in the City of Chicago, as we have watched the testimony of Speaker Madigan in federal court. And the subject of the House Rules Committee, of which these rules, I... I must say, are essentially the same rules that Speaker Madigan had in place. And I'm sure you'll also say that Lee Daniels had rules in place in 1994 for a small period of time, and that's... that's true as well. But these were Speaker Madigan's rules that existed for decades."

Gabel: "These are not... these are not the same as Speaker Madigan's rules. And I didn't serve on Speaker Madigan's Rules Committee."

Spain: "Did you have an understanding, as the Speaker testified in court this week, Speaker Madigan, that the general rule was that if a sponsor wanted to call a bill, we would call it?"

Gabel: "I'm sorry, can you repeat that?"

Spain: "Did you have an understanding, under Speaker Madigan, as he testified this week in federal court, that his general rule was if a bill sponsor wanted to call the bill, we would call it?"

Gabel: "No. I... I did not hear Speaker Madigan's testimony. I was here."

Spain: "Is that arrangement that the Speaker testified to under oath, Speaker Madigan, still the practice in place in this House of Representatives?"

Gabel: "I can only speak to the rules that we have now and the rules that are proposed."

Spain: "Speaker Madigan further testified that if there were a majority of House Democrats against a bill, he would not call it, but if a substantial majority of his Democratic Members wanted to call a bill, he would. Is that arrangement still in place today in our House of Representatives?"

Gabel: "Yeah, I... I cannot say what Speaker Madigan did or didn't do. As I said, I was not on his Rules Committee and I would really like to go back to... if you have questions about these 104th rules that are... are proposed."

Spain: "Leader Gabel, is there a mechanism within the rules under normal order for any Member of the House of Representatives that can come forward and show that they have an earnest number of cosponsors on both sides of the aisle, do... is there a mechanism in these rules to allow a path forward to have a bill considered publicly?"

Gabel: "Yes. There... there is, and I already described that for you, the process under rule 18(g)."

Spain: "Thank you. Mr. Speaker, to the bill."

Speaker Welch: "To the bill."

Spain: "These rules and very, very important and they affect everything that we do as a body going forward. Rule 18(g) has never been a path for success to discharge a bill and allow

for consideration. I understand why you might make it really difficult sometimes to move forward certain bills, but these rules... and I... I hope that the ideas that have been proposed today, Mr. Speaker, can receive consideration because one of the fundamental problems with the rules is the inability of Members to allow their bill to be considered. We have a Member of our caucus who was not allowed to present one single bill in the entire 103rd General Assembly. His crime was that he won an election. And I... I think that is fundamentally wrong that we wouldn't allow someone to present a bill. Not a bill that's antithetical to the interest of the majority, but a simple honorary bill that may do something for their committee. You know, this House used to be a place, and I hope it can return to be a place, where we would celebrate with each other as each one of the new Members gets up to present their first bill. Maybe they'd get a little hard time, they'd have some questions, but it was a point of celebration. They'd receive a round of applause, and we'd all acknowledge that we're here learning together, working as a part of a team. This House of Representatives needs to get back to those days where there is an ability for us to work together. And so often, Mr. Speaker, these rules become the tools for division in the House instead of the tools to unify us. I listened to your words, which were very eloquent and earnest yesterday, and you talked about how we must work together, that the people of our state don't want division. They want us to work together and demonstrate some unity. I hope that some of the issues that have been brought forward today, earnest suggestions, can be taken under consideration so we

can work better together. We have an opportunity and an obligation to do more of that as a House. I would strongly recommend that as we move forward in these rules, we have to create different ways for Members to have bills considered. The rule of 60 is not serving this chamber well. It is a rule that facilitates division instead of collaboration. I understand the numbers here in the House. Democrats have two-thirds of the representation in this body. Republicans have one-third. You've heard me argue and take exception to that because it's not reflective of our state. But even under those thresholds, there should be a mechanism for 40 Democrats to join forces with 20 Republicans and put an item up on the board. And we can advance it for consideration and at least have the public discussion that the people of Illinois deserve. The rules as presented are a continuation of a practice that is not working and not serving us all well together on how we can come together in unification. As a result, I urge a 'no' vote to House Resolution 15."

Speaker Welch: "Seeing no other Member seeking recognition, Representative Gabel to close."

Gabel: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. First, I'd just like to say that I appreciate your submission of possible changes to the rules that we received this morning, and we will... we will review them and consider them. But I also want us to be clear that... that we are making any major changes to the House Rules, that these rules have served us well, that last year they truly contributed to our ability to create the Child Tax Credit, to make investments in education at every level, to pass commonsense reforms, like Karina's Bill, and more. The rules

And I cannot wait to see what great heights you rise to next."

Speaker Welch: "Leader Hoffman, for what reason you seek recognition?"

Hoffman: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Natalie, that was really good. And you talk about someone who's seen time fly by, just look at me, right? When I first came here, I was saying yesterday, I was 28 years old, and I saw many of the Members, the newer Members, and the younger Members, with their children. I came to that first swearing-in, my daughter, my oldest daughter, was three, and my youngest had just been born that December. Now, I got grandkids and it's wonderful. (a) One Senator shall be elected from each Legislative District. Immediately following each decennial redistricting, the General Assembly by law shall divide the Legislative Districts as equally as possible into three groups. Senators from one group shall be elected for terms of four years, four years and two years; Senators from the second group, for terms of four years, two years and four years; and Senators from the third group, for terms of two years, four years and four years. The Legislative Districts in each group shall be distributed substantially equally over the State.

(b) Each Legislative District shall be composed of three contiguous counties, with a separate additional Legislative District for each municipality with a population over one million. In 1982 and every two years thereafter one Representative shall be elected from each Representative District for a term of two years. Representative Districts shall be drawn independently of Legislative Districts.

(c) To be eligible to serve as a member of the General Assembly, a person must be a United States citizen, at least 21 years old, and for the two years preceding his election or appointment a resident of the district which he is to represent. In the general election following a redistricting, a candidate for the General Assembly may be elected from any district which contains a part of the district in which he resided at the time of the redistricting and reelected if a resident of the new district he represents for 18 months prior to reelection.

(d) Within thirty days after a vacancy occurs, it shall be filled by appointment as provided by law. If the vacancy is in a Senatorial office with more than twenty-eight months remaining in the term, the appointed Senator shall serve until the next general election, at which time a Senator shall be elected to serve for the remainder of the term. If the vacancy is in a Representative office or in any other Senatorial office, the appointment shall be for the remainder of the term. An appointee to fill a vacancy shall be a member of the same political party as the person he succeeds.

(e) No member of the General Assembly shall receive compensation as a public officer or employee from any other
