commercial real estate market and its ripple effect on property taxpayers across the state. Not a week go by that bills aren't filed, presented in committee, and sent to this chamber for consideration that concerns some type of taxing issue. Whether it's special exemptions or carve outs for a particular population, a TIF district extension, a sales tax, income tax, or real estate tax matter, someone will attempt to move bills that get them a great press release in their district, maybe a regional or statewide media attention, and ultimately a photo op with the Governor that says look here, we are doing a great thing. Let me draw your attention to recent op-ed in the Chicago Tribune concerning the activity in and around the Cook County Assessor's Office. Concerning these staggering... consider these staggering numbers. 70 West Madison Street, once valued at over \$375 million just over 10 years ago, recently sold for 85 million. The former Groupon headquarters was valued at... at 600 West Chicago Avenue was valued at over \$510 million and now has a sales price of \$89 million. And now, 311 South Wacker Drive, once worth over \$300 million, may sell for a little as \$70 million. Yet, despite these market realities, Cook County's Assessor clings to outdated evaluations. 70 West Madison is still assessed at \$317 million, almost four times its actual sales price. This disconnect doesn't just reflect four... poor fiscal management, it actively harms businesses struggling to survive in a challenging economic climate. These businesses are forced to appeal their property tax assessments, creating legal battle that cost time and resources. But the damage just doesn't stop at the Chicago city limits. As commercial properties win

these appeals with their assessments and they are lowered, the tax burden doesn't just disappear. It shifts. It shifts to suburban homeowners, and small business owners, and communities across Illinois. Families already stretched thin are now facing skyrocketing property taxes, not because of their own community spending, but because of the fiscal irresponsibility miles away in Chicago. This is, yet again, another cautionary tale about the dangers of government overreach and fiscal mismanagement. When property taxes are used as a bottomless well to fund an ever-growing government budgets, we all suffer. Chicago Public Schools, for instance, continue to demand more funding, regardless of enrollment declines for budget inefficiencies. The result? Tax levies climb higher and higher, forcing assessors to inflate property values to meet revenue demands. But what can we do? First, we must reform our property tax assessment process to ensure that it reflects real-time market conditions. Assessments based on outdated or inflated valuations are not just inaccurate, they're unjust. Second, we need to impose tax levy restraints. Capping annual increases can prevent runaway government spending from crushing taxpayers. And third, we must reform our overall tax and regulatory structure and create an environment where businesses can grow and thrive. Instead of relying on piecemeal incentives, we need comprehensive reforms that reduce burdensome regulations, lower taxes, and ensure a fair and predictable system that attracts investment and job creation in Illinois. Finally, we need greater transparency and accountability. An independent review process for major assessment discrepancies and strict

oversight of government spending are essential steps to rebuild trust. Colleagues, this is not a Chicago problem, it's an Illinois problem. But without bold action, it will continue to erode our economic foundation. Ladies and gentlemen of the House, we need to fix this problem before it's too late. Thank you."

Faver Dias: "I rise today as an elected Representative and former high school history teacher to speak out against something that chills me to my very core and threatens to impact young people for generations to come. Last week, the President of the United States issued an executive order purporting to end radical indoctrination in K-12 schools. In reality, this order does the exact opposite. It narrows the scope of education and limits the development of critical analytical skills in our children. Today's public school curricula in Illinois are rigorous explorations of the United States and the world. Students are not... are not taught what to think, but rather how to think. Today's students examine primary historical documents from multiple viewpoints to learn how to read and to think critically so they understand the complexity of our great nation through facts, not fear, justice, not jingoism. I can't think of anything more frightening than a generation of impressionable children taught to see through the lens of fear and ignorance. This President has

demonstrated outright hostility towards immigrants, women, and LGBTQ folks through his rhetoric. And now, he seeks to attempt to turn this hostility into educational policy. Executive orders are threatening to take federal funding away from schools that thoughtfully examine historical facts, to prevent schools from acknowledging students' gender identity, or teaching students how to respect people, and insidiously to demand only patriotic admiration of a country whose story is truly complex. Demanding patriotic admiration has dangerous historical precedent. In Nazi Germany, Hitler and his regime targeted children with nationalistic propaganda to ensure their loyalty. In schools and in clubs they were taught not to think critically but to love Hitler and to be obedient to the state. I am proud that our students in Illinois are taught to consider the whole history of our nation's history: Its achievements, and its failures. Its proudest moments, and its most shameful. That is how we truly build a society that values all of its people. We do not yet have to give into this censorship. President Trump's executive orders are being challenged in court because it is illegal for the United States Department of Education to attempt to direct curriculum at the local level. I urge teachers, parents, and district leaders in the strongest possible terms to follow the laws of our nation and our state by continuing your normal operations. In a world where students, where all of us are inundated with so much misinformation and disinformation, we must stand up to those who would prevent us from seeking truth. We must demand that this executive order be rescinded. We must insist our children's education focus on critical

I want to thank... thank you all from the bottom of my heart for your words of encouragement, prayers, and kindness. Today, I am 17 treatments into my radiation and it is going well. I still plan to get through this bump in the road and get back to my old self in a little while. Cancer affects every single one of us in this body and across the state. All of us know someone who has been touched by this disease. I've learned that cancer is deeply personal. Whether you're living with cancer right now, in private, a caregiver, an advocate, your experience matters. I urge you to share it and become part of the movement to improve cancer care and one day irradiate it forever. On World Cancer Day, I want you to shed light on the importance of screening and early detection of not only prostate cancer, but all cancers. Screening tests are available for lung, colon rectal, breast, prostate, and cervical cancer. Each cancer type has recommendations for

I also want to thank the American Cancer Society, Cancer Action Network, and specifically Ally Lopshire for offering to work together to find legislative solutions towards expanding cancer research screening and early detections. As I continue along this journey, I am excited to learn more about what we can do right here in Illinois to move forward, a world where we can have a cure. I'm asking you for us all to join in this fight. Thank you."

And, Members, it's really not just about regurgitating history. Today, in 2025, Blacks in Illinois are disproportionately impacted by every social determinate of health. Rep. and being in the room. We have to get something done. We need you. We need each and every one of you. We go further together. We go further together. We go further together. Many of you know, the Pentagon making a conscious decision not to celebrate Black History Month. I only thought it was fitting that we lift up the first and only Africa American to rise to the ranks of the Secretary of Defense. Rep. Tarver, Rep. Buckner, I think he's your Que Dog. Curtis, I think he's your Que Dog. Clayton. I'm talking about Secretary Lloyd James Austin III. Secretary Austin is a retired United States Army general, who served as the 28th United States Secretary of Defense from 2021 to 2025 in the administration of President Joe Biden. Before retiring from military in 2016, Austin served as the 12th commander of the United State Central Command, beginning in March 2013. Prior to that, he served as the 33rd vice chief of staff of the Army from January 2012 to March 2013. He was also the first Black to do that. As a commander of United States Forces-Iraq from September 2010, also to December 2011, he is the first African American to hold each of these positions. Very accomplished guy here. After retiring from the Armed Forces, Austin joined the boards of Raytheon Technologies, Nucor, Tenet Healthcare, and Auburn University. On December 7, 2020, he was nominated for Defense Secretary by then President-elect Joe Biden and was confirmed by United States Senate on January 20... January 22, 2021 by a vote of 93 to 2. Secretary Austin holds the unique distinction, all right listen to this, guys, the unique distinction of having commanded in combat in both Iraq and Afghanistan at the one-, two-, three-, and four-star levels

and was the first African American to command a division, corps, and field army in combat. He is a recipient of the Silver Star, the nation's third highest award for valor, for his actions during the Iraq invasion, as well as five, five, Defense Distinguished Service Medals. Let's just think about it, ladies and gentlemen, we're talking about our military and what it means to us. It's there to protect our families, protect our communities, protect our country. So, when you talk about an African American male, through the pain, through the suffering, through systematic racism, served this country for 41 years, what it's telling you is that even though we've gone through these trials and tribulations, we love this country. We love this country. It also just goes to show you that when given the opportunity, when given the opportunity, we will rise. In this case, Secretary Austin rising, rising honorably with distinction, serving our country as the first and only African American to be the Secretary of Defense. Mr. Speaker, thank you so much, and thank you for allowing me to shed light on this important part of our Black history. Thank you."

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to amend Article V of the Illinois Constitution by changing Sections 1, 3, 7, and 18 and by repealing Section 17 as follows:

ARTICLE V

THE EXECUTIVE

SECTION 1. OFFICERS

The Executive Branch shall include a Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, ~~Comptroller~~ and Treasurer elected by the electors of the State. They shall keep the public records and maintain a residence at the seat of government during their terms of office.

SECTION 3. ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible to hold the office of Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, or Treasurer, a person must be a United States citizen, at least 25 years old, and a resident of this State for the three years preceding his or her election.

SECTION 7. VACANCIES IN OTHER ELECTIVE OFFICES

If the Attorney General, Secretary of State, or Treasurer fails to qualify or if the office becomes vacant, the Governor shall fill the office by appointment. The appointee shall hold office until the elected officer qualifies or until a successor is elected and qualified as may be provided by law and shall not be subject to removal by the Governor. Lieutenant Governor fails to qualify or if the office becomes vacant, it shall remain vacant until the end of the term.

SECTION 17. COMPTROLLER - DUTIES (REPEALED)

SECTION 18. TREASURER - DUTIES

The Treasurer, in accordance with law, shall (i) maintain the State's central fiscal accounts, and order payments into and out of the funds held by him or her, (ii) be responsible for the safekeeping and investment of monies and securities deposited with him or her, and for their disbursement upon his or her order, and (iii) have the duties and powers that may be prescribed by law.

SCHEDULE

A Comptroller shall not be elected in 2030 and thereafter. This Constitutional Amendment otherwise takes effect upon the conclusion of the term of the Comptroller elected in 2026. This has been the First Reading in full of House Joint Resolution Constitutional Amendment #9. There being no further business, the House Perfunctory Session will stand adjourned."
