prolific inventor who had 61 patents to his name. Chief among them were innovations in refrigeration technology, which earned him the title of 'Father of Refrigerated Transportation' and, as I prefer, the 'King of Cool.' Jones was born in 1893 and, like so many Black Americans at the time, faced challenging circumstances that limited his educational options. However, a fascination with machines and an insatiable appetite for reading led Jones to virtually unprecedented success as an electrical engineer, first for the Army and then for businesses in a variety of different fields. Jones' early innovations included pioneering audio-visual equipment and building the first portable X-ray machine. However, these achievements paled in comparison to his chief contribution, one that touches all of our lives, a new refrigeration system he dubbed the Thermo King. After modifications to the original design, Jones outfitted trains, boats, and ships with their own refrigeration units, allowing produce to be moved long distances without spoiling. He was responsible for a rapid expansion of millions of Americans' access to fresh food and a revolution in how our country lives. Today, as this country faces a White House determined to rewrite American history and paper over the sins of its past, which disproportionately hurt people of color, disproportionately and specifically hurt Black people. So, while we in Illinois, many of us, fight to combat discrimination, end grocery deserts, increase education funding, and build up small businesses in our communities, it could not be a more important time to also highlight Black

Thank you."

over fences 'cause the slow... snow was so deep. He had to go outside and climb a ladder to get to his bedroom upstairs in that log cabin, where there was no heat. In Southern Illinois in 1931, in first grade, he was taught in German, not English. The year later, they moved up to our current farmhouse, a house his mother used a team of mules to pull all the logs home to be cut up into boards for that house to be built. In the mid-'30s, that house was wired with electric. In 1948, that house had a bathroom put in it. That's still the house that I live in. In 1964, we got a pipeline put in, in the new dairy barn, so we didn't have to carry the milk in milk cans, load it up, put it in there, going to school, drop them off at the dairy. And in 1980, we got our first cab tractor. So, think of the change in Illinois in a hundred years' time. Thank you, and help wish my father a happy heavenly birthday tomorrow."

They were sent to Europe to clear a massive backlog of mail for American troops. Warehouses were stacked to the ceiling with letters and packages, and without their hard work, many soldiers wouldn't have received the words of encouragement they desperately needed from home. The Six... the Six Triple Eight motto was... said it all, 'No mail, low morale.' They worked long, hard hours in harsh conditions sorting through millions of letters, but despite their service, they weren't even... they weren't given the recognition they deserved when they came home. It took nearly 80 years for them to finally receive the Congressional Gold Medal in 2022. The Six Triple Eight's story is one of courage, deep dedication, and breaking barriers. As we celebrate Black History Month, let's remember their legacy and the impact they had, not just in World War II, but in paving the way for future generations to be recognized for their services in our amazing country. Thank you."

understand that there's a difference between disagreeing and causing real harm. I was newly out as a young gay person in the '80s during the Reagan administration. That man slaughtered my community. HIV and AIDS ran rampant through the gay community, and our government didn't give a damn and watched people die, waste away, not provide care. The lesbians in our community stood up and made sure that people got health care and had access to food and medicine, not the government, because Ronald Reagan wanted us to die. We can't lionize people and pretend that the evil they did wasn't real. We are now on a track to eliminate HIV, but we're on that track in spite of Reagan's efforts to destroy my community, to watch us die and waste away. And I am grateful that when we talk about HIV legislation now, it is a bipartisan conversation. We have made incredible strides, but we cannot forget the thousands, and thousands, and thousands of gay men, of people of color, of poor people, of people with substance abuse disorder who were left to rot by the Reagan administration. Thank you."
