better known as Mother Jones. Jones was born in Ireland, but when the Great Potato Famine struck, she joined her family in immigrating to North America at the age of 10. In her early 20s, she moved to Chicago and then to Memphis, where she married a member and organizer of the National Union of, excuse me, Iron Moulders. But tragedy would soon strike, with Jones losing her husband and their four children to yellow fever epidemic in 1867. She then chose to return to Chicago to open a dressmaking business that was patronized.. patronized, excuse me, by some of the wealthiest women in the city. Reportedly, the contrast between rich and poor had an impact on Jones, who began to show great interest in the labor movement. But tragedy would again strike with the Great Chicago Fire of 1871, destroying her home, shop, and belongings. Jones would help the city rebuild and would become increasingly active with the Knights of Labor. In an era of industrialization, Jones began to use her oratorical skills and organizational skills to focus on the rising number of working poor, especially as wages shrunk, hours increased, and workers had no insurance for unemployment, health care, or old age. By the end of the decade, Jones had found her calling and was traveling around the country organizing strikes. Over the following years, she was at the forefront of hundreds of strikes from numerous industries and causes, including child labor. She became increasingly popular and known wearing trademark black dresses and earning her nickname, Mother Jones. This was a violent era with labor clashes, but despite being banished in multiple towns and even being convicted at a military tribunal in 1912, Jones

was relentless in her advocacy. Around the turn of the century, Jones became well known for her work with miners, and she continued to be active in labor work well into her 80s. In 1924, she made her last strike appearance in Chicago in support of striking dressmakers. Mother Jones passed away in 1930 and was buried at the Union Miners Cemetery in Mount Olive, Illinois. Despite the significant adversity she faced throughout her life, Mother Jones was relentless in her advocacy on behalf of workers. Through rights that were secure in this era, have played a significant role in the development of our country and still continue to resonate with workers today. So, let's recognize one of our state's most historic figures. Let's recognize Mother Jones. Thank you."
