2024 ANNUAL REPORT – BODY WORN CAMERAS



AGENCY OVERVIEW

In 2024, the Channahon Police Department employed 29 sworn officers and possessed 25 body-worn cameras, allowing one camera to be assigned to each officer, while on duty.

TECHNICAL ISSUES

A total of five (5) technical issues were documented in 2024. These issues included, a battery charge discrepancy between device and battery, a "bubble" on a device screen, a device powering down after being placed in a vehicle charging dock, "ERR 0342 Video Failure", and "ERR 0402 Audio Failure." Each issue was assessed by the BWC Coordinator (CPD Policy 438.3.1). Four (4) technical issues were resolved by restarting the device or returning it to the charging dock. The bubble on the device screen is determined not to impact the camera's performance or quality.

REVIEW PROCESS

All reviews of body-worn camera recordings (video and audio) are completed using the established statute of the Law Enforcement Officer Worn Body Camera Act (50 ILCS 706).

OTHER RELEVANT INFORMATION

The Channahon Police Department began using body-worn cameras in May, 2024. The department's ILETSB camera grant application was submitted in January 22, 2025.
