NUMBER OF BODY-WORN CAMERAS

The Collinsville Police Department issued every sworn police officer listed above with a body worn camera. We utilize the vendor, Axon, for both the hardware and the cloud-based storage. All digital evidence related to the Axon camera system is uploaded to the cloud-based server and can be downloaded, reviewed, shared, etc.. via evidence.com. The Collinsville Police Department requires sworn officers to comply with the Illinois Statutes pertaining to the use of Body Worn Camera Systems via Collinsville Police Department Policy 461: ***Body Worn Cameras and Portable Audio/Video Recorders.***

TECHNICAL ISSUES

The Collinsville Police Department has not experienced any significant technical issues with the Axon BWC Systems. Part of our contract with Axon includes service and technical support. If we were to experience any technical issues, we would have a source for resolution.

REVIEW PROCESS

The Collinsville Police Department BWC review process is overseen by a Lieutenant in charge of the BWC systems. The Lieutenant would conduct a random review of BWC footage for officers weekly and contact officer(s) and their direct supervisor if there were any issues resulting from the review. All patrol Lieutenants review all BWC footage relating to any use of force incident and pursuits (when BWC footage could be independent of the in-car camera system). For 2025, the CPD is in the process of switching to have each patrol sergeant conduct two random reviews of BWC footage for each officer on their squad per month while utilizing the same review form described. The CPD plans on still reviewing all BWC footage for UOF and pursuits as before.
