Pursuant to 50 ILCS 706/10-25 the Cook County Sheriff's Office is submitting this 2024 Body Worn Camera Report.

The Cook County Sheriff's Office is currently utilizing Axon Body 3 cameras. Our current deployment consists of 2807 body worn cameras.

The body worn cameras are assigned to individual staff members who have the ability to review their individual recordings both on the camera and through the cloud. Staff members in supervisory roles have full review authority over all clips created within their assigned group. The Cook County Sheriff's Body worn Camera Policy mandates a review minimum of three video clips per day from each department.

In addition to random reviews, all supervisors are trained and are encouraged to review body worn camera video from their subordinates after incidents as well as intermittently throughout their normal duties.

We returned 91 cameras, to Axon, for malfunctions including but not limited to:

- Battery does not hold a charge or last the entire tour of duty
- Cracked lens
- Unable to upload data
- Damaged (dropped or fell off during an incident)
- Network error when docked
- Power button wear
- Rear mount loose or broken off
- USB interface port damaged
