The Rolling Meadows Police Department began its program on January 1, 2025. The training utilized a power point presentation that consisted of department policy, state law regarding BWC, and training with our Axon representative. The only issues arrised were eavesdropping concerns,when to activate and when to turn off BWC, along with recording in a private residence.

Users were shown how to activate the camera along with where the BWC video is stored. Users were also shown the applications that supported their issued BWC. Supervisors utilize the performance center within Evidence.com to conduct random reviews of officers BWC videos.

The Rolling Meadows Police Department utilized LEXIPOL for its BWC policy and made changes based on state law to address detectives and school resource officers that must utilize a BWC. The policy also reflects that supervisors conduct random reviews every month or officers on their shifts for policy, training, and safety compliancy.

At the time of this report there are no issues with the equipment or inventory concerns. The only issue that impacts concerns is the cost associated to the purchase of future equipment and data storage, Along with the time that redactions consumes on the agency for FOIA related purposes involving BWC.It is our hope that legislators understand the impact on BWC and FOIA law for redactions. Outside subscribed sources that utilize YouTube for monetary gain via BWC footage that consistently FOIA police departments to post these videos and monetize the video on their channel. This is a concern that utilizes many resources within departments to spend countless hours redacting video footage requested by social media influencers to gain subscribers and monetize their channel.
