Annual Report on the staffing level of bilingual on-board frontline employees within the Illinois Department of Natural Resources.

In accordance with 5 ILCS 382/3-1 *et seq.*, the Illinois Department of Central Management Services submits the following report to the Illinois General Assembly.



Executive Summary

The State Services Assurance Act recognizes that the State government delivers many services to all Illinois residents. The Act notes that State services are used by many Illinois residents who do not speak English fluently. As such, the Act recognizes a need for bilingual State employees and “ensures the hiring and retention of additional bilingual frontline staff in State agencies where public services are most used.”

The Act requires that on or before April 1 of each year, “each executive branch agency, board, and commission shall prepare and submit a report to the General Assembly on the staffing level of bilingual employees. The report shall provide data from the previous month, including but not limited to each employee’s name, job title, job description, and languages spoken.”

As of March 1, 2023, the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) had Fifteen (15) bilingual onboard frontline staff, three in Water Resources all speaking Spanish, two in Grant Management one who speaks Spanish the other Russian, two in Mines and Minerals who speak Spanish, two in Resource Conservation who speak Spanish, and one in each of the following divisions Fiscal Management who speak Spanish, Realty & Capital Planning that speaks Gujarati and Hindi, Human Resources speaking Spanish and, Office of Law Enforcement that speaks Spanish, Lands Management that speaks Spanish and Illinois Nature Preserves that speaks French.

The [State Services Assurance Act](#) requires each executive branch agency to submit a report to the Illinois General Assembly on or before April 1st every year on the staffing level of bilingual on-board frontline staff in the RC-6, RC-9, RC-10, RC-14, RC-28, RC- 42, RC- 62, RC-63, and CU500 bargaining units in titles represented by AFSCME as of June 1, 2007. “On-board frontline staff” means frontline staff in paid status.

The State Services Assurance Act Annual Report must contain each employee’s name, job title, job description, and languages spoken as of the previous month.
