
Description of Post-Adoption/ Guardianship Support Services

Part 1: Financial Support

Subsidies

Families who adopt may receive monthly subsidy payments equal to the foster care board rate. This financial support typically continues until the child turns 18. If, at the age of 18, the youth is enrolled in high school, but has not graduated, the subsidy can be extended to high school graduation or age 19, whichever comes first with confirming documentation. If the youth have physical, mental, or emotional special needs that affect his major life activities, the subsidy can be extended to age 21. If the youth is age 16 or older and adopted on/after 7/1/2017, the subsidy is paid until their 21st birthday with confirming documentation.

Opportunities to receive extensions beyond age 18 also exist if:

- The child is still enrolled in high school at age 18 and has not graduated, the subsidy can be extended until graduation or until the child turns 19—whichever comes first. Documentation is required.
- The child has physical, mental, or emotional special needs that significantly impact daily life, the subsidy may be extended until age 21 with appropriate documentation.
- The child was 16 or older at the time of adoption on or after July 1, 2017, the subsidy automatically continues until their 21st birthday, provided documentation is submitted.

Medical Care

All youth in care, including those in foster care All children in foster care receive health coverage through the Youth Care administered by the Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS). This coverage continues after adoption as part of the adoption subsidy. Once the adoption or guardianship is finalized, families gain access to additional options and may choose to:

- **Stay with YouthCare,**
- **Select a different managed care plan**
- **Use their own private health insurance**

Dental/Orthodontic Services

Dental and orthodontic services are available through community-based providers that accept the managed care plan. Families should confirm that their chosen dentist or orthodontist is in-network with their managed care provider before receiving services. The DCFS Post Adoptions Assistance unit is available to assist

caregivers experiencing difficulty with located a healthcare provider who accepts the managed care medial card within 25–30 miles of their home. DCFS will also reimburse caregivers for approved services, at the Illinois Medicaid rate.

Medical Assistance When Families Move Out of State

Illinois is a member of the Interstate Compact on Adoption and Medical Assistance (ICMA). Families that move out of state will continue to receive Illinois subsidies. DCFS will forward the required information to the family's new state of residence, to request medical coverage within the new state, upon request from the caregiver.

Durable Medical Equipment

DCFS uses a prior approval process to purchase most durable medical equipment for children entering adoption or guardianship. Requests for equipment not covered by HFS and processed through the child's regional Subsidy Support unit and Clinical Services. The Subsidy Support Unit also provides maintenance and/or replacement services on broken or damaged equipment. As a first step, families should contact their Subsidy Specialist to obtain replacement purchase approval or maintenance cost reimbursement.

To qualify:

- The equipment must be listed as a covered service in the subsidy agreement or identified as medically necessary by a medical professional.
- The equipment cannot be covered by the child's medical card.
- The youth must have a diagnosed condition that existed prior to adoption.

Home Modifications

Many of the children in the Subsidy Support Unit that require durable Medical Equipment may also require home modifications. Subsidy Support in conjunction with Clinical Services works closely with families to:

- Verify Medical Necessity – Obtain documentation from a medical professional confirming the need for the modification.
- Secure Vendor Bids – Coordinate with vendors to collect bids for the required work.
- Approve and Authorize Work – Once a bid is officially approved, an authorization is issued to the vendor to complete the modification.

Once a bid has been officially approved, an authorization is provided to the vendor to complete the required modification. Home Modification eligibility requirements are as follows:

- The modification must be listed as a covered service in the subsidy agreement or identified as medically necessary by a medical professional.
- The service cannot be covered by the child's medical card.
- The youth must have a diagnosed condition that existed prior to adoption.

Tax Information for Foster and Adoptive Families

Since 2003, families who adopt a child with special needs from foster care can claim a Federal Tax credit. Families can contact their Regional Subsidy Support unit for information on who to contact regarding the tax credit.

Education and Transition Services

DCFS offers several educational support and transition services, including:

- **Scholarships:** Each year, DCFS awards 53 scholarships statewide. Youth who were adopted or entered subsidized guardianship through the Department are eligible to apply.
- **Tuition Waivers:** Eligible youth may receive tuition waivers for public in-state colleges and universities.
- **School Advocacy:** Advocacy services are available through contracted private agencies to help support educational success.
- **Independent Living Assistance:** Youth ages 17½ to 20 may qualify to receive assistance with housing, food, clothing, budgeting, and other essentials; this includes cash for security deposits, beds, utilities, appliances, and more.

Part 2:

Support and Preservation Services (ASAP)

There are four DCFS regions statewide. Each region has a Subsidy Support unit that provides comprehensive support and resources to adoptive/guardianship families in that region. DCFS understands that providing comprehensive post-adoption and post-guardianship services are a critical part of DCFS's commitment to families. The DCFS ASAP program is the cornerstone of the post adoption services offered to these families. Our support and preservation program provides intensive services when needed to help stabilize and support adoptive families, ensuring long-term success. This successful model has proven to be an invaluable resource of intervention and stabilization.

Once an adoption/guardianship is finalized:

- The family and case are assigned to a Subsidy Support Specialist.
- The family receives a welcome letter with the name and contact information of their assigned worker.
- A statewide toll-free number for the family's regional Subsidy Support Unit and services is also included in the correspondence, along with the *Path Beyond Adoption* website where additional resources and support can be found.

ASAP services include:

- **Crisis intervention & Comprehensive Assessment:** Preservation staff respond by phone within 24 hours and make an in-home visit within three days. A therapist assists the family with identifying their strengths, completing an assessment, and with developing a family treatment plan within 30 days of the referral.
- **Clinical services:** A therapist will provide clinical services in the family treatment plan.
- **Support groups:** Offered for both parents and youth at times and locations that meet the family's needs.
- **Case Management & Advocacy Services:** One of our contracted preservation agencies/programs will manage the case and services as outlined in the family treatment plan.
- **Children's Mental Health Advocacy Services:** If a child has significant mental health needs, the program will provide or facilitate services.
- **Cash Assistance:** Participating families that experience economic hardships or require additional specialized services may receive cash assistance payment (limited to \$500 per family per fiscal year)

- **START Program** (Start Early, Trauma-informed, Attachment-focused, Resiliency-building, Therapeutic Services): Facilitates quick assessment and implements immediate service intervention for families in need of less intensive and more preventative services. This program:
 - a. Works to deter disruption of placements
 - b. Educates families on the impact of adoption and guardianship and past trauma on children and connects current behavior to history
 - c. Helps families develop individualized parenting skills

Additional Support Services

DCFS offers additional services to adoptive and guardianship families, to complement the ASAP program. Services include:

- **Maintaining Adoption Connections (MAC):** The MAC programs provide as additional crisis intervention, assessment, respite, counseling, support groups, case management and various forms of advocacy; all of which meet many service needs that are not covered through the traditional subsidy related services. Key Features:
 - a. MAC provides stabilization and support services through agreed-upon alternative living arrangements for families who may not qualify for Preservation Services.
 - b. MAC offers comprehensive case management to ensure families receive the resources and assistance they need.
- **Post Adoption Transitional Services**
 In FY14, the Statewide Adoption and Guardianship Council identified a significant gap in services for older adoptees with special needs. Many parents contacted Subsidy Support staff for help navigating adult systems as their children transitioned into adulthood, as they encountered challenges accessing legal services (such as establishing adult guardianship) and adult financial systems (including Social Security and public assistance programs). DCFS formed a committee to review the issues and develop service recommendations. A specialized transitional support service was subsequently created and is currently delivered through a DCFS contracted agency. Post Adoptions Transitional Services provides families with guidance and support during this critical transition.
- **Educational Support for Post Adoption Children**
 Additional educational and support services are also provided to school-age youth through contracted agencies. DCFS partners with a statewide educational advocacy agency to support all children adopted through DCFS. Services include:
 - a. Interfacing with teachers and school staff
 - b. Attending IEP (Individualized Education Program) meetings
 - c. Advocating for additional educational services that are not being provided
 - d. Assisting parents with educational concerns prior to legal intervention
- **Counseling Individual and Family**
 DCFS contracts with counselors and therapists statewide to provide **individual and family services** both **in-home** and **in-office**. All services must be **pre-authorized** via the family's assigned **regional Subsidy Support Unit** at the family's request. Families may also access **community-based therapy and counseling** through their child's **medical card**.

- **Respite Programs**

Respite Services are available to families statewide via identified DCFS contracted agencies. These services offer relief to adoptive and guardianship families via such services as:

Hourly in-home or out-of-home program:

- a. **Mentoring** - From trained mentors to help youth build life skills and confidence.
- b. **Childcare Services** – Including babysitting and after-school care.

Overnight Services:

- a. **Overnight Camp** – Structured, supervised overnight camp experiences.
- b. **Extended Hours Childcare** – After-hours care designed to support families beyond the traditional school day.

- **Specialized camps**

Families can request respite care **on a regular basis** or in **emergency situations**. Services begin, with an **initial assessment** of the family and child needs and a service plan is created that identifies the most appropriate type of respite care required. Services are typically available for **up to two years**. Extension requests are typically submitted to DCFS by the contracted agency professional after **the first year, to secure authorization for a second year of respite services**.

- **Day Care**

Employment Related Daycare is available to our families in partnership with the DCFS Office of Child Development. Services include daycare fee payment for children under the age of three when the adoptive/guardian parent is employed or is in a training program which will lead to employment. These services are provided through the DCFS Office of Child Development.

- **Therapeutic Daycare**

Therapeutic daycare services are available for children three and older who cannot be served in a traditional childcare setting. To qualify, the child must:

- a. Demonstrate a need for more intensive services due to physical, mental, or emotional disabilities, and
- b. Have an educational need documented through a current IEP (Individualized Education Program) or 504 Plan.

- **Older Caregiver Services**

DCFS partners with Metropolitan Family Services to support caregivers 55 and older who have obtained or are pursuing adoption/guardianship of children. The program helps strengthen caregiver support systems and, when necessary, assists in creating alternative plans to ensure children’s safety, well-being, and permanency. Service Areas include Cook County and surrounding collar counties.

Services Include:

- a. Comprehensive assessments
- b. Physical and mental health recommendations
- c. Linkage to the Illinois Department on Aging
- d. Court and agency recommendations
- e. Short-term resource support
- f. Back-up care planning

- **Arranging Future Care Plans for Youth**

Subsidy Support helps families plan for a child’s future in the event unforeseen circumstances prevent the adoptive or guardianship parent from providing care. These services are offered through a DCFS contracted agency and include:

- a. **Standby Adoption** - A court-approved arrangement allowing parents to designate standby adoptive parents. The standby parent assumes custody only if needed, while the adoptive parent retains full rights until then.
- b. **Standby Guardianship** - A legal arrangement approved by a judge that allows parents to appoint a future guardian. The standby guardian steps in only when the parent can no longer care for the child.
- c. **Short-Term Guardianship** - A private legal agreement between the parent and a chosen caregiver. This temporary arrangement grants authority for up to **365 days**.

- **Search and Reunion Services**

The Subsidy Support Unit provides search and reunion services statewide through a contracted agency. Adoptees and birth family members whose adoption was handled by DCFS can request search and reunion services at no charge.

- **Adoption Registry**

The Illinois Adoption Registry helps individuals involved in an Illinois adoption connect with each other. Adoptees, birth parents, and birth siblings can file consent to share information. The registry also includes a medical information exchange, which collects details on hereditary or genetic conditions.

- **Advocacy Office for Children and Families**

This DCFS Unit receives and responds to concerns related to youth in care, as well as those adopted or under guardianship through the Department. Advocacy staff act on behalf of the child’s best interests by aiding, resolving issues, and ensuring appropriate support and services.
