



# **Earned Program Sentence Credit Annual Report**

In accordance with the Unified Code of Corrections, the Illinois Department of Juvenile Justice (IDJJ) submits the following data regarding award of sentence credit, known as "Earned Program Sentence Credit" to the General Assembly.

This report reflects data on individuals who were sent to IDJJ for an adult felony conviction and exited between January 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025.

During CY 2025, 22 youth exited IDJJ after having been awarded an average 279.3 days of EPSC. 20 youth had EPSC revoked, for an average of 130.1 days.

The tables on the following page provide a summary of the EPSC credits by holding offense.
