SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 750

WHEREAS, February is nationally recognized as Career and Technical Education (CTE) Month; and

WHEREAS, CTE's origins stem from the signing of the Smith-Hughes Vocation Education Act of 1917, which was the first major federal investment in CTE and laid the foundation for bipartisan, bicameral support for CTE that continues today through the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for 21st Act, and February 23, 2024 marks the 107th anniversary of the Smith-Hughes Vocational Education Act being signed into law; and

WHEREAS, Approximately 382,383 secondary and postsecondary students are enrolled in CTE across the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, CTE in Illinois places equity at the forefront of decision-making, instructional programming, and student support services, and it is instrumental in ensuring fair and equal access to learning opportunities, supporting local communities, fostering innovation, and promoting continuous improvement; and

WHEREAS, CTE programs lead in supplying instruction for careers in high-wage, high-skill, and in-demand occupations in a number of fields, including agriculture, health care, business and finance, information technology, advanced manufacturing, and education; and

WHEREAS, CTE programs provide relevant academic and technical coursework, leading to college credits and industry-recognized credentials for secondary and postsecondary learners; these programs also offer smooth pathways to and through postsecondary education and employment, career exploration for grades K-12, and assistance in meeting the Illinois Learning Standards; and

WHEREAS, CTE prepares students for tomorrow's careers and drives economic growth by matching employability skills with workforce demand, embedding work-based learning opportunities, and allowing for local flexibility; and

WHEREAS, All students benefit from equity-centered teaching practices, career-connected learning, opportunities to develop and discover practical skills and strengths, and career exploration; and

WHEREAS, CTE programs will play a critical role in becoming the largest training provider for Electric Vehicle Technology, thereby bolstering, supporting, and delivering Governor JB Pritzker's goal for the State of Illinois to reach 100% clean energy by 2050; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare the month of February 2024 as Career and Technical Education Month in the State of Illinois.

Senator Koehler offered the following Senate Joint Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 47

WHEREAS, The American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) stated in its 2021 report card that the United States received a grade of C- regarding the current state of infrastructure and that more than six trillion dollars is needed to restore the nation's infrastructure to a state of good repair; over two trillion dollars is currently not funded, and the remainder is inadequately funded; new, 21st Century projects are also unfunded; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois ASCE 2022 Report Card assigned the State's systems a cumulative grade of "C-"; the report analyzes 11 categories of infrastructure pertinent to Illinois, including aviation (C+), bridges (C), dams (C+), drinking water (D+), inland waterways (D), ports (C-), rail (C+), roads (D+), storm water (D+), transit (D+), and wastewater (C-); and

WHEREAS, Out of four million total water service lines, over 675,000 have been identified as lead and almost 380,000 as copper with lead solder services; and

WHEREAS, Illinois' aging drinking water infrastructure is leading to leaking pipelines, costing taxpayers money and critical resources; in 2017, a total of 106 million gallons per day (MGD) were lost among Lake Michigan allocation permittees, or 13% of total water supplied; additional funding is needed for aging storm water infrastructure that must keep up with increasing rainfall trends from climate change; and

WHEREAS, Illinois needs at least 300,000 new units of affordable housing for the most housing insecure; and

WHEREAS, There are 2,405 bridges in poor condition, or 9% of all bridges in the State that are crossed by motorists every day; approximately 70% of Illinois bridges in poor condition are owned by counties, towns, or cities, suggesting the local maintenance backlog is a significant challenge; and

WHEREAS, U.S. Reps. Danny Davis and Jesus "Chuy" Garcia introduced H.R. 4052 (The National Infrastructure Bank Act) on June 13, 2023 in the 118th U.S. Congress; this would create a \$5 trillion bank to finance all infrastructure requirements to bring the system to a state of good repair and build new projects; and

WHEREAS, The new national infrastructure bank is modeled on previous banks that helped build much of the country's infrastructure under Presidents George Washington, James Madison, Abraham Lincoln, and Franklin D. Roosevelt; the last such bank helped bring us out of the Great Depression and win World War II; and

WHEREAS, The new national infrastructure bank will create 25 million new jobs, pay Davis-Bacon wages, and enforce Buy America provisions; Disadvantaged Business Enterprises will receive significant disbursements, and the bill mandates large-scale minority hiring; the bank will require no new federal spending or federal taxes; according to experts, the bank will grow the economy by 5% per year as did its predecessors; and

WHEREAS, Many organizations are in support of a new national infrastructure bank, including the National Black Caucus of State Legislators, the National Hispanic Caucus of State Legislators, the National Asian-Pacific American Caucus of State Legislators, the Council of State Governments-East, the National Association of Counties, the National Association of Development Organizations, the US High Speed Rail Association, the National Latino Farmers and Ranchers Trade Association, the American Sustainable Business Council, the National Association of Minority Contractors, and the United Association of

Plumbers and Steamfitters International Union; in addition, 26 state legislatures have introduced or passed resolutions of support, as have county and city councils, including the Chicago City Council; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that we urge the United States Congress to pass H.R. 4052 to create a new national infrastructure bank to finance urgently needed infrastructure projects; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the President of the United States, the U.S. Senate Majority Leader, the U.S. Senate Minority Leader, the U.S. Speaker of the House, the U.S. House of Representatives Minority Leader, all members of the Illinois Congressional Delegation, and the Governor.
