SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 837

WHEREAS, An estimated 50,000 Americans and 1 million people worldwide have been diagnosed with tuberous sclerosis complex (TSC), a genetic disease with no cure; and

WHEREAS, TSC is often a devastating disorder that causes tumors to form in vital organs, including the brain, heart, kidneys, skin, liver, and lungs; and

WHEREAS, The disease is also the leading genetic cause of both epilepsy and autism; and

WHEREAS, TSC affects some people severely and others so mildly it often goes undiagnosed; and

WHEREAS, The incidence of TSC is as common as Lou Gehrig's disease (ALS) or cystic fibrosis, so increased awareness is vital; and

WHEREAS, The Tuberous Sclerosis Alliance and other groups around the world have joined together to promote awareness of the disorder to ensure people with TSC get the best possible treatment and proper diagnosis; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare May 15, 2024 as Tuberos Sclerosis Complex Awareness Day in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we encourage the citizens of Illinois to support the search for a cure and assist those individuals and families who deal with this challenging disease on a daily basis.

WHEREAS, In Illinois, the contributions of more than 3,500 local Red Cross volunteers give hope to the most vulnerable in their darkest hours; and

WHEREAS, The Red Cross supports service members and veterans, along with their families and caregivers, through the unique challenges of military life, and local Red Cross volunteers facilitate more than 9,000 emergency services for the military annually; and

WHEREAS, The Red Cross helps to save the lives of others with first aid, CPR, and other skills, and annually, local Red Cross volunteers train approximately 100,000 people in lifesaving skills; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare the month of March 2024 as Red Cross Month and March 14, 2024 as Red Cross Giving Day in the State of Illinois in honor of all who fulfill Clara Barton's noble words, "You must never think of anything except the need and how to meet it"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge everyone to join in the commitment to give to others, and we encourage all citizens of Illinois to support the noble efforts of the Red Cross; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the American Red Cross as a symbol of our respect and esteem.
