PRESENTATION OF CONGRATULATORY RESOLUTION

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 975

Offered by Senator Collins:

Congratulates the RUSH University System for Health and the University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center on their collaboration in establishing the RUSH MD Anderson Cancer Center in Chicago to enhance access to the most advanced cancer treatments and to seek to address the persistent inequities in cancer care in Illinois and across the nation.

PRESENTATION OF RESOLUTIONS

Senator Morrison offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 971

WHEREAS, Voting is one of the central tenets of our democracy and a fundamental right of American citizens; and

WHEREAS, Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act requires state and local governments to ensure that people with disabilities have a full and equal opportunity to vote; and

WHEREAS, Section 504 of the federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973 prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in any program or activity that receives federal financial assistance, including federal elections; and

WHEREAS, The Help America Vote Act of 2002 requires jurisdictions to make voting systems accessible in a manner that provides the same opportunity to voters with disabilities for access and participation as is provided to non-disabled voters; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Election Assistance Commission's 2021 report on Disability and Voting Accessibility in the 2020 Elections revealed that 11% of voters with disabilities had trouble voting in 2020; and

WHEREAS, Public Act 102-819 requires the State Board of Elections to provide a certified remote accessible vote by mail system through which a vote by mail ballot can be delivered by electronic transmission to voters with print disabilities and through which voters with print disabilities are able to mark and verify their ballots using assistive technology; and

WHEREAS, Public Act 102-819 requires election authorities to permit voters with a print disability to receive and mark their vote by mail ballots through the certified remote accessible vote by mail system provided by the State Board of Elections or through a certified remote accessible vote by mail system provided by the election authority itself; and

WHEREAS, Illinois voters with a print disability may apply for a single accessible vote by mail ballot or may apply to permanently receive accessible vote by mail ballots so a voter with a print disability may receive and mark their vote by mail ballots electronically; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we express support for ensuring that voters with a print disability may exercise their right to vote in a manner that is full and equal; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge election authorities in the State to conduct outreach to voters with a print disability to inform these voters of the options available to them to exercise their right to vote privately and independently.

Senator Villa offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 976

WHEREAS, Bodo Gsedl, born in Taufkirchen (Vils), Germany, attended West Chicago Community High School as an AFS exchange student and is a proud graduate; during one of his visits to West Chicago, he brought his twin brother, Uwe, who fell in love with a woman, married her, and settled in West Chicago; and

WHEREAS, When Taufkirchen (Vils) was exploring a sister city relationship, Bodo Gsedl suggested West Chicago; an exploratory visit was made, and the two cities made a proclamation declaring the relationship in 1999; and

WHEREAS, A sister city or a twin town relationship is a form of legal or social agreement between two geographically and politically distinct localities for the purpose of promoting cultural and commercial ties; and

WHEREAS, In 1999, a group of West Chicagoans traveled to Taufkirchen, Germany to sign the official partnership papers to become sister cities; Nancy Smith, City Clerk of West Chicago, signed on behalf of the City of West Chicago, and Franz Hofstetter, Burgermeister of Taufkirchen, signed on behalf of the municipality of Taufkirchen; and

WHEREAS, Over the past 25 years, there have been over 20 exchanges of visitors between the two cities, introducing participants to the customs of each country and exploring German and American cultures, including musical and dance groups that have performed in the other country; and

WHEREAS, Visitors are hosted in family homes in each community, honoring the social agreement set forth in 1999; the families participate in welcome dinners, tourist attractions, and unique opportunities to visit facilities that are not open to the public; and

WHEREAS, In 2019, the West Chicago sister cities group celebrated the partnership's 20th anniversary with a visit to Taufkirchen, Germany, which included the 20th anniversary celebration dinner with the signing of a proclamation and an exchange of gifts; and

WHEREAS, West Chicago and Taufkirchen share a similar focus on enriching regional goods and businesses through annual festivals and markets; Blooming Fest is DuPage County's official welcoming committee of spring; it is held in West Chicago's downtown and features one of the region's largest plant sales, live music, and a variety of craft and food vendors; in Taufkirchen, the Adlberger Market transforms the town center into a merchant and entertainment mile with open-air concerts, and all kinds of delicacies are offered by local hosts and butchers; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare May 15, 2024 as Sister City Partnership Day in the State of Illinois in honor of the 25th anniversary of the West Chicago and Taufkirchen sister city relationship; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of the resolution be presented to the mayor of West Chicago as a symbol of our respect and esteem.

MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE

A message from the House by
Mr. Hollman, Clerk:

Mr. President -- I am directed to inform the Senate that the House of Representatives has adopted the following joint resolution, in the adoption of which I am instructed to ask the concurrence of the Senate, to-wit:

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 41

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois General Assembly find it fitting to pay respect and honor to former Head Coach Ron Felling for his commitment to Illinois state sports and his longtime career of teaching athletes; and

WHEREAS, Coach Felling coached basketball at Lawrenceville High School and Indiana University; he has touched the lives of countless players and continues to do so today; and

WHEREAS, Coach Felling served as the basketball coach, baseball coach, football assistant coach, and athletic director for Lawrenceville High School; he served as assistant coach for four seasons and as the head coach for basketball for 16 seasons; he has one of the best records in the State of Illinois for basketball, coaching to 388 victories against 77 losses in 16 years as head coach; he is a four-time Illinois High School Association state championship coach, winning in 1972, 1974, 1982, and 1983 and placing 3rd in 1976; he won 12 Illinois High School Association regional titles, seven Illinois High School Association sectional championships, and five Illinois High School Association super-sectionals; his 1982 and 1983 state championship teams went 68 and 0, a record that still stands; and

WHEREAS, In 1982, Coach Felling was recognized by the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association and inducted into the Basketball Museum of Illinois; he was named the coach of the year by the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association and Illinois Coaches Association and is a four-time Southern and Central Illinois coach of the year; he was also selected as one of the 100 Legends in Illinois High School Basketball; and

WHEREAS, Coach Felling played basketball at Indiana State University in 1961 and was named as Indiana State University's Outstanding Alumnus in 1974; and

WHEREAS, Coach Felling was hired as assistant coach by Bob Knight at Indiana University in 1985, serving for 14 years; during which time, the team won the 1987 National Collegiate Athletics Association National Championship, finished in two final fours, and won four Big Ten regular-season titles and an Olympic Gold Medal; and

WHEREAS, Coach Felling's career in coaching spanned nearly 40 years; after his retirement, he hosted summer shooting camps for athletes in several states and was asked to speak in several clinics across the country; and

WHEREAS, Coach Felling lives in Bloomington, Indiana with his wife, Cammy; he has three children, six grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Coach Felling's former players and companions wish to provide him with this honor; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we designate Illinois Route 1 from North 950 Street to the intersection of U.S. Route 50 and Illinois Route 1 as the "Coach Ron Felling Highway"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Transportation is requested to erect, at suitable locations consistent with State and federal regulations, appropriate signs giving notice of the name "Coach Ron Felling Highway", along with the years of the state championships, 1972, 1974, 1982, 1983, and the 3rd place finish in 1976 noted on all appropriate signage; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to Coach Felling and the Secretary of Transportation.

READING BILL OF THE SENATE A SECOND TIME

On motion of Senator Villa, **Senate Bill No. 2568** having been printed, was taken up, read by title a second time.

The following amendment was offered in the Committee on Labor, adopted and ordered printed:

AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO SENATE BILL 2568

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend Senate Bill 2568 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following:

"Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section 22-100 as follows:

(105 ILCS 5/22-100 new)

Sec. 22-100. Retirement savings plans; requirements.

(a) This Section applies to contracts entered into, extended, or renewed on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 103rd General Assembly.

(b) A school district that offers to the school district's employees a retirement savings plan under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, may enter into a contract with only one vendor to administer the plan. A vendor shall be selected, with the approval of the employees' exclusive bargaining representative, if any, through a competitive bidding process. If there is more than one exclusive bargaining representative for the employees to whom the plan will be offered, the vendor shall be selected with the approval of a committee of the exclusive bargaining representatives through a competitive bidding process.

(c) A school district may enter into a contract with a vendor under this Section for no more than 7 years.

(d) If, on the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 103rd General Assembly, a school district has a contract with a vendor to administer a retirement savings plan under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, the school district shall, by no later than July 1, 2026, begin the

competitive bidding process established in subsection (b). The renewal or extension of a contract with a vendor to administer a retirement savings plan under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, that is in effect on the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 103rd General Assembly is subject to the competitive bidding process and requirements under subsection (b)."

Committee Amendment No. 2 was held in the Committee on Assignments.

Floor Amendment No. 3 was withdrawn by the sponsor.

Floor Amendment No. 4 was held in the Committee on Labor.

Floor Amendment No. 5 was held in the Committee on Assignments.

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 1 was ordered engrossed, and the bill, as amended, was ordered to a third reading.
