SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 14

Offered by Senator Villivalam:

Congratulates Omer Osman on his retirement and commends him for his decades of service to the Illinois Department of Transportation, his community, and his country.

PRESENTATION OF RESOLUTIONS

Senator Edly-Allen offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 10

WHEREAS, Conversion therapy, also known as reparative therapy, is a practice that falsely claims to change an individual's sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression through psychological or physical intervention; and

WHEREAS, Conversion therapy has been discredited by every major medical and mental health organization, including the American Psychiatric Association, the American Psychological Association, and the American Medical Association; and

WHEREAS, Conversion therapy has been linked to long-term mental health issues, including depression, anxiety, and suicidal ideation, and these are all issues that disproportionately affect the LGBTQ+ community; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois General Assembly passed the Youth Mental Health Protection Act in 2015 to prohibit licensed professionals from engaging in conversion therapy with minors and to safeguard Illinois youth from practices that have been scientifically proven to cause emotional and psychological harm, including increased risks of depression, anxiety, self-harm, and suicide among LGBTQ+ individuals; and

WHEREAS, The year 2025 marks the 10-year anniversary of this landmark piece of legislation that demonstrates Illinois' leadership in the advancement of LGBTQ+ rights; and

WHEREAS, Despite significant progress, the practice of conversion therapy still exists throughout Illinois and continues to falsely advertise itself as a legitimate therapeutic intervention, often targeting vulnerable LGBTQ+ adults; and

WHEREAS, Although Illinois recognizes the harms caused by conversion therapy and the fact that the practice is illegitimate, there is no statewide ban on the practice applying to adults; and

WHEREAS, The New Jersey Superior Court, in a landmark ruling in *Ferguson v. JONAH*, determined that the provisions of conversion therapy meet all of the standard elements for a consumer fraud claim; and

WHEREAS, Being gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, queer, or otherwise belonging to a marginalized community based on sexual orientation or gender identity is not a mental defect or a condition that can or should be cured; and

WHEREAS, It is essential to protect adults, as well as minors, from this fraudulent and harmful practice in order to safeguard the health and well-being of all Illinois residents, particularly those within the LGBTQ+ community; and

WHEREAS, It is imperative for the Illinois General Assembly, as a guardian of public health and safety, to take a firm stance against conversion therapy to ensure that Illinois remains a safe and supportive environment for all residents, particularly LGBTQ+ individuals; allowing conversion therapy to persist unchecked undermines the integrity of licensed healthcare professionals and poses a public health risk; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we condemn the practice of conversion therapy on any population as unethical and fraudulent, and we assert that no licensed professional operating in the State of Illinois should engage in this practice, whether with minors or adults, as it violates the ethical standards of professional behavioral healthcare; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we condemn conversion therapy as described herein, regardless of the target population or how the service is marketed or titled; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we acknowledge that conversion therapy is not a legitimate form of therapy but is a dangerous and discredited practice that has no place in a professional setting, and that any professional engaging in such practices is in violation of the ethical guidelines governing their licensure; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we encourage the Illinois Department of Public Health to launch a statewide public awareness campaign to educate communities about the harms of conversion therapy and its fraudulent nature, to collaborate with the Department of Financial and Professional Regulation to investigate and hold accountable practitioners offering conversion therapy under false pretenses, to develop guidelines for healthcare professionals to recognize, report, and prevent practices associated with conversion therapy, and to support outreach initiatives to connect survivors of conversion therapy with affirming mental health resources; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to Governor JB Pritzker, the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation, the Illinois Department of Public Health, the Illinois Department of Human Services, and the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services.

Senator Porfirio offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 11

WHEREAS, The Battle of Midway is widely considered one of the most significant naval battles in the Pacific Theater of World War II, taking place from June 4, 1942 to June 7, 1942, only six months after the attack on Pearl Harbor; Midway Island is located in the Pacific Ocean almost directly between the United States and Japan, making it a key target in the war; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Navy's victory in the battle, and subsequent defense of the major base on Midway Island, effectively turned the tides of World War II in the Pacific; as a result of the U.S. victory, Japan abandoned its plan to expand its reach in the Pacific and remained on the defensive for the remainder of World War II; and

WHEREAS, In 1949, the Chicago Municipal Airport was renamed Midway in honor of the hard fought Battle of Midway; and

WHEREAS, June 2025 marks the 83rd anniversary of the Battle of Midway; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare June 7, 2025 as Battle of Midway Day in the State of Illinois to honor those who served.

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 12

WHEREAS, For half a century, the Illinois Court Reporters Association (ILCRA) has been the preeminent association in Illinois to provide continual training to Certified Shorthand Reporters (CSRs), also known as court reporters, on professionalism, neutrality, confidentiality, and ethics for the benefit of all litigants, defendants, and the people of this State; and

WHEREAS, Illinois court reporters are licensed CSRs who diligently serve as Guardians of the Record, safeguarding litigants' personal, private, confidential, and proprietary information so that such information is not improperly released to the public; and

WHEREAS, Using advanced technology, court reporters write in shorthand, a simultaneous verbatim report of the spoken word, in pretrial depositions and hearings, trials, arbitrations, and sworn statements, which are the critical foundation to the pursuit of justice in every legal proceeding; and

WHEREAS, Illinois shorthand reporters and real-time captioners provide Communication Access Realtime Translation (CART) by captioning for attorneys, litigants, and jurors in legal proceedings, at business meetings, at educational classes and lectures, at sporting events, and at arts performances for many Illinoisans who are deaf or hard-of-hearing, have auditory processing disabilities, or for whom English is not their first language; and

WHEREAS, Court reporters and captioners preserve history for all Americans by translating spoken word into readable, searchable, storable, and usable text and electronic media; and

WHEREAS, Illinois CSRs are licensed by the State as the services provided by shorthand reporters and court reporters have long been declared to affect the public health, safety, and welfare of the people of Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare February 1 through February 8, 2025 as Court Reporting and Captioning Week in the State of Illinois.
