Senator Villivalam offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 77

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois Senate wish to recognize the celebration of the Lunar New Year as a major holiday celebrated by Asian American communities in Illinois, the United States, and around the world; and

WHEREAS, The Lunar New Year marks the beginning of the year using the traditional Chinese lunisolar calendar or a variant; and

WHEREAS, The Lunar New Year starts on the second new moon after the winter solstice and falls between January 21 and February 19 on the Gregorian calendar used in the United States; and

WHEREAS, The Lunar New Year began being celebrated in East Asia and Southeast Asia more than 4,000 years ago; today, it is observed worldwide among people of Bruneian, Chinese, Indonesian, Korean, Malaysian, Singaporean, Taiwanese, and Vietnamese heritage; and

WHEREAS, The Lunar New Year is known as Chinese New Year in Brunei, Indonesia, Malaysia, and Singapore, Spring Festival in China, Seollal in Korea, Agricultural Calendar New Year in Taiwan, and Tet in Vietnam; and

WHEREAS, While Lunar New Year celebrations vary in length from culture to culture, ranging from three days to two weeks, celebration commonalities include gathering with family and friends, honoring ancestors and elders, watching and participating in traditional dances, settling disputes, exchanging gifts, and enjoying feasts; and

WHEREAS, The Lunar New Year occurs in a 12-year cycle with each year being represented by one of 12 animals from the zodiac; and

WHEREAS, The 2025 Lunar New Year is the Year of the Snake with dual symbolism representing positive and negative qualities ranging from good fortune, harvest, procreation, and spirituality to cunningness, evil, terror, and threats; and

WHEREAS, This year, the Lunar New Year will begin on January 29, 2025; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize the cultural and historical significance of the Lunar New Year to Asian American communities, express our deepest respect for Asian Americans and people throughout Illinois and the world who celebrate the Lunar New Year, and wish those who celebrate a happy and prosperous new year.

Senator Ventura offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 81

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois has demonstrated a sustained commitment toward ensuring the realization of human rights for all, including rights for women, children, immigrants, and the homeless; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois has high aspirations and standards for its children and families and is constantly seeking ways to improve their lives and to ensure an environment that protects children's health; and

WHEREAS, The Convention on the Rights of the Child (the Convention) was adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on November 20, 1989 and became effective as an international treaty on September 2, 1990; and

WHEREAS, The Convention on the Rights of the Child is the only international human rights treaty aimed at protecting children from discrimination, neglect, and abuse by establishing a full range of civil, political, economic, social, and cultural rights; and

WHEREAS, Although the United States had considerable influence in drafting the Convention and subsequently signed it on February 16, 1995, the Convention has never been presented to the U.S. Senate for advice and consent, which is the necessary and final step to U.S. ratification; and

WHEREAS, Without U.S. Senate approval, the Convention has no effect on children living in the United States, thereby leaving them without the protections contained within this important treaty; and

WHEREAS, The adoption of the Convention on the Rights of the Child would enhance the State of Illinois' stature as a leader in promoting the well-being of children; and

WHEREAS, The adoption of the Convention on the Rights of the Child by the General Assembly would be consistent with Illinois' past support of securing fundamental rights for the most vulnerable; and

WHEREAS, The adoption of the Convention on the Rights of the Child would affirm Illinois' commitment to protect children and promote their rights; and

WHEREAS, The Convention would provide a single, comprehensive framework within which the diverse arms of the Illinois State government can assess and address, in a consistent manner, the rights and protections of our children; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we affirm our support for the Convention on the Rights of the Child; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge State agencies and the Illinois General Assembly to advance policies and practices that align with the principles of the Convention on the Rights of the Child; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge President Trump to submit the U.N. Convention on the Rights of the Child to the U.S. Senate for its advice and consent without delay, and we further call on the U.S. Senate to move swiftly to approve the Convention.

WHEREAS, Improving Illinois roads improves the quality of life for the citizens of our State; and

WHEREAS, The citizens of Jackson, Perry, Randolph, and Monroe Counties have expressed a desire to expand Illinois Routes 127/154/3 from two to four lanes; and

WHEREAS, Since 2018, these counties have advocated for this expansion by forming the Four County Coalition, the Southwest Connector Task Force, and now the Southwest Connector Coalition; and

WHEREAS, In 2019, the Southwest Connector Task Force, as formed by a Senate Joint Resolution in the 100th General Assembly, issued a 125-page report giving the justifications for the project that included economic development, safety, and national security concerns; and

WHEREAS, The report is available for all to review at the coalition's website, siconnector.com; and

WHEREAS, This proposed highway expansion enjoys the support of Laborers Local 773, the Illinois Retail Merchants Association, the Jackson County NAACP, Southern Illinois University, dozens of municipalities, hundreds of private businesses, and thousands of Southern Illinois residents; and

WHEREAS, There have been historic levels of federal spending authorized to rebuild and expand our nation's infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, The Southwest Connector Coalition is actively pursuing federal funding that has the potential to inject nearly a billion dollars into Illinois infrastructure, creating hundreds of good paying union jobs, enhancing the Illinois economy, and improving the safety of travel for all Illinoisans; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we express our support for the Southwest Connector Coalition's efforts to keep its expansion project moving forward; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we encourage the members of the Southwest Connector Coalition to remain engaged in their efforts to improve the great State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Southwest Connector Coalition as a symbol of our respect and esteem.

WHEREAS, It is highly fitting that the Illinois General Assembly pays honor and respect to the truly great individuals who have served their country; and

WHEREAS, Kenny Kays joined the U.S. Army in 1969 to serve as a medic; as of May 7, 1970, he was serving as a private in the Headquarters Company of the 1st Battalion, 506th Infantry Regiment, 101st Airborne Division; and

WHEREAS, During a firefight on that day in Thua Thien–Hue Province, Republic of Vietnam, Pfc. Kays repeatedly allowed himself to be the target of enemy fire in order to treat wounded soldiers; even after losing his lower left leg to an explosion, he treated the wounds of his fellow soldiers before allowing his injuries to be addressed; these actions resulted in the saving of numerous lives and inspired others in his company to repel the enemy; and

WHEREAS, In November of 1973, Pfc. Kays was promoted to private first class and awarded the Medal of Honor for conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity in action at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty; and

WHEREAS, Pfc. Kays' heroism at the risk of his life are in keeping with the highest traditions of the service and reflect great credit on him, his unit, and the U.S. Army; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that we designate Illinois Route 15 from the western edge of Fairfield west to the intersection with County Highway 10 as the "Pfc. Kenny Kays Memorial Highway"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Transportation is requested to erect at suitable locations, consistent with State and federal regulations, appropriate plaques or signs giving notice of the name "Pfc. Kenny Kays Memorial Highway"; and be it further
