PRESENTATION OF RESOLUTIONS

Senator Joyce offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 96

WHEREAS, Home fires are the biggest element of the U.S. fire problem for civilians and responders; and

WHEREAS, Eighty-six percent of all civilian structure fire deaths are in homes, and home fires cause \$8.7 billion in direct property damage each year (NFPA); and

WHEREAS, Residential structure fires accounted for 67 percent of firefighter injuries (USFA), and firefighters are 11 times more likely to be injured fighting structure fires (NFPA); and

WHEREAS, Home fires are deadlier today as a result of unprotected lightweight construction material, open floor plans, abundant synthetic furnishings, and emerging technology such as lithium-ion batteries, which make homes burn faster, becoming deadly in two minutes or less (UL/NIST); and

WHEREAS, The United States Fire Administration (USFA) estimates that home fire sprinklers could save thousands of lives each year if more were installed in homes; and

WHEREAS, Fire sprinklers are a proven and cost-effective means of protecting lives and property from the threat of fire; and

WHEREAS, Fire sprinklers offer the highest degree of fire protection and are critical in saving lives and property; and

WHEREAS, Fire sprinklers can control a fire, and thereby the smoke, while it is still small, as a room can be engulfed in flames in less than two minutes, saving the lives of occupants and first responders; and

WHEREAS, From January 1, 2007 through December 31, 2023, a span of 17 years, there have been 4,031 injuries in one and two-family home fires in Illinois without a fire sprinkler system and 1,072 fatalities; and

WHEREAS, During that same 17-year period, there have been only seven injuries in one and two-family home fires in Illinois with fire sprinkler systems and zero fatalities (NFSA); and

WHEREAS, Including fire sprinklers in local building codes and community risk reduction helps support fire service resources, staffing, and budgets because when new housing stock is sprinklered it becomes safer, improving communities and allowing fire service resources to be directed to those at highest risk; and

WHEREAS, Stronger state and federal support of home fire sprinkler education will help address confusion and anti-code negativity and encourage fire service advocacy of home fire sprinkler installation; and

WHEREAS, More installation of fire sprinklers in new homes will directly and indefinitely protect and improve communities of every size; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare the week of May 11, 2025 through May 17, 2025 as Home Fire Sprinkler Week; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Erik Hoffer, Chicago IP Director for the National Fire Sprinkler Association.

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 100

WHEREAS, Composting is an effective form of waste reduction, reuse, and recycling, and since organic materials make up approximately 30-40 percent of the material going to landfills, composting is a primary method communities can use to reach waste diversion goals and create sustainable communities; and

WHEREAS, Organic residual materials, including yard trimmings, vegetable cuttings, biosolids, food scraps, manures, and hay shavings, have been composted and converted into a beneficial product known as compost; and

WHEREAS, Returning organic resources, remanufactured into compost, to the soil reduces water consumption by over 30 percent for all soil types, conserves water during extreme drought or flooding

conditions, decreases dependence on chemical fertilizers and pesticides, and decreases erosion and nonpoint source pollution; and

WHEREAS, Communities, through their local governments, highway departments, soil and water conservation districts, and public works professionals, can have positive impacts on clean water, soil, climate change, and landfill diversion by using compost for public works projects; and

WHEREAS, Composting creates green jobs and infrastructure for cities and states that implement composting programs; and

WHEREAS, International Compost Awareness Week, scheduled for May 4–10, 2025, is a multimedia publicity and educational initiative designed to showcase compost production and demonstrate compost use and is supported by compost industry organizations from around the world; and

WHEREAS, The theme for 2025 is "Sustainable Communities Begin With Compost!"; it recognizes and promotes the importance of composting and the use of compost in growing healthier food, in supporting healthier soils, and, ultimately, in creating a more just and sustainable world; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare the week of May 4 through May 10, 2025 as "Compost Awareness Week" in the State of Illinois.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 3**

SC0003

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to add Section 20.1 of Article I as follows:

ARTICLE I
BILL OF RIGHTS

(ILCON Art. I, Sec. 20.1 new)

SECTION 20.1. PARENTAL RIGHTS

The right of a parent to determine his or her child's education and health care shall not be infringed prior to the child's attainment of the age of majority, except where the child is in the care and custody of the State.

This Constitutional Amendment takes effect upon being declared adopted in accordance with Section 7 of the Illinois Constitutional Amendment Act.

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to amend Section 3 of Article IX of the Illinois Constitution as follows:

ARTICLE IX
REVENUE

(ILCON Art. IX, Sec. 3)

SECTION 3. LIMITATIONS ON INCOME TAXATION

(a) ~~The General Assembly shall provide by law for the rate or rates of any tax on or measured by income imposed by the State. A tax on or measured by income shall be at a non-graduated rate. At any one time there may be no more than one such tax imposed by the State for State purposes on individuals and one such tax so imposed on corporations.~~ In any such tax imposed upon corporations the highest rate shall not exceed the highest rate imposed on individuals by more than a ratio of 8 to 5.

(b) Laws imposing taxes on or measured by income may adopt by reference provisions of the laws and regulations of the United States, as they then exist or thereafter may be changed, for the purpose of arriving at the amount of income upon which the tax is imposed.
