SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 126

Offered by Senator Hunter:

Congratulates Columbia College of Chicago and their retail team for winning the 2025 National Retail Federation (NRF) Foundation University Challenge. Commends Columbia College Chicago for fostering an environment of excellence in retail education and innovation and commends the dedication and expertise of the faculty and staff who supported and guided these students to success. Encourages continued support for programs that bridge academic learning with real-world industry challenges and fuel the creative economy.

PRESENTATION OF RESOLUTIONS

Senator Peters offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 123

WHEREAS, The stability of the human services workforce is in crisis due to insufficient reimbursement rates, inadequate state contracts, a constrained de minimis rate cap that is not reflective of the actual cost of overhead expenses, and burdensome reporting requirements; and

WHEREAS, State funding for human services in Illinois, expressed as a percentage of the General Revenue Fund, is 25% less than it was 27 years ago, representing chronically underfunded state contracts amidst increasing demands for services, high caseloads, increasing costs of delivering services and inflation, resulting in a waning, overworked and underpaid workforce; and

WHEREAS, The provision of human services in Illinois and across the nation is under attack, and the livelihood of more than 350,000 workers in the sector and the millions of the people to whom they provide services hangs in the balance amidst a blatant devaluing of this work by the federal government; and

WHEREAS, The pipeline of people entering the human services sector has been decreasing, and people currently working at community-based organizations are leaving the workforce because of consistently low pay, lack of fully covered health benefits, and high student loan debt burden when many positions require bachelor's degrees and professional licenses; and

WHEREAS, Systemic racism and sexism in care-centric work are exacerbated by state contracts' inadequacy to pay the people who make up the bulk of this workforce, mainly Black, Latiné, and Women workers, living wages, so much so that based on IL Partners' research, 92% of single-income households with children, the majority of which are women, do not earn a living wage; and

WHEREAS, There are still significant barriers for organizations with Black and/or Latiné leadership and organizations with budgets under \$5M in accessing state funding and contracts, which exacerbates

problems with community trust and service delivery when leadership of service providers lacks diversity; and

WHEREAS, The State values work differently based on where it is performed, as frontline human services workers at community-based organizations make significantly less than employees at state agencies doing similar work; and

WHEREAS, Human services are an essential part of a robust economy and thriving communities, ensuring that people are healthy, stable, and able to work; and

WHEREAS, Human service organizations do the State's work by preventing hospitalizations and providing life-saving support within the following services, including, but not limited to, childcare, food security, housing, mental health, substance use and prevention support, care for people with disabilities, care for older adults and youth, support for immigrants and returning citizens, job training and workforce development, violence prevention, legal aid, interpreters, and healthcare for historically marginalized populations; and

WHEREAS, The human service workforce is highly skilled and educated, as shown in Illinois Partners for Human Service's "Worker Well-Being is Community Well-Being" report that reveals that among the more than 850 workers surveyed, more than 70% have at least a bachelor's degree and yet more than 64% self-reported not earning enough to make a living wage; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the State to increase reimbursement rates, state grants and contracts, and the minimum overhead allowance to meet the rising costs of providing essential human services in Illinois and to support the workers who deliver those services; and be it further

RESOLVED, That funding from State agencies should enable human service employers to provide their workers a thrivable wage with annual cost-of-living adjustments without having to increase caseloads, forgo filling vacancies, or provide fewer services; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Governor, the Speaker of the House, the House Minority Leader, the President of the Senate, the Senate Minority Leader, and to the heads of the Department of Human Services, the Department of Healthcare and Family Services, the Department of Children and Family Services, Department of Early Childhood, Department of Juvenile Justice, Department on Aging, Department of Public Health, Department of Veteran Affairs, Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, the the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority, and the Illinois Guardianship and Advocacy Commission.

Senator Balkema offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 124

WHEREAS, Agriculture is the backbone of Illinois' economy, with over 72,000 farms covering nearly 27 million acres and marketing of agricultural products generating more than \$51 billion annually; and

WHEREAS, Illinois farmers play a crucial role in feeding the nation and the world by producing corn, soybeans, pork, beef, dairy, and specialty crops that are exported globally; and

WHEREAS, The dedication, innovation, and stewardship of Illinois farmers sustain rural communities, protect natural resources, and promote agricultural advancements that drive economic growth and food security; and

WHEREAS, Despite their vital contributions, Illinois farmers often face challenges related to public perception, regulatory burdens, and misinformation about modern farming practices; and

WHEREAS, It is essential to recognize and promote the hard work, resilience, and ingenuity of Illinois farmers to enhance public understanding and appreciation of their efforts; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we affirm our commitment to supporting Illinois farmers and promoting a positive perception of their essential work; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we encourage public education initiatives, outreach programs, and partnerships with agricultural organizations to highlight the economic, and environmental contributions of Illinois farms; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we recognize and commend the farmers of Illinois for their dedication, perseverance, and continued commitment to feeding families, strengthening communities, and upholding the State's proud agricultural heritage.

Senator Cunningham offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 125

WHEREAS, Illinois is contiguous to the largest body of freshwater on the planet and contains 2,900 lakes, 84,000 ponds, and 106,940 miles of streams as well as 880 miles of rivers along its borders; and

WHEREAS, Drowning is the number one cause of unintentional deaths for children one to four years of age, and 54% of adult Americans can not swim well enough to save themselves in an emergency; and

WHEREAS, According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), for every one drowning fatality, eight people are impacted by a non-fatal drowning; and

WHEREAS, The Every Child a Swimmer (ECAS) program is a division of the International Swimming Hall of Fame and has a mission to ensure every child learns to swim, reducing the devastating impact of childhood drownings across our nation; the program provides swim lesson scholarships to low income families, allowing every child to acquire the skills to save themselves in an emergency; and

WHEREAS, Water safety legislation sponsored by Every Child a Swimmer has been successfully implemented in Florida, Georgia, and Arkansas, requiring all schools K-12 to provide information on the importance of water safety and on local options for swim lessons as well as how to receive lessons at a free or reduced cost; and

WHEREAS, These efforts are creating a generation of swimmers who are safer and more prepared around the water; and

WHEREAS, By working together to improve water competency, including swimming skills, water safety knowledge, and helping others, water activities can be safer yet just as fun; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we encourage school districts throughout the State of Illinois to consider providing age appropriate education intended to promote safety in, on, and around bodies of water to reduce the risk of injury or drowning; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) and the Every Child a Swimmer (ECAS) program.

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 127

WHEREAS, Illinois' economy depends on a robust and efficient business climate; and

WHEREAS, State regulations may hinder the creation and growth of business economic opportunity; and

WHEREAS, Illinois government should assist economic growth whenever and however possible; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the elimination of all first-year business fees relating to any license or registration for any new business or person establishing a new business, including home-based businesses, whose principal place of business is in this State; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Senate President, the Speaker of the House, the Senate Minority Leader, the House Minority Leader, and the Governor.

Senator D. Turner offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 128

WHEREAS, The Lincoln Colored Home (LCH) of Springfield, the first Black orphanage in the State of Illinois and the second Black orphanage in the United States, was founded by former probation officer and community servant Eva Carroll Monroe in 1898; and

WHEREAS, The LCH, which operated until 1933, was originally established in response to racial discrimination towards Black children who were denied access to shelter and other resources by local orphanages, and as time passed, it extended its services to also providing shelter for widows; and

WHEREAS, Prior to opening the LCH, Eva Carroll Monroe worked tirelessly on behalf of orphaned Black children and made many sacrifices, including taking children into her own home and providing for them without the aid of government assistance, and as a Black woman, she continued to heroically protect and serve Black children during the harsh times of the Jim Crow era; and

WHEREAS, Eva Carroll Monroe was a dedicated child advocate and provider, a fearless protector, and a national trailblazer who selfishly dedicated her life to the protection, welfare, education, and service of Black children and her community, and her courageous efforts in Illinois were instrumental in raising standards of child welfare and protection nationwide; and

WHEREAS, The structure that once housed Eva Carroll Monroe's LCH, which was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1988 and recently purchased by Route History Museum, remains the only brick-and-mortar building of the first two Black orphanages to still exist in the United States today; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare August 4, 2025 and August 4, 2026 as Eva Carroll Monroe Day in the State of Illinois to celebrate and honor her achievements and legacy; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Dr. Gina Lathan, president of Route History Museum, as a symbol of our respect and esteem.

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 131

WHEREAS, Our nation's long-standing and ongoing audacious experiment in self-governance requires a populace with an understanding of the nation's laws and government, the skills for discussion and working together across difference, and a widespread commitment to the civic strength of our communities; and

WHEREAS, Civic education is vital to sustaining and strengthening constitutional democracy in the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, The practice of democracy must be taught and learned anew by each generation; and

WHEREAS, Schools play a central role in building the civic strength of our populace and nation; and

WHEREAS, Civic Learning Week seeks to unite our community and highlight the importance of civic knowledge, skills, and dispositions that provide the foundation for an informed and engaged populace; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois General Assembly has strengthened K-12 civic education in the State over the past decade by requiring civics courses in middle school and high school, and the Illinois Civic Mission Coalition has grown the Illinois Democracy Schools network to more than 90 high schools statewide, each of them deeply committed to students' civic development, and supports teachers, schools, and districts throughout the State with civics course and standards implementation; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare the week of March 9 through March 17, 2025 as Civic Learning Week in the State of Illinois.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 22

WHEREAS, The investments that the State of Illinois makes in communities through programs and services funded in the state budget are vitally important in helping ensure all Illinois families can thrive; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois' ability to fund programs and services is now under threat from the federal government as President Donald Trump and senior advisor Elon Musk are unlawfully moving to unilaterally stop federal funding and are pushing for deep budgetary cuts in order to slash taxes again for the richest Americans, including Elon Musk; and

WHEREAS, These federal changes will be devastating for millions of Illinoisans in a multitude of ways as they will mean deep cuts to the roughly \$34 billion Illinois receives annually from the federal government for a range of programs and services, such as health coverage for three million Illinoisans through Medicaid, food assistance programs for families, and services to support the State's public transit system; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly has the power to meaningfully protect Illinoisans from the Trump administration's plans to make deadly cuts to federal investments in the health and well-being of our communities and the planet; and

WHEREAS, Since the unsuccessful fair tax amendment in 2020, funding essential programs and services in the State budget has become increasingly difficult; Illinois has not had a major increase in state revenue since and continues to experience a significant revenue shortfall; and

WHEREAS, Illinois has the eighth most unequal state and local tax system in the nation and the most unequal of all states in the Midwest with the lowest-income 20% of households paying twice the portion of their incomes as compared with the top 1%; and

WHEREAS, Illinois' corporate income tax policies contain many loopholes that allow multinational corporations to avoid paying taxes by hiding their vast profits; and

WHEREAS, Income and wealth inequality in the United States have reached record levels with Illinois having the most severe income inequality of all states in the Midwest and with corporate profitability reaching an all-time high last year; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois plays an important role in ensuring racial, gender, and immigrant justice; and

WHEREAS, Illinois must work to ensure fairness and opportunity for all Illinoisans regardless of their race, gender, or where they come from; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that we urge the State of Illinois to make needed investments in Illinois communities by raising \$6 billion in new revenue from the ultra-wealthy and mega-corporations; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge revenue policies, such as raising the corporate income tax, closing corporate tax loopholes and taxing corporate offshore sheltered income, closing the carried interest loophole, and taxing data extraction by big tech corporations, should be used to fund priorities, such as strengthening public transit operations, supporting immigrant communities by fully funding immigrant services, protecting healthcare access for all, fully funding public schools in every community, supporting senior home care, and improving the child tax credit program, the direct cash assistance, re-entry employment programs, violence prevention programs, and affordable housing opportunities; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we affirm that, in addition to funding these critically-needed services, implementing these revenue policies will have the benefit of making our State's tax system less unfair to the lowest income Illinoisans; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to Governor JB Pritzker.
