**SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 172**

WHEREAS, Prescribed fire provides multiple ecological, economic, and cultural benefits to the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Prescribed fire has been practiced for thousands of years and was a primary tool used by Indigenous peoples to attract game, stimulate a rich ground layer of plants for harvesting, and keep woodlands and grasslands open and easy to traverse; and

WHEREAS, Prescribed fire is a traditional land management practice and public safety tool that helps prevent and lessen the severity of wildfires; and

WHEREAS, Prescribed fire is a valuable tool used by forest, prairie, and wetland landowners and managers in reducing hazardous fuels, reducing the risk of destructive wildfires, preparing sites for both natural and artificial forest regeneration, improving access to and the appearance of land, and controlling detrimental insects and forest diseases; and

WHEREAS, Prescribed fire is an effective natural tool for controlling invasive species; and

WHEREAS, Prescribed fire is one of the most important land management practices in maintaining and restoring healthy landscapes, but only approximately 6% of conservation lands in Illinois are currently being managed with prescribed fire; and

WHEREAS, Prescribed fire is used to restore and maintain fire-dependent ecosystems and to manage wildlife habitat for many species; it is a vital tool to maintain economic, biological, and aesthetic resources across Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Prescribed Fire Council is an organization of both public and private partners with a mission to promote the safe and continued use of prescribed fire on the Illinois landscape; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois General Assembly passed the Illinois Prescribed Burning Act in 2007 defining prescribed fire as "the planned application of fire to naturally occurring vegetative fuels under specified environmental conditions and following appropriate precautionary measures, which causes the fire to be confined to a predetermined area and accomplish the planned land management objectives."; and

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WHEREAS, Prescribed fire helps keep Illinois grasslands and forests healthy, which, in return, provides ecological services such as clean air and clean water and contributes to the quality of life of the State's citizens and to local economies; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare April 2025 as Prescribed Burning Awareness Month in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we support the appropriate and continued use of prescribed fire in Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Illinois Prescribed Fire Council as a symbol of our respect and esteem.

Senator Lightford offered the following Senate Joint Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

#### **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 25**

WHEREAS, Menopause and perimenopause impact every woman in Illinois who lives to reach midlife, affecting 51% of our State population; and

WHEREAS, Women can experience menopause and perimenopause symptoms, including brain fog, fatigue, insomnia, chills, hot flashes, sleep disturbance, depression, and anxiety, anywhere between two to ten years; and

WHEREAS, Ninety-four percent of women report being inadequately informed about menopause and other common female health issues; and

WHEREAS, Seventy percent of women who seek medical care for menopause symptoms do not receive the necessary treatment, and only 19% of women aged 40 to 60 receive a menopause diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, Seventy-three percent of women are not treating their menopause symptoms, leading to unnecessary health risks and economic burdens; and

WHEREAS, The long-term effects of untreated perimenopause and menopause symptoms can increase risks for cardiovascular disease, osteoporosis, Alzheimer's disease, and diabetes; and

WHEREAS, Training in the delivery of menopause care for medical students and physicians is severely lacking, and there are fewer than 100 physicians certified as menopause health professionals in Illinois; and

WHEREAS, It is estimated about \$150 billion is lost globally due to menopause symptoms affecting worker productivity; and

WHEREAS, Many critical questions about caring for women experiencing menopause remain unanswered due to a lack of research; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Governor Juliana Stratton and the Illinois Council of Women and Girls have made this topic a priority in their work and aim to lead the nation in advocating for perimenopause and menopause policies; and

WHEREAS, It is imperative to raise awareness about the expansive effects that menopause and perimenopause have on women's health and how women can advocate for themselves; therefore, be it
