WHEREAS, Service animals play a vital role in ensuring that individuals with disabilities and chronic health conditions can fully participate in everyday life and live with autonomy, dignity, and independence; and

WHEREAS, Service animals provide essential support to people with a wide range of disabilities and health conditions, including but not limited to mobility impairments, sensory disabilities, seizure disorders, diabetes, mental health conditions, and other chronic medical conditions; and

WHEREAS, Students with disabilities across the State of Illinois rely on service animals to safely and fully participate in educational activities, school programs, transportation, and extracurricular opportunities; and

WHEREAS, Service animals are individually trained to perform specific tasks that directly support a student's access to education, including alerting to medical conditions, guiding students with visual impairments, assisting with stability and mobility, interrupting or preventing harmful episodes, retrieving items, providing safety monitoring, and enabling greater independence; and

WHEREAS, The daily presence of service animals can significantly reduce barriers faced by students with disabilities, increase their comfort and confidence in school environments, promote academic engagement, and support social, emotional, and developmental well-being; and

WHEREAS, Federal and state disability rights laws, including the Americans with Disabilities Act, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, and the Illinois Human Rights Act, protect the rights of students who use service animals and require schools to ensure equal access to all programs and services; and

WHEREAS, Schools, including public, private, and charter educational institutions, have an obligation to provide equal access to students with disabilities who use service animals and to avoid discriminatory practices or barriers that impede educational participation; and

WHEREAS, Increased public awareness and consistent implementation of service-animal policies help create inclusive learning environments in which students with disabilities can thrive academically, socially, and emotionally; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize and affirm the profound importance of service animals in supporting the safety, health, independence, and academic success of students with disabilities across Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we encourage all Illinois school districts to continue fostering respect for individuals who use service animals and to promote awareness of the rights and responsibilities established under federal and state law; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge state agencies, including the Illinois State Board of Education, to review existing policies, administrative rules, oversight practices, and enforcement mechanisms to ensure that all

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Illinois schools fully comply with disability rights laws governing service-animal access, including appropriate staff training, consistent implementation, and timely resolution of barriers or complaints.

Senator Syverson offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 546

WHEREAS, The Affordable Care Act (ACA), enacted in 2010 and implemented in 2014, promised lower premiums by \$2,500 per family and the ability to keep one's doctor, promises that have not been realized, with premiums increasing by an average of 129% from 2014 to 2019; and

WHEREAS, Illinois fully embraced the ACA by passing legislation that eliminated all other health insurance options, banning temporary or short-term medical plans, and mandating broad coverages such as maternity, infertility, TMJ, broad mental health and substance abuse, and biomarker testing for all residents regardless of age or sex, effectively creating a one-size-fits-all plan that eliminated consumer choice for approximately 500,000 Illinoisans; and

WHEREAS, The elimination of the individual mandate led to healthy individuals dropping coverage while those with higher needs enrolled, exacerbating losses, and the lack of safeguards has resulted in rampant fraud estimated at more than \$25 billion annually, including instances where a single Social Security Number was used for over 125 policies in 2023, coverage for at least 7,000 deceased individuals, and \$94 million in subsidies for fictitious applicants in 2015; and

WHEREAS, During the COVID-19 pandemic, federal subsidies masked the true skyrocketing costs of ACA plans, with subsidies increasing from \$92 billion in 2023 to \$138 billion in 2025, but even with continued subsidies, rates were projected to rise 26% in the current year; and

WHEREAS, With the expiration of COVID-era subsidies on December 31, 2025, approximately 250,000 of the 500,000 Illinoisans on ACA plans face rate increases exceeding 100%, revealing the unmasked costs and financially devastating families, while politicians and bureaucrats remain insulated from these impacts; and

WHEREAS, When government experiments with health care, it is not the politicians and bureaucrats who suffer, but the citizens forced onto these plans; and

WHEREAS, Partisan divides persist, with Democrats seeking a three-year extension of subsidies at a cost exceeding \$100 billion without funding mechanisms or reforms, and Republicans advocating for consumer vouchers and greater choice, though such changes cannot be implemented immediately; and

WHEREAS, To provide immediate relief, Illinois Senate Bill 2763 has been introduced to allow full deductions of premiums and out-of-pocket expenses for individuals on ACA plans starting January 1, 2026, aligning treatment with those on employer-based plans; and

WHEREAS, A one-year extension of subsidies is necessary to prevent immediate financial devastation, coupled with stricter oversight to address fraud, but Congress must be compelled to resolve the ACA's underlying issues within that timeframe rather than perpetuating extensions; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the United States Congress to enact a one-year extension of ACA subsidies through December 31, 2026, with enhanced oversight mechanisms to combat the estimated \$25 billion in annual fraud, including stricter verification processes for enrollments and penalties for fraudulent activities; and be it further

RESOLVED, That to ensure timely resolution, Congress is urged to include a clause in the extension legislation stipulating that, if comprehensive ACA reforms are not enacted by December 31, 2026, all

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members of Congress and the United States Senate shall forfeit their government health plan subsidies effective January 1, 2027, thereby aligning their incentives with those of the taxpayers who fund over 75% of their premiums.

WHEREAS, Sgt. Bolinski was a loving wife and mother and enjoyed crocheting, being outdoors, cutting the grass, cleaning her cars, and gardening; and

WHEREAS, Sgt. Bolinski passed away on March 5, 2019 while serving her country in Kuwait; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that we designate Illinois Route 13 from the eastern limits of the Village of Coulterville to the western limits of the Village of Pinckneyville as the "Sgt. Holli R. Bolinski Memorial Road"; and be it further

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 8**

SC0008

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to amend Section 3 of Article IV and add Section 3.5 to Article IV of the Illinois Constitution as follows:

**ARTICLE IV
THE LEGISLATURE**

(ILCON Art. IV, Sec. 3)

SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE REDISTRICTING

(a) Legislative Districts shall be compact, contiguous and substantially equal in population. Representative Districts shall be compact, contiguous, and substantially equal in population.

(b) In the year following each Federal decennial census year, the General Assembly by law shall redistrict the Legislative Districts and the Representative Districts.

If no redistricting plan becomes effective by June 30 of that year, a Legislative Redistricting Commission shall be constituted not later than July 10. The Commission shall consist of eight members, no more than four of whom shall be members of the same political party.

The Speaker and Minority Leader of the House of Representatives shall each appoint to the Commission one Representative and one person who is not a member of the General Assembly. The President and Minority Leader of the Senate shall each appoint to the Commission one Senator and one person who is not a member of the General Assembly.

The members shall be certified to the Secretary of State by the appointing authorities. A vacancy on the Commission shall be filled within five days by the authority that made the original appointment. A Chairman and Vice Chairman shall be chosen by a majority of all members of the Commission.

Not later than August 10, the Commission shall file with the Secretary of State a redistricting plan approved by at least five members.

If the Commission fails to file an approved redistricting plan, the Supreme Court shall submit the names of two persons, not of the same political party, to the Secretary of State not later than September 1.

Not later than September 5, the Secretary of State publicly shall draw by random selection the name of one of the two persons to serve as the ninth member of the Commission.

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Not later than October 5, the Commission shall file with the Secretary of State a redistricting plan approved by at least five members.

An approved redistricting plan filed with the Secretary of State shall be presumed valid, shall have the force and effect of law and shall be published promptly by the Secretary of State.

The Supreme Court shall have original and exclusive jurisdiction over actions concerning redistricting the House and Senate, which shall be initiated in the name of the People of the State by the Attorney General.

(c) To the extent that any provision of this Section conflicts with any provision of Section 3.5 of this Article, Section 3.5 shall control.

SECTION 3.5. PEOPLE'S INDEPENDENT MAPS

(a) No later than March 1 of the year that follows a federal decennial census, the Chief Justice and the most senior Supreme Court Justice who is not elected from the same political party as the Chief Justice shall select 16 commissioners to form the Independent Redistricting Commission. The commissioners shall reflect the ethnic, gender, and racial demographics of Illinois. Fourteen of the commissioners shall represent, in equal number, the 2 political parties whose gubernatorial candidates received the greatest number of votes in the last gubernatorial election and 2 of the commissioners shall represent neither of those parties. The 2 Supreme Court Justices responsible for selecting the 16 commissioners shall consider party identification and all campaign contributions in determining a potential commissioner's eligibility. There shall be at least 2 commissioners from each Judicial District.

(b) A person is ineligible to serve on the Independent Redistricting Commission if within the previous 4 calendar years the person or his or her spouse or immediate family member was appointed or elected to a position with the State, federal, or local government; is a State employee; is a lobbyist as defined by law; has an ownership interest in an entity with a State or federal contract; or is appointed or elected to serve a political party. A commissioner is ineligible for a period of 10 years after serving on the Independent Redistricting Commission to be appointed to a position subject to Senate confirmation. Commissioners must file financial disclosure statements and abide by any ethics requirements established by law.

(c) The Independent Redistricting Commission shall act in public meetings by the affirmative votes of 10 commissioners. The Independent Redistricting Commission shall elect its chairperson and vice chairperson, who shall not be affiliated with the same political party. Each meeting of the Independent Redistricting Commission shall be open to the public, and there must be public notice at least 7 days before a meeting. All records of the Independent Redistricting Commission, including all communications to or from the Independent Redistricting Commission regarding the work of the Independent Redistricting Commission, shall be available for public inspection. The Independent Redistricting Commission shall adopt rules governing its procedures. The Independent Redistricting Commission shall be considered a public body subject to the Freedom of Information Act or a successor Act and the Open Meetings Act or a successor Act. Commissioners and staff may not communicate with or receive communications about redistricting matters from anyone outside of a public hearing.

(d) The Independent Redistricting Commission shall hold at least 10 public hearings throughout the State before adopting a redistricting plan, with a majority occurring before the Independent Redistricting Commission releases any proposed redistricting plan and at least 4 public hearings must occur throughout the State after the release of any proposed redistricting plan.

The Independent Redistricting Commission must provide a meaningful opportunity for racial minorities and language minorities to participate in the public hearings, including, but not limited to, issuing notices in multiple languages and ensuring that translation services are available at all hearings at the Independent Redistricting Commission's expense or through partnership with outside organizations. These public hearings must be open to all members of the public and must be planned to encourage attendance and participation across the State, including the use of technology that allows for real-time, virtual participation and feedback during the hearings. When releasing a proposed redistricting plan, the Independent Redistricting Commission must also release population data, geographic data, election data, and any other data used to create the plan, when the Independent Redistricting Commission receives this information. The Independent Redistricting Commission must also provide terminals for members of the public to access the data and associated software. During the map drawing process, any member of the public may submit maps

for consideration to the Independent Redistricting Commission. Those submissions are public records that are open to comment.

The Independent Redistricting Commission may not adopt a redistricting plan until the Independent Redistricting Commission adopts and publishes a report explaining the plan's compliance with the United States Constitution and Illinois Constitution. Before the adoption of a redistricting plan, the Independent Redistricting Commission shall release to the public the final plan and its associated compliance report. The meeting to vote on adoption of a redistricting plan shall occur no sooner than six days after the release of the final plan and its associated compliance report. All proposed and adopted maps and any data used to develop these maps are public records. The Independent Redistricting Commission shall maintain a website or other similar electronic platform to disseminate information about the Independent Redistricting Commission, including records of its meetings and hearings, proposed redistricting plans, assessments and reports on plans, and to allow the public to view its meetings and hearings in both live and archived form. The website or electronic platform must allow the public to submit redistricting plans and comments on redistricting plans to the Independent Redistricting Commission for its consideration.

(e) Each Legislative District, Representative District, and Congressional District shall, in the following order of priority:

(1) fully comply with the United States Constitution and federal law, such as the federal Voting Rights Act;

(2) be substantially equal in population;

(3) provide racial minorities and language minorities with the equal opportunity to participate in the political process and elect candidates of their choice;

(4) provide racial minorities and language minorities who constitute less than a voting-age majority of a Legislative District, Representative District, or Congressional District with an opportunity to substantially influence the outcome of an election;

(5) be contiguous;

(6) be compact;

(7) respect, to the extent practical, geographic integrity of units of local government;

(8) respect, to the extent practical, communities sharing common social or economic interests;

and

(9) not discriminate against or in favor of any political party or individual.

(f) The Independent Redistricting Commission shall adopt and submit to the Legislative Redistricting Commission, established by Section 3 of Article IV, a redistricting plan for the Legislative Districts and Representative Districts within 30 days after the Census Bureau's release of the Legacy Format Summary Redistricting Data File for the State of Illinois. The Independent Redistricting Commission shall adopt and submit to the General Assembly a redistricting plan for the Congressional Districts within 30 days after the Census Bureau's release of the Legacy Format Summary Redistricting Data File for the State of Illinois. The Independent Redistricting Commission may adopt and submit separate redistricting plans for the Legislative Districts and Representative Districts, and a separate plan for the Congressional Districts.

(g) If the Independent Redistricting Commission fails to adopt and submit to the Legislative Redistricting Commission a redistricting plan for the Legislative and Representative Districts within 30 days from the Census Bureau's release of the Legacy Format Summary Redistricting Data File, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court and the most senior Supreme Court Justice who is not elected from the same political party as the Chief Justice shall appoint within 3 days a seventeenth member to the Independent Redistricting Commission. The seventeenth member of the Independent Redistricting Commission must not be affiliated with either major political party. The seventeen-member Independent Redistricting Commission shall adopt and submit to the Legislative Redistricting Commission a redistricting plan for the Legislative Districts and Representative Districts within 10 days after the appointment of the seventeenth member of the Independent Redistricting Commission.

(h) Members of the Independent Redistricting Commission shall be compensated at the rate of \$37.50 for each hour the member is engaged in Independent Redistricting Commission business. Members of the Independent Redistricting Commission are eligible for reimbursement of personal expenses incurred in connection with the duties performed pursuant to this Section. A member's residence is deemed to be the member's post of duty for purposes of reimbursement of expenses.

(i) Within the first 30 days after the selection of the Independent Redistricting Commission, the Governor shall include in the budget sufficient funding for the Independent Redistricting Commission, the Legislative Redistricting Commission and the Secretary of State to meet the estimated expenses of each of

those officers or entities in implementing the redistricting process required by this Section, including, but not limited to, adequate funding for a statewide outreach program to solicit broad public participation in the redistricting process. The Governor shall also make adequate office space available for the operation of the Commission. The Legislature shall make the necessary appropriation. The Legislature may make additional appropriations in any year that it determines that the Commission requires additional funding in order to fulfill its duties. The Independent Redistricting Commission and Legislative Redistricting Commission, with fiscal oversight from the Comptroller or its successor, shall be exempt from the Illinois Procurement Code but will have procurement and contracting authority and may hire staff and consultants, for the purposes of this Section.

(j) Any redistricting plan enacted by the Legislative Redistricting Commission shall immediately be filed with the Secretary of State. A redistricting plan filed with the Secretary of State shall be presumed valid and shall be published promptly by the Secretary of State.

(k) Each Independent Redistricting Commission shall be dissolved on the first day of the sixth month to occur after the final redistricting plan is filed with the Secretary of State as provided in subsection (j) of this Section.
