**PRESENTATION OF RESOLUTIONS**

Senator Guzmán offered the following Senate Joint Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

**SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 50**

WHEREAS, In 2006, the federal Secretaries of State, Education, and Defense, and the Director of National Intelligence launched the National Security Language Initiative to increase the number of Americans learning and teaching foreign languages of critical importance to national security and global competitiveness; and

WHEREAS, The National Security Language Initiative was founded on the recognition that speaking another's language promotes understanding and conveys respect for other countries and cultures, strengthens the ability of the United States to engage foreign peoples and governments, and provides others with an opportunity to learn more about America and its people; and

WHEREAS, In 2008, the federal government designated Arabic as a "Critical Need Language"; and

WHEREAS, Arabic is a global language spoken by hundreds of millions of people and is one of the six official languages of the United Nations; and

WHEREAS, Arabic is central to cultural, economic, and diplomatic engagement worldwide, yet remains far less available than other world languages in U.S. K-12 education; and

WHEREAS, Expanding Arabic instruction helps build both linguistic and intercultural competence, preparing students to be more informed, productive, and compassionate global citizens in a world where understanding and connection across cultures is essential; and

WHEREAS, Over the past 15 years, global events, including sustained U.S. diplomatic, economic, and security engagement in the Middle East and North Africa, have only heightened the strategic value of Arabic proficiency; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. federal government continues to reaffirm Arabic as a critical language through programs such as the National Security Language Initiative for Youth (NSLI-Y), the Critical Language

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Scholarship (CLS) Program, and other National Security Education Program grants, which provide immersive and virtual opportunities for Arabic study; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Defense, through the Defense Language and National Security Education Office (DLNSEO) and the Language Flagship, continues to support pathways to professional-level proficiency in Arabic and other critical languages, reflecting awareness of enduring national security and diplomatic needs; and

WHEREAS, The 2017 National Security Strategy emphasized the importance of cultural, religious, and language understanding as vital tools for American statecraft, underscoring the role of foreign languages in advancing U.S. interests abroad; and

WHEREAS, Illinois was among the first states in the nation to establish a State Seal of Bilingualism that included the Arabic language, enacted by Public Act 98-0560 and codified in Section 2-3.157 of the School Code, to recognize high school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in English and one or more additional languages, thereby encouraging language study and honoring multilingual achievement; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois State Board of Education supports world language instruction through its Arts and Foreign Language Education Grant Program, and Illinois has enacted a two-year world language high school graduation requirement beginning with students who enter ninth grade in the 2028-2029 school year, thereby strengthening multilingual education opportunities for Illinois students; and

WHEREAS, The Chicago Arabic Teachers Council, established more than a decade ago as a collaborative initiative among educators, universities, and cultural institutions, has served as a leading professional network and community of practice for Arabic language teachers across Illinois and beyond, promoting excellence in instruction, curriculum development, and intercultural understanding in K-12 education; and

WHEREAS, The Chicago Arabic Teachers Council's collaborations have historically included partnerships with the University of Chicago, Northwestern University, and DePaul University, demonstrating broad support from higher education leaders across the State for advancing Arabic language education and teacher professional development; and

WHEREAS, Arabic is one of the world languages offered within the International Baccalaureate (IB) framework, and the inclusion of Arabic language instruction in IB programs within Illinois public and private schools enhances students' access to globally recognized credentials, strengthens college and career readiness, and reflects the State's commitment to preparing globally competent graduates; and

WHEREAS, Supporting the expansion of Arabic language programs within the IB continuum, including the Primary Years, Middle Years, and Diploma Programs, aligns with Illinois' educational goals of multilingualism, international-mindedness, and academic excellence; and

WHEREAS, The 96th General Assembly unanimously adopted Senate Joint Resolution 68 during the 2009-2010 legislative session, encouraging school districts in Illinois to explore the introduction of Arabic as a foreign language option in their curriculum, making many of the same points that remain true today, 15 years later; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that we encourage school districts in the State of Illinois to explore the introduction of Arabic as a foreign language option in their curriculum, particularly through transparent and collaborative processes that make full use of available state and federal resources; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the school districts of the State of Illinois.

**SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION  
CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 9**

SC0009

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to amend Article XIII of the Illinois Constitution by adding Section 9 as follows:

ARTICLE XIII  
GENERAL PROVISIONS

(ILCON Art. XIII, Sec. 9 new)

SECTION 9. ARTIFICIAL PERSONS

(a) As used in this Section:

"Artificial person" means every entity whose existence or limited liability shield is conferred by the laws of this State, including, without limitation:

(1) business corporations;

(2) not-for-profit corporations;

(3) limited liability companies;

(4) unincorporated associations, limited liability partnerships, statutory trusts, professional corporations, cooperatives, and any successor form; and

(5) foreign entities that are authorized to transact business, are otherwise transacting business, or hold property in this State.

For the purpose of paragraph (5), any foreign entity that directly or indirectly undertakes, finances, or directs election activity or ballot-issue activity in this State is conclusively deemed to be transacting business in this State.

"Ballot-issue activity" means paying, contributing, or expending money or anything of value to support or oppose a ballot question or initiative. "Ballot-issue activity" does not include any bona fide news story, commentary, or editorial distributed through the facilities of any broadcasting station, or of any print, online, or digital newspaper, magazine, blog, or other periodical publication, unless the broadcasting, print, online, or digital facilities are owned or controlled by a political party, political committee, or candidate.

"Charter privilege" means any benefit to artificial persons that exists only because this State confers it, such as limited liability, perpetual duration, succession in its corporate name, and tax credits and abatements. "Charter privilege" does not include the privilege to conduct election activity or ballot-issue activity.

"Election activity" means paying, contributing, or expending money or anything of value to support or oppose a candidate, political party, or political committee. "Election activity" does not include any bona fide news story, commentary, or editorial distributed through the facilities of any broadcasting station, or of any print, online, or digital newspaper, magazine, blog, or other periodical publication, unless the broadcasting, print, online, or digital facilities are owned or controlled by a political party, political committee, or candidate.

"Foreign entity" means an artificial person organized or existing under the laws of any jurisdiction other than this State.

"Powers of artificial persons" means powers necessary or convenient to carry out lawful business or charitable purposes, excluding any power to directly or indirectly engage in election activity or ballot-issue activity.

(b) Artificial persons exist only by grant of the State and shall have no powers or privileges except those expressly provided by this Constitution or the laws of this State.

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(c) The General Assembly may only create artificial persons in a manner consistent with subsection (b).

It is not the intent of this State that artificial persons have the power to conduct any election activity or ballot-issue activity. This subsection retracts all powers of artificial persons and re-grants only those powers deemed necessary or convenient to carry out an artificial person's lawful business or charitable purposes.

Any powers related to election activity or ballot-issue activity are not deemed necessary or convenient to those purposes.

(d) The creation and continued existence of an artificial person are not rights but conditional grants of legal status by this State and remain subject to complete withdrawal at any time. All powers previously granted to any artificial person under the laws of this State are revoked in their entirety. No artificial person operating under the jurisdiction of this State shall possess any power unless specifically granted by this Constitution. No provision of this Constitution grants or recognizes any power of an artificial person to engage in election activity or ballot-issue activity, except as provided in subsection (f).

Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to invalidate, impair, or modify any existing contract, debt instrument, security, or other legal obligation validly entered into before the effective date of this Article. The provisions of this subsection do not authorize an artificial person to conduct any election activity or ballot-issue activity after the effective date of this Article.

(e) Each artificial person possesses the power to exercise charter privileges, unless its organizational documents limit the exercise of the powers, and no powers beyond those expressly granted. No provision of this Article grants or recognizes any power of an artificial person to engage in election activity or ballot-issue activity, except as provided in subsection (f).

Any language in articles of incorporation, organization, association, or other organizational documents purporting to directly or indirectly confer election-activity authority or ballot-issue-activity authority to artificial persons is void.

(f) Political committees registered under the laws of this State or federal law are entities created for the purpose of engaging in election activity and ballot-issue activity. Political committees may be granted the power to engage in those activities provided that they exist solely for that purpose and claim no charter privilege other than limited liability. This Constitution does not grant any other artificial person the power to engage in election activity or ballot-issue activity.

(g) No charter privilege shall be construed to authorize election activity or ballot-issue activity. An artificial person that exercises an authority to conduct election activity or ballot-issue activity, unless expressly permitted to do so under subsection (f), shall forfeit all charter privileges.

(h) Any election activity or ballot-issue activity conducted by an artificial person is ultra vires and void. Any such conduct results in the forfeiture of charter privileges as provided in subsection (g) and shall also be subject to civil action by a member, shareholder, or the Attorney General for injunctive relief, disgorgement, and confirmation or enforcement of the forfeiture.

This Constitutional Amendment takes effect upon being declared adopted in accordance with Section 7 of the Illinois Constitutional Amendment Act.
