PRESENTATION OF CELEBRATION OF LIFE RESOLUTION

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 608

Offered by Senator Rose and all Senators:
Mourns the passing of James Dean "Jim" Bolin of Casey.

PRESENTATION OF RESOLUTIONS

Senator Joyce offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 609

WHEREAS, Home fires are the biggest element of the U.S. fire problem for civilians and responders; and

WHEREAS, According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), 86% of all civilian structure fire deaths are in homes, and home fires cause \$9.4 billion in direct property damage each year; and

WHEREAS, Residential structure fires account for 66% of firefighter injuries, with over three times as many firefighter injuries occurring in residential rather than nonresidential structures, per the U.S. Fire Administration (USFA); and

WHEREAS, According to Underwriters Laboratories and the National Institute of Standards and Technology, home fires are deadlier today due to unprotected, lightweight construction material, open floor plans, abundant synthetic furnishings, and emerging technology such as lithium-ion batteries, which make homes burn faster, becoming deadly in two minutes or less; and

WHEREAS, The USFA estimates that home fire sprinklers could save thousands of lives each year if more were installed in homes; and

WHEREAS, Fire sprinklers are a proven and cost-effective means of protecting lives and property from the threat of fire; and

WHEREAS, Fire sprinklers offer the highest degree of fire protection and are critical in saving lives and property; and

WHEREAS, Fire sprinklers can control a fire, and thereby the smoke, while it is still small and prevent a room from being engulfed in flames, which can happen in under two minutes, thereby saving the lives of occupants and first responders; and

WHEREAS, The National Fire Sprinkler Association (NFSA) reported that in the 18 years between January 1, 2007 and December 31, 2024, Illinois has seen 1,131 fatalities and 4,171 injuries as a result of fires in one- and two-family homes without fire sprinkler systems; and

WHEREAS, During that same 18-year period, there were zero fatalities and only seven injuries in one- and two-family Illinois homes with fire sprinkler systems; and

WHEREAS, Including fire sprinklers in local building codes and community risk reduction supports fire service resources, staffing, and budgets due to the increased safety of homes with fire sprinklers, which improves communities and allows fire service resources to be directed to those at highest risk; and

WHEREAS, Stronger state and federal support of home fire sprinkler education will help address confusion and anti-code negativity while encouraging fire service advocacy for the installation of home fire sprinklers; and

WHEREAS, Increased installation of fire sprinklers in new homes will directly and indefinitely protect and improve communities of every size; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare May 10 through May 16, 2026 as Home Fire Sprinkler Week in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to Alan Jacobs, chair of the Illinois Chapter of the National Fire Sprinkler Association, and Janean Dyson, Illinois member and chapter relations coordinator of the National Fire Sprinkler Association.

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 610

WHEREAS, Illinois ASCD/PD365 has long been committed to supporting high-quality teaching and learning, with a focus on developing critical thinkers prepared for success in an evolving digital society; and

WHEREAS, The rapid emergence of artificial intelligence (AI) presents both significant opportunities and substantial challenges for Illinois educators, students, and families; and

WHEREAS, AI technologies offer adaptive learning experiences, predictive analytics, and real-time feedback that can support differentiated instruction, identify learning gaps, and free educators to focus on higher-order instructional design; and

WHEREAS, Without intentional, educator-guided implementation, AI tools may lead to passive learning, algorithmic bias, overreliance on automated systems, and the erosion of student agency, equity, and intellectual independence; and

WHEREAS, Illinois ASCD/PD365 affirms that AI should serve as a thinking partner that enhances student inquiry, supports hypothesis testing, and deepens reflection, rather than simply providing answers or replacing teacher-designed learning experiences; and

WHEREAS, Ethical AI integration must prioritize student privacy, data protection, transparency, equity of access, and the development of critical digital and AI literacy among all Illinois students; and

WHEREAS, Disparities in technology access across Illinois communities risk widening existing achievement gaps, making equitable infrastructure and access essential to responsible AI adoption; and

WHEREAS, Illinois ASCD/PD365 emphasizes the importance of family engagement, collaboration with higher education and community partners, and a commitment to supporting the whole child in all AI-related educational initiatives; and

WHEREAS, Educators must receive professional development that equips them to understand AI systems, recognize potential algorithmic bias, evaluate ethical implications, and use AI tools to deepen inquiry-based, reflective, and critical thinking practices; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we support the principles put forth by Illinois ASCD/PD365 regarding the ethical and effective use of artificial intelligence in K-12 classrooms; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE), in collaboration with school districts, educators, technology experts, and stakeholder organizations, to develop statewide guidelines for the ethical and responsible use of artificial intelligence in education, including protections for student data, expectations for algorithmic transparency, monitoring for bias, and the incorporation of digital and AI

literacy into Illinois curricula to ensure students can thoughtfully and ethically engage with emerging technologies; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we encourage investment in educator professional development and equitable access to technology, including broadband infrastructure, one-to-one devices, and AI-enabled tools to ensure that all Illinois educators and students are prepared to use artificial intelligence responsibly, effectively, and fairly across all schools; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Illinois State Board of Education, the Governor of the State of Illinois, and the leadership of Illinois ASCD/PD365 as an expression of our commitment to fostering ethical, equitable, and student-centered use of AI in Illinois classrooms.

WHEREAS, Each student in Illinois deserves to learn about and practice a healthy lifestyle; and

WHEREAS, Each student in Illinois deserves to be actively engaged in learning and connected to the school and broader community; and

WHEREAS, The consequences of not ensuring that our young people are challenged, supported, healthy, safe, and engaged are clear; and

WHEREAS, The current high school graduation rate is 87%; and

WHEREAS, We have an opportunity to improve SAT math scores for 11th graders; and

WHEREAS, We have an opportunity to improve SAT English/Language Arts scores for 11th graders; and

WHEREAS, We have an opportunity to increase proficiency in science in all grades to advance to exemplary levels; and

WHEREAS, Only 64% of high school seniors enroll in a college program within 12 months of graduation; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare March 2026 as Illinois Whole Child Month to recognize the value of assuring that each student is challenged, supported, healthy, safe, and engaged; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge parents, educators, and community members to support a whole child approach to education for each student; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge every school in Illinois to celebrate Whole Child Month by adopting at least one of the whole child tenets to promote and encourage throughout the month; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Illinois Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development as a symbol of our respect and esteem.

WHEREAS, Menopause and perimenopause impact every woman in Illinois who lives to reach midlife, affecting 51% of our State population; and

WHEREAS, Women can experience menopause and perimenopause symptoms, including brain fog, fatigue, insomnia, chills, hot flashes, sleep disturbance, depression, and anxiety, anywhere between two to ten years; and

WHEREAS, Ninety-four percent of women report being inadequately informed about menopause and other common female health issues; and

WHEREAS, Seventy percent of women who seek medical care for menopause symptoms do not receive the necessary treatment, and only 19% of women aged 40 to 60 receive a menopause diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, Seventy-three percent of women are not treating their menopause symptoms, leading to unnecessary health risks and economic burdens; and

WHEREAS, The long-term effects of untreated perimenopause and menopause symptoms can increase risks for cardiovascular disease, osteoporosis, Alzheimer's disease, and diabetes; and

WHEREAS, Training in the delivery of menopause care for medical students and physicians is severely lacking, and there are fewer than 100 physicians certified as menopause health professionals in Illinois; and

WHEREAS, It is estimated about \$150 billion is lost globally due to menopause symptoms affecting worker productivity; and

WHEREAS, Many critical questions about caring for women experiencing menopause remain unanswered due to a lack of research; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Governor Juliana Stratton and the Illinois Council of Women and Girls have made this topic a priority in their work and aim to lead the nation in advocating for perimenopause and menopause policies; and

WHEREAS, It is imperative to raise awareness about the expansive effects that menopause and perimenopause have on women's health and how women can advocate for themselves; therefore, be it
