PRESENTATION OF RESOLUTIONS

Senator Loughran Cappel offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 614

WHEREAS; Autism Spectrum Disorder is a neurodevelopmental condition characterized by challenges with social communication, restricted interests, and repetitive behaviors; and

WHEREAS, Symptoms of autism appear in early childhood and vary widely in severity, ranging from needing substantial support to living independently; and

WHEREAS, Autism affects millions of Americans, with one in 36 children having been diagnosed with autism; and

WHEREAS, Significant progress towards equality for people with autism has been made over the years, driven in large part by advocates who have worked tirelessly to bring the lived experiences of individuals with autism to the forefront; and

WHEREAS, Despite this progress, people with autism continue to routinely face unnecessary obstacles, including in regards to securing employment and health care, and children with autism still face bullying and barriers to education; and

WHEREAS, Autism Awareness Day provides an opportunity to increase the understanding and acceptance of people with autism; and

WHEREAS, The United Nations began recognizing April 2nd as World Autism Day in 2007; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare April 2, 2026 as Autism Awareness Day in the State of Illinois.

Senator Anderson offered the following Senate Joint Resolution, which was ordered printed and referred to the Committee on Assignments:

**SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION
CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 11**

SC0011

[February 10, 2026]

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to add Section 2.5 to Article IV and amend Section 2 of Article V of the Illinois Constitution as follows:

ARTICLE IV
THE LEGISLATURE

(ILCON Art. IV, Sec. 2.5 new)

SECTION 2.5. TERM LIMITS.

A person may not be elected to the office of State Senator for more than three terms or the office of State Representative for more than five terms. Service before the second Wednesday in January of 2027 shall not be considered in the calculation of a person's service.

ARTICLE V
THE EXECUTIVE

(ILCON Art. V, Sec. 2)

SECTION 2. TERMS

These elected officers of the Executive Branch shall hold office for four years beginning on the second Monday of January after their election and, except in the case of the Lieutenant Governor, until their successors are qualified. They shall be elected at the general election in 1978 and every four years thereafter. A person may not be elected to any Executive Branch office, or any combination of Executive Branch offices, for more than two terms. Service before the second Monday in January of 2027 shall not be considered in the calculation of a person's service for purposes of this Section.
